FOREWORD

by
The Honourable Mr. Justice Fred Kaufman

In 1872, in the preface to his Treatise on Criminal Law, Samuel Robinson Clarke was moved to observe that it was a matter of surprise “that no Treatise on the subjects discussed in the following sheets has been written by any member of the profession of the law during our existence as a Colony”. But now, with serious attempts at uniformity, a comprehensive work was needed, and Clarke laid the foundation. Two years later, Mr. Justice H.E. Taschereau published the first edition of his Criminal Law Consolidation and Amendment Acts, and in a second edition, published in 1888, the author was able to draw on the Revised Statutes of Canada of 1886, which contained a mini-code of criminal law, procedure and evidence. This was a major step forward, but codification (as we know it today) was still five years away, and two more texts were published in the meantime: Dandurand and Lanctôt’s *Traité théorique et pratique de droit criminel*, which included not only Canadian and English case law, but also – advanced for its time – American decisions, and Burbidge’s Digest of the Criminal Law of Canada, which has now been reprinted. This work, published in 1890, leaned heavily on Stephen’s Digest of the Criminal Law of England, but in fact, as the preface proclaims, it was “a statement of that part of the Criminal Law of Canada which relates to the definition of crimes and of punishment prescribed therefor, as it stood on September 1st, 1889”.

The law was varied indeed, and today – only three generations later – it is hard to imagine just how diverse the law was in the early years of union. There was, to begin with, the law of England, not as it stood at the time, but rather as it existed at a series of dates which differed from province to province: 1758 (probably) for the Maritimes, 1763 for Québec, 1792 for Ontario, 1858 for British Columbia and 1870 for the remaining provinces, the Yukon and the Northwest Territories. Then came the alterations brought about by the appropriate legislatures and, after 1867, the federal acts. It was, in many respects, a legal nightmare: offences against religion, for instance, occupied a whole chapter, and even though the author deemed some of these crimes and misdemeanors “practically obsolete”, they were included because “they relate to acts which might still be done”. But other sections still have a familiar ring – theft of oysters, for instance – and even a quick perusal of the 629 articles contained in the book provides a fascinating commentary on the morals and concerns of that age.

That is the value of the book today, but it achieved instant fame in 1892, when the Attorney General, in introducing the Bill for Canada's first comprehensive Code, referred to Burbidge as a major source for this new legislation, and so it was.

It is not surprising that this should have been so, for here, in clear and well-ordered fashion, we find a complete (and annotated) statement of the criminal law as it existed *in Canada*, and while the Digest arrived on the scene after the codifiers had commenced their task, it must have helped them enormously in the time which remained before the final version was published in 1892 and proclaimed a year later.

George Wheelock Burbidge was a Nova Scotian by birth. He graduated from Mount Allison and set up practice in Saint John, New Brunswick. In 1882 he became Deputy Minister of Justice for Canada, a post which he held until 1887, when he was appointed to the Bench of the Exchequer Court. His experience was wide, and it covered such diverse fields as the supervision (as Deputy Minister) of the Crown's case in the treason trials of 1885, to an inquiry into "certain matters" in connection with the Nakusp and Slocan Ry. Co. Clearly, the adage that busy persons get things done applied to the author, and Canadian legal literature has been greatly enriched by his efforts.

PREFACE.

THIS Digest is intended to be a statement of that part of the Criminal Law of Canada which relates to the definition of crimes and of the punishments prescribed therefor, as it stood on September 1st, 1889.

The work is, by the kind permission of the author, founded on Sir James Fitzjames Stephen's Digest of the Criminal Law of England. The portions hereof that are taken from the latter work are enclosed in brackets [], and to enable the reader to distinguish such portions the more readily, and without turning backwards the leaf to which his attention is directed, the continuation of an extract beyond a page is indicated by the insertion of a bracket at the beginning of the page following.

The index and the tables of cases and of the statutes have been prepared by Charles H. Masters, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, assistant reporter of the Supreme Court of Canada, to whom I am also greatly indebted for assistance in the preparation of the Digest, and for reading the proofs and verifying the references to cases and authorities.
