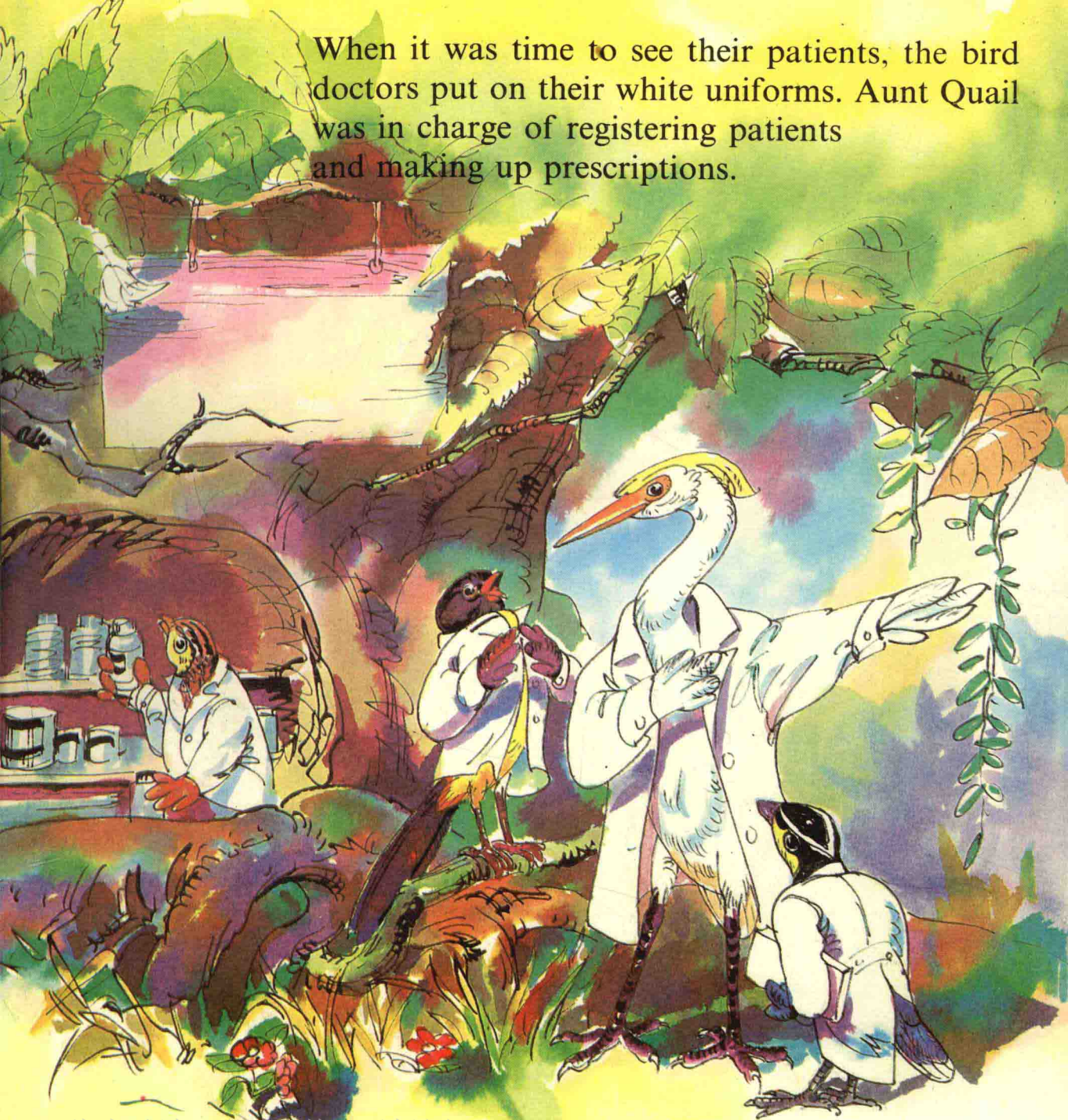




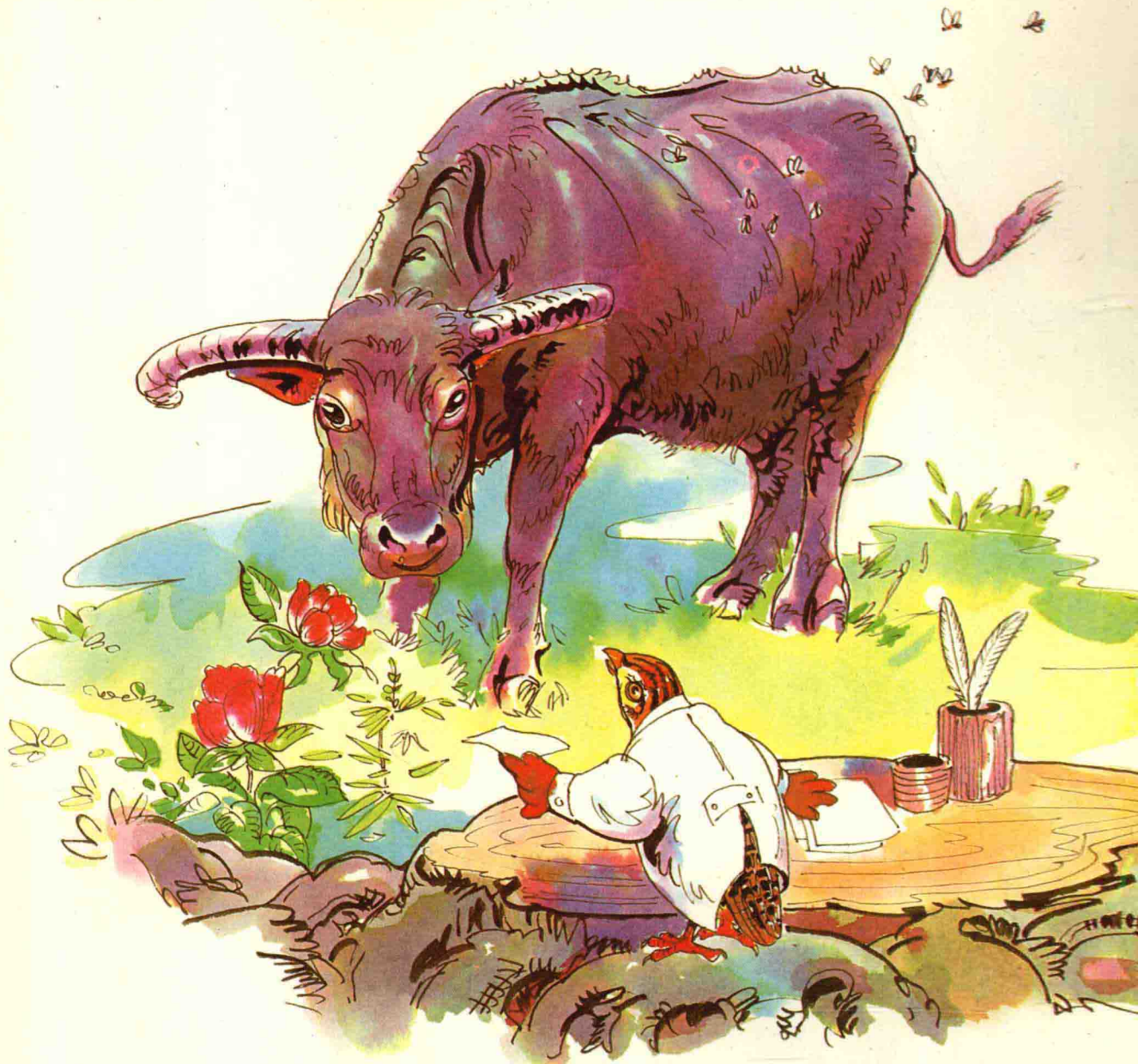
Three bird doctors decided to set up a clinic. They hung up a board saying, "We cure parasites."



When it was time to see their patients, the bird doctors put on their white uniforms. Aunt Quail was in charge of registering patients and making up prescriptions.



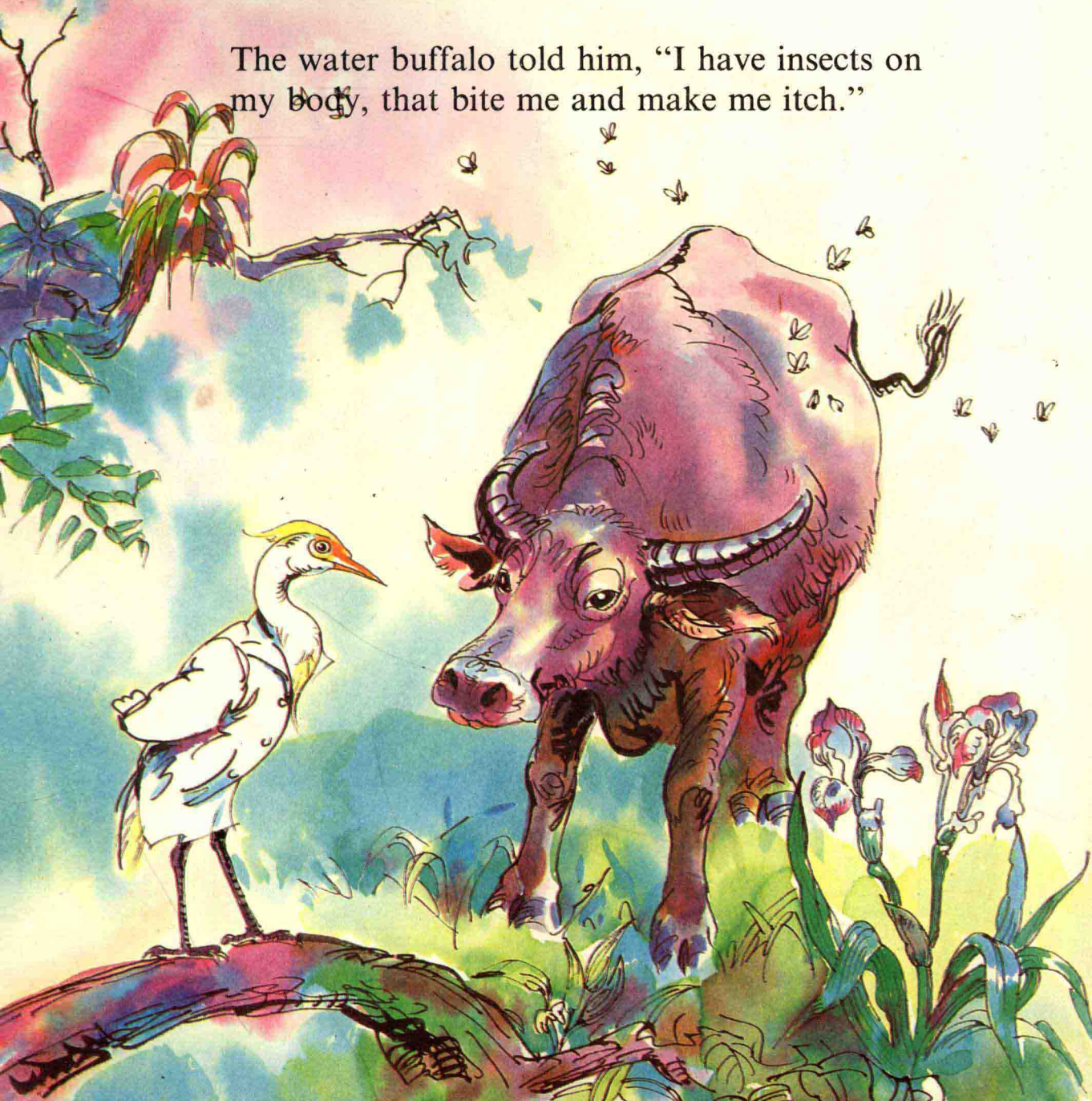


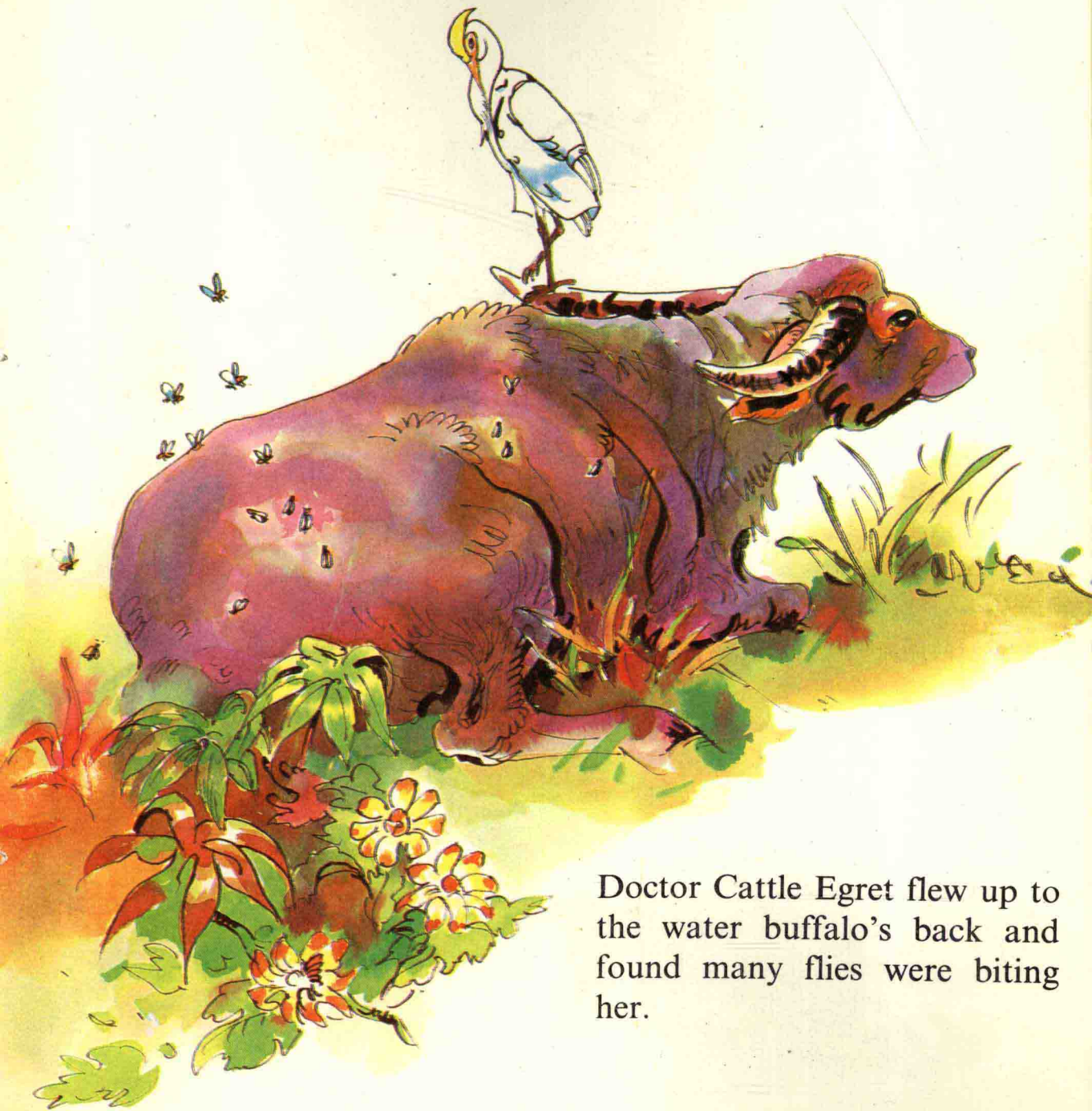


The water buffalo complained that her skin itched terribly and asked if it could be cured. Aunt Quail sent her to the skin care department to see Doctor Cattle Egret.



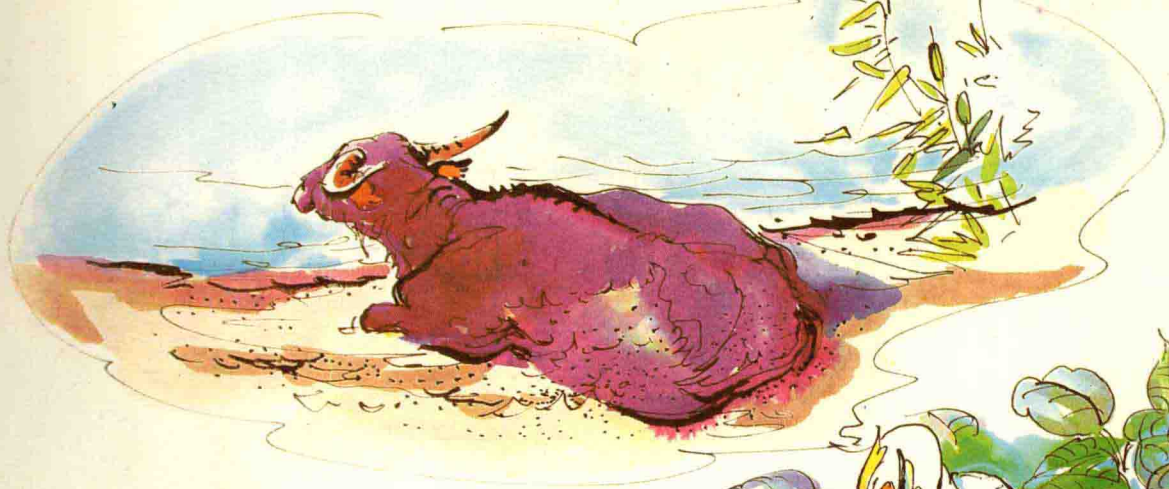
The water buffalo told him, "I have insects on my body, that bite me and make me itch."



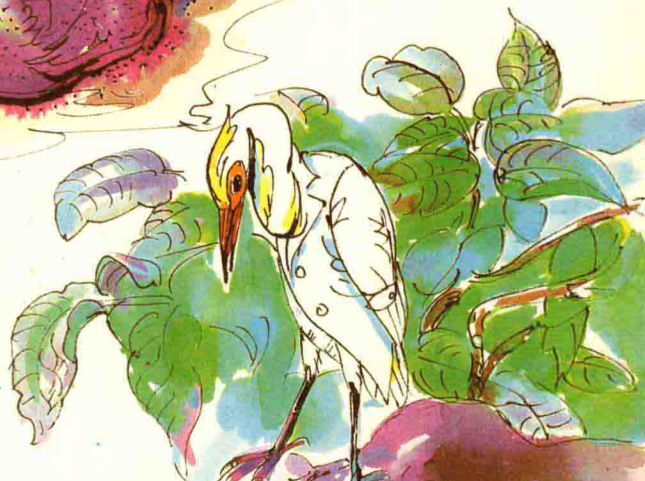


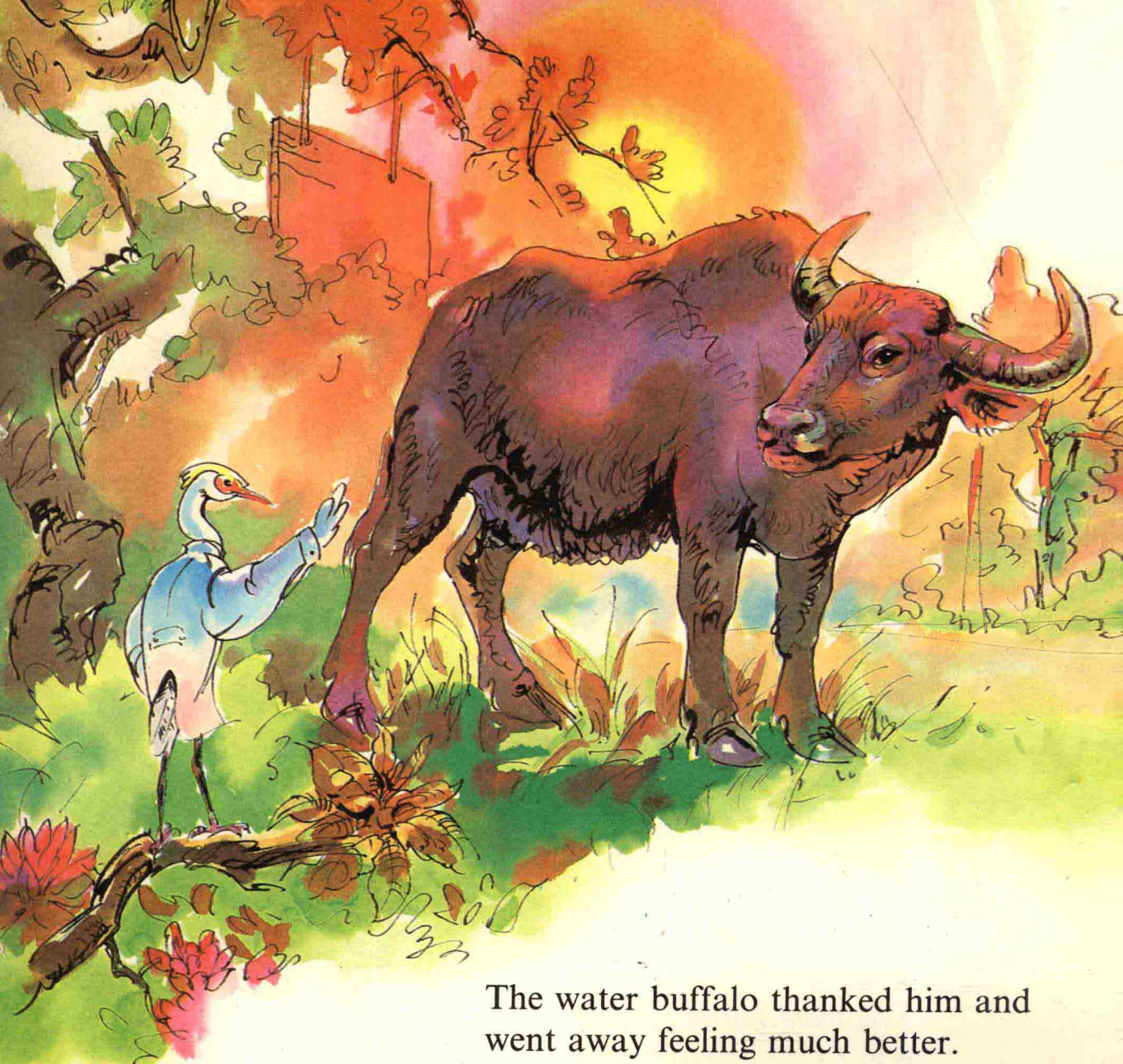
Doctor Cattle Egret flew up to the water buffalo's back and found many flies were biting her.

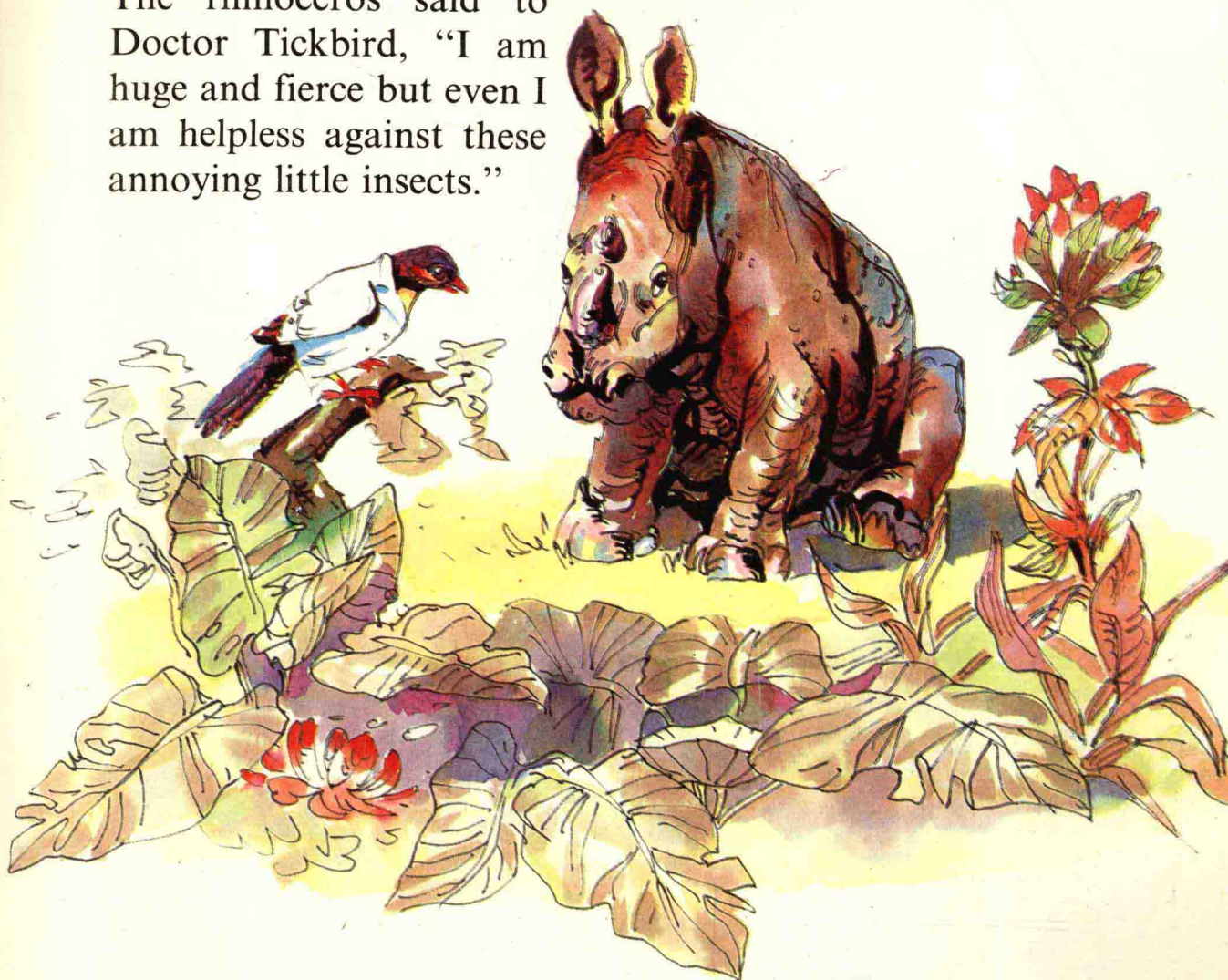
The water buffalo thanked him and

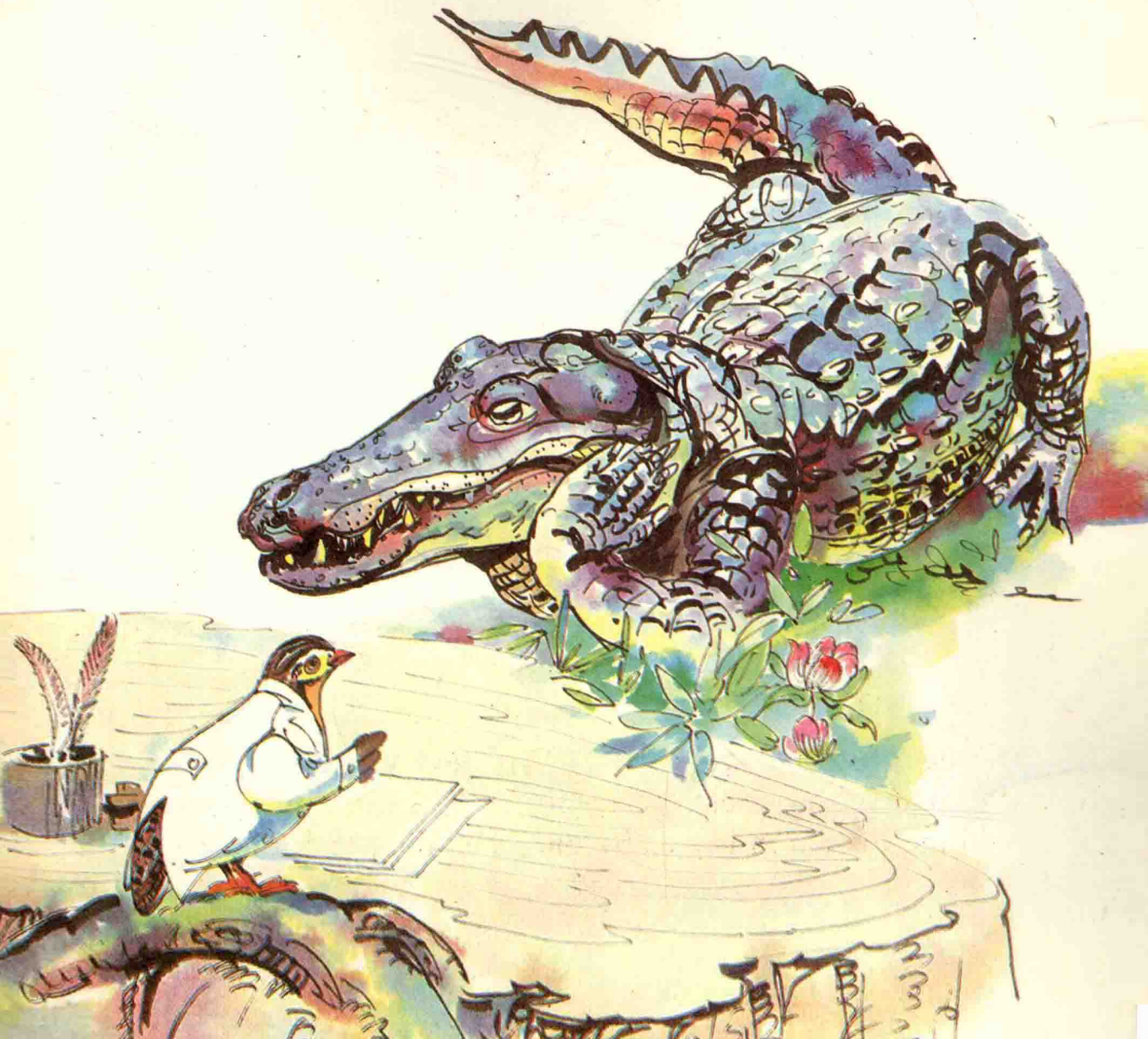




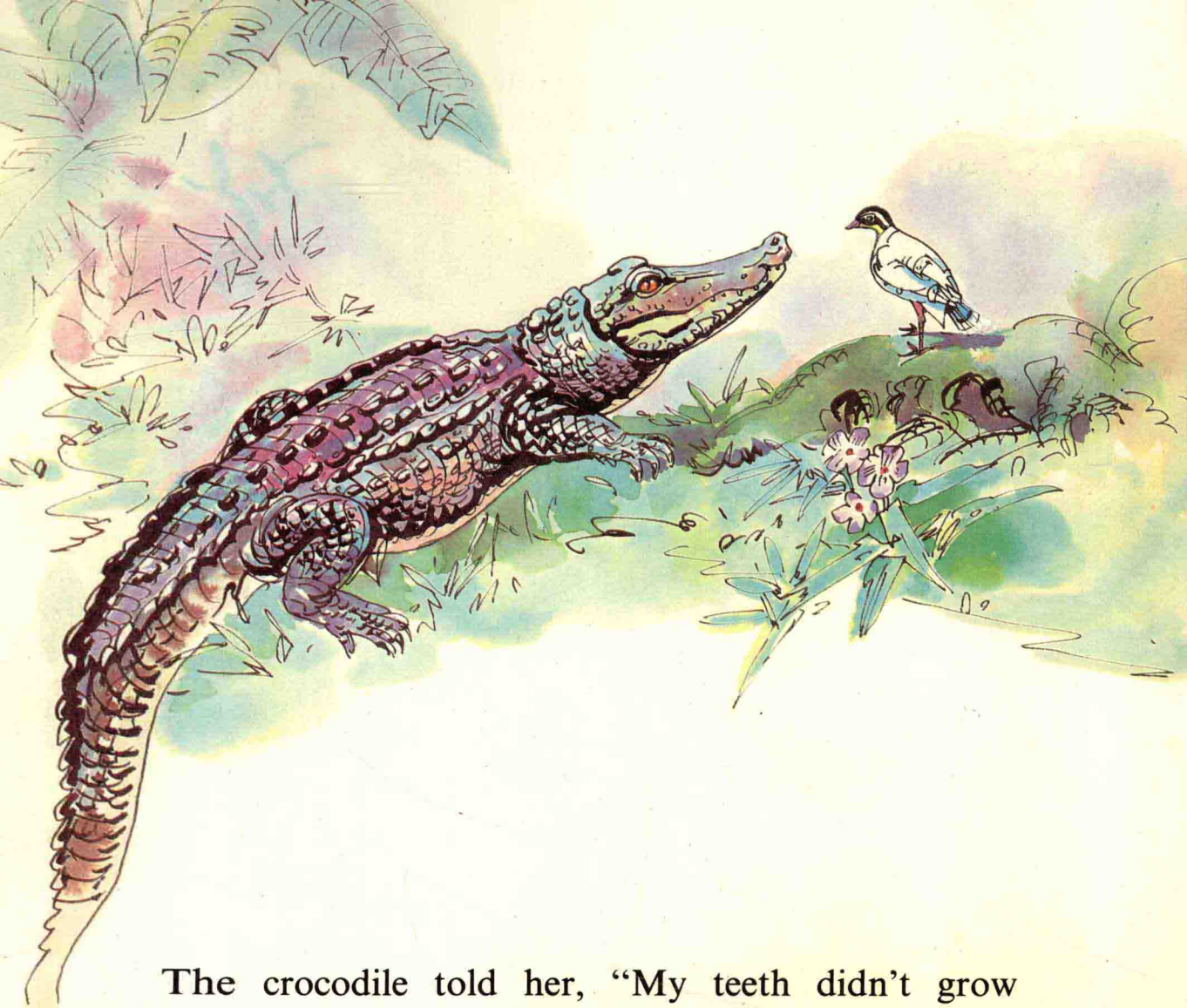


“Thank you,” said the rhinoceros. He left feeling much more cheerful.
