

Capital letters are "large" letters. For example, the "J" in John is a large (capital) letter. When you write, you need to use both capital letters and small letters. Here are a few rules for capital letters.

Use a capital letter for:

- 1. The first word in every sentence. The bank is open at 9:00.
- 2. The first person singular. (I) I am 20 years old and I'm a student.
- 3. Names of people. (first names, middle names, last names) Roger Simpson is a doctor.
- 4. Names of cities, states, provinces, countries, and continents. I am from <u>Detroit</u>, <u>Michigan</u>. Mexico is in Central America.
- 5. Names of streets. Her apartment is on Franklin Street.
- 6. Names of universities, schools, and colleges. She is a student at Paxton University.


