PREFACE

This work has its basis in the Second Edition of Jackson's Immigration Law and Practice, published in November 1999. That edition was written as the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 was going through Parliament, and it was envisaged that it would have to be considerably revised upon the implementation of the legislation.

The need for that revision provides the opportunity for the change to a looseleaf format which had been under consideration since the first edition. This work is the result, and it is intended that there will be 2 releases annually. The format not only allows for regular updating in a continually changing field, but for easy incorporation of specialist contributions.

The two general editors now have joint responsibility for the work as a whole and for about two thirds of the content. The seven contributors listed on the title page provide the other chapters.

The framework for this initial issue is largely that of the 2nd edition on which it is based, but the looseleaf format makes it easier to adapt this to changes and the approach of individual contributors. There are presently, as there was formerly, five parts, but consideration of leave to enter and remain has been joined together (in effect following the pattern of the immigration rules). As before Parts I-IV are made up of consideration of substantive law and policies with Part V a discussion of the review processes in the courts and statutory appellate bodies.

The editors are grateful to the contributors for their participation and appreciate the expertise each brings. We are all grateful to the publishers for their encouraging support. Each of us in turn owes a debt to those who have assisted in the gathering and presentation of content.

Unless expressly stated as later the law is as on the 1st of the month preceding the release date contained on the relevant page. The Nationality, Asylum and Immigration Bill was in the process of enactment while the material for Release 2 was in preparation. Enactment is expected in mid November and so the Act will be the subject of a Bulletin to be published in January/February 2003. Consideration of the provisions will later be incorporated into Release 3.
