

FOREWORD

The major topics covered in Volume 16, originally published in 1964, have always been active areas of the law, touching a wide variety of specific subjects in the application of their general principles. In the intervening years such activity has greatly increased, resulting in widespread changes and important new developments mandating the rewriting of this volume, which is now being reissued as Volumes 16 and 16A.

The area of Constitutional Law, in particular, has seen a veritable floodtide of decisions by the United States Supreme Court, as well as by other federal courts and the state courts, reflecting attitudinal changes with respect to such important concepts as police power, fundamental rights and privileges, equal protection, privileges and immunities, and due process. Such rights as freedom of association, the right to privacy, and the freedom to travel, have emerged to join the more familiar but still expanding freedoms of religion, speech, press, assembly, and petition. And equality of the sexes has received increasing constitutional recognition in the form of equal rights amendments to state constitutions, while a federal constitutional ERA is pending.

The topic Conflict of Laws has also seen major changes, particularly in the area of torts, and to a lesser but increasing extent in contracts, with traditional *lex loci-lex fori* rules as to substantive rights and procedural or remedial matters giving way to the better reasoned approach variously denominated as "grouping of contacts", "center of gravity", "dominant contacts", etc., all basically involving an analysis of the facts and circumstances of each particular case rather than application of a simplistic and inflexible rule. The new article Conflict of Laws has therefore been expanded considerably, and includes a broadened coverage of practice, procedural and remedial matters.
