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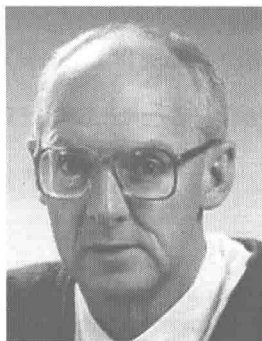

He is currently Constitutional Advisor to Niue, and Legal Advisor to the Government of Tokelau. Additionally, he was a member of the working party that established the Law School at the University of the South Pacific, and was for a number of years Visiting

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Professor Angelo teaches the Conflict of Laws at Victoria University and is a regular commentator on current developments in private international law in New Zealand.

Seminal contributions to legal literature have appeared in a number of periodicals particularly in relation to the legal systems of Tokelau and Mauritius.

Professor Angelo is an Académicien Associé of the International Academy of Comparative Law and President of the New Zealand Association for Comparative Law.

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
