内容提要

出版说明

随着改革开放的进一步深入和经济全球化趋势的加快,我国对外经贸活动将更加活跃,无论沿海或内地,经贸活动的外向性将更加明显。所有这些都对培养既具备较强的英语交际能力,又具备扎实的商务及外贸运作知识的商务英语专业人才提出了迫切要求。

据统计,目前我国开设商务英语及其相关专业的高职高专院校已达到几百所,其课程设置从传统的老三门课程"外刊选读"、"外贸函电"、"外贸口语"发展到包括管理学、经济学、国际贸易等学科的一些主干课程的综合课程体系。如何改革高职高专的商务英语教育机制,加强这一层次的商务英语学科建设、课程体系建设,特别是教材建设,对人才培养具有十分重要的现实意义。为此,武汉理工大学出版社和全国二十多所高职高专院校决定联合组织编写一套适合高职高专教学需要的"高职高专商务英语类专业规划教材"。

前 言

《旅游英语》的使用对象是高职高专旅游英语专业、商务英语专业的学生,也包含使用英语从事涉外旅游活动的广大旅游工作者。

Tips on Currency Exchange in China

When travelling in China, you need to bring some cash with you. You will find it very convenient to use particularly when shopping with street vendors. The Chinese currency is known as Renminbi (RMB), literally "People's Money". The basic unit of RMB is Yuan (dollar), which is divided into 10 Jiao (dime), which is divided again into 10 Fen. When you plan to travel to China, you'd better have your original currency exchanged to Renminbi before you go or you can make the currency exchange in China. Here're some tips on currency exchange in China.

Foreign currency and traveler's cheque exchange is available in most of China's cities. Banks, hotels, airports, even the shopping malls will provide such service. In some of the places, the self-service facilities are also equipped to cope with overseas tourists.

All the state banks in China, like Bank of China, Agriculture Bank of China, Industrial and Commercial Bank of China and China Construction Bank, offer the money exchange service. At present, several kinds of foreign currencies can be exchanged at any outlets of Bank of China, including Euro, British Pound, US Dollar, Swiss Franc, Singapore Dollar, Swedish Krona, Danish Krone, Norwegian Krone, Japanese Yen, Canadian Dollar, Australian Dollar, Philippine Peso, Thailand Baht and South Korean Won (only available in particular Chinese cities) and so on.

Please note that branches of other banks may only accept certain kinds of foreign currencies, and sometimes they will not offer such a service if they are not the provincial-branches. So you should exchange your money at Bank of China, the main bank in China to handle foreign currencies. Additionally, you'd better have your original currency converted in big cities before you go to some small towns, rural areas or nature reserves, because it may be hard for you to find a bank in some remote places.

When exchanging foreign currency, a valid passport is required. The official exchange rate is used in most places so it's unnecessary to shop around for a better deal. The receipt must be retained to show when the RMB is changed back to your original currency before leaving China. You must empty all Chinese RMB before the last day of your tour because you don't have time to convert it back at the airport.
