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To the teacher

The tests and their uses

Collins Graded English Tests are a series of six books containing in all sixty-eight English language tests carefully graded in difficulty. The grading uses the general scheme of structure and vocabulary control worked out for Collins English Library, so ensuring that the progression from elementary to fairly advanced is systematic and clear.

Tests in this series are suitable for students of English at various stages of learning, as follows:

Book 1, at 30-50 hours of teaching, or up to one academic year.

Book 2, at 70-100 hours of teaching, or one to two academic years.

Book 3, at 120-150 hours of teaching, or two to three academic years.

Book 4, at 170-200 hours of teaching, or three to four academic years.

Book 5, at 220-250 hours of teaching, or four academic years.

Book 6, at 270-300 hours of teaching, or five academic years.

As can be seen, each book has a limited "spread" of linguistic level. This emerges informally as stages: Stage 1 = Tests 1-4, Stage 2 = Tests 5-8 and Stage 3 = Tests 9-12. At each of these stages the four tests are on the same linguistic level and of equal difficulty.

Books 1–4 are all of the same length, and the tests take the same form. Each book has 12 tests, and each test has 35 questions set out in three sections and occupying two facing pages. In each of Books 5 and 6 there are 10 tests, each test having 60 questions. The same test format is used for both books.

The uses of the tests

The main uses of the tests are as follows:

- 1 *Placement* Tests given before the start of a course of study ensure that new students are placed on the right course and in the right classes.
- 2 *Mid-course* Tests set during a course are a good check on progress and are essential for any necessary regrading.
- 3 *End-of-course* Tests at the end of a course are important for everyone concerned as they (a) show the teacher how much has been learned; (b) give students a feeling of satisfaction or achievement; and (c) help the school to evaluate the syllabus, materials, &c. and the teaching.
- 4 *Diagnosis* The results of the tests show the strengths and the weaknesses of the students. They point to aspects of the language that may need special attention or remedial treatment. They sometimes indicate local difficulties that are caused by the students' own language. This diagnostic value of the tests applies to groups of students and to classes as well as to individuals.
- 5 Selection When for any appropriate reason students have to be selected, these tests offer a fair, objective and independent assessment. They may be put to competitive use.
- 6 Self-testing Self-testing, either individually or in groups, allows students to monitor their own progress. Those who make an effort to "do better next time" do actually improve their English.
- 7 Frequency The use of tests fairly frequently removes some of the fear that might be associated with them. When students are accustomed to the format of a test, their confidence grows and performance improves.
- 8 Collins English Library Although the tests and readers can each be used independently, the tests provide an excellent gauge for assessing the level of reader best suited to each student or class. Both series are subject to the same linguistic controls, as laid out in A Guide to Collins English Library, therefore the level of proficiency achieved in the tests indicates that the corresponding level of the readers would be within the student's capabilities.

The scope of the tests

In Books 1–4, Section A of the tests concentrates upon the common structures of English, in particular verb forms, modals and auxiliaries. In this section roughly a third of the questions test vocabulary. That sort of emphasis probably reflects the normal division of studies at elementary levels. Later, in Books 5 and 6 of the series, the emphasis of Section A is almost wholly upon sense and meaning, at this level a most important aspect. At both levels multiple-choice questions are used.

Throughout the series Section B tests reading comprehension, which is a valid test of understanding, at the lower levels through single-sentence comprehension, later using short passages. As students cannot easily prepare for these tests, they are an effective means of assessment, accurate and objective. All the questions are multiple-choice.

In all the tests Section C examines the student's use of English. In Books 1–4 this is a Cloze reading test suitably modified. This is an excellent test of a student's general knowledge of English. In Books 5 and 6, Section C has four separate questions, all designed to test the student's active usage of ordinary English and familiarity with its structures.

Timing the tests

The tests in Books 1–4 should take the average studen: 45 minutes. The introductory note in the students' book suggests how to split the time up. The actual time taken to complete a test is not very important; five minutes extra may be given if necessary. If students are allowed a lot more time than they need, they begin to alter answers, usually for the worse. The tests in Books 5 and 6 are longer; it is more important for a student to finish a test than to finish it exactly on time.

Marking the tests

For one-letter answers (A, B, C, D or E) accept only the answer given in this book. The same applies to questions in Section A throughout and to those in Section C of Books 1, 2 and 3. There may be more than one correct answer to questions in Section C of Books 4, 5 and 6. A number of acceptable answers are given here, but others may be equally good.

It should be pointed out that the vocabulary of all the answers given here is controlled. The word list in use is that of *Collins English Library*, which is very similar to other lists at elementary levels and extends slightly beyond *The General Service List of English Words* (Longman).

In marking the tests give one mark for each correct answer. At the level of Books 1–4 inclusive, the pass mark is 20; for Books 5 and 6 it is 35. In the multiple-choice questions there is no penalty for incorrect guess-work.
