Global Financial Crisis—Opportunity

Wang Xuan (Outstanding Winner University of International Business and Economics)

Good aftanoon, Ladies and gentlemen. It was the best of times, it was the worst of times; it was the season of light, it was the season of darkness; we had everything before us, we had nothing before us. Such was the year 1775 depicted by Charles Dickens in A TALE OF TWO CITIES. Surprisingly our time is no different from 1775. We're in time of the worst crisis but it is also the best of times fraught with opportunities.

Now this is wrong. You might say. Last year a financial tsunami swept our world upside down, leaving our ears baffled by the on-going media reports, heart saddened by the blight of job market, and mind confused by the uncertainty of the road ahead. This is simply apocalyptic. Opportunity, to most people, is merely nothing but comfort acting like painkillers whose soothing effect disappears shortly afterwards. But ladies and gentlemen, before you jump into that conclusion, let me tell you a story.

Once upon a time a donkey fell into a pit and couldn't climb out. His master, the donkey driver was too sad to see the donkey struggling in the pit, so he decided to bury him. Every time the driver shoveled the dirt into the pit, the donkey dusted off the dirt and stepped onto it and eventually the dirt accumulated to the level of the ground and the donkey was saved. We're the donkey. The crisis is the dirt which seems to make matters worse, but if taken advantage of, can give us hope, salvation and opportunities.

Throughout history crisis has always been the cradle for breeding legends. In time of crisis, we have Bill Gates, Walt Disney, Robert Wood, Steve Jobs...The reason is when crisis is attacking our home, usually opportunity is already knocking on our door.

Then where is the opportunity of our current financial crisis?

First and foremost, the crisis has been a wakeup call to restructure our financial system and to reevaluate the trade-off between government intervention and free market mechanism. According to the essay "Finance is Not Virtual Economy" by the economist Yi Gang, the road to finding the truth is sure to encounter the obstacles, but that doesn't mean we should give up. What the crisis brings to us is not dismay in finance, but the motivation to refine the system so as to effectively serve its role in allocating resources, distributing risks, and saving costs in information search.

Second, the crisis strengthens global cooperation. September 25th saw the closing ceremony of the G20 summit in Pittsburg and the messages it presents to the world are worth contemplation. One of them is to hear the voices of the undeveloped and the developing countries that are often ostracized on the global stage, thus promoting the idea of multilateralism and creating a positive global environment.

Then, the crisis shifts our eyes from the past to the future, from underlying problems to possible solutions. Policymakers are beginning to turn their minds to the potentially more rewarding question of creating tomorrow's jobs, rather than trying to save yesterday's. The buzzwords in government circles are entrepreneurship, innovation and venture capital. On October 30th, China's first Growth Enterprise Market was initiated in Shenzhen, who knows how many "Microsoft" will pop out. Ironically, the crisis ignites entrepreneurship, who can say there is no opportunity?

Ladies and gentlemen, crisis may bankrupt us, may impoverish

us, may devastate us, but as long as we learn to be the donkey taking advantage of the crisis, it can never stop us from rising to our feet once again.

In time of crisis, no panic, no ignorance. We march towards the future, head on!
