PREFACE

This Third Edition of Washington Trial Practice is designed to give the busy practitioner quick access to the burgeoning body of procedural law, and to take into account the many changes that have occurred since the Second Edition was published. Important developments in RES JUDICATA, and the right to JURY TRIAL have taken place. The GARNISHMENT statutes have been substantially rewritten. STATE AND MUNICIPAL liability have been expanded. Less extensive, but nevertheless important, changes have been made in the NONRESIDENT MOTORIST statute, in the commencement of actions for the purpose of the STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS, and in the EMINENT DOMAIN statutes.

The author has profited immeasurably from the thoughtful discussions of his colleagues during deliberations of the Washington Judicial Council and the working sessions of the Washington Pattern Jury Instructions Committee, and expresses his appreciation of the work of these groups of lawyers and jurists dedicated to progress in the law. Appreciation should also be expressed for the many inquiries from members of the profession, often concerning obscure or emerging areas of the law. Such inquiries frequently lend direction to further research.

As in the case of previous publications, the author's wife has been his loyal mainstay.
