



YEARS AGO, I WENT WITH A FRIEND TO VISIT FRIENDS OF HIS AND WAS IMMEDIATELY AT EASE IN THE HOME OF PEOPLE I HAD JUST MET. THEIR LIBRARY WAS ARCHITEC-TURALLY INVITING—DARK MAHOGANY PANELING OFFSET BY LARGE IRON CASEMENT WINDOWS. THEIR FURNITURE CONSISTED OF A HUGE LEATHER COUCH AND COMFORTABLE, VELVET-UPHOLSTERED SIDE CHAIRS. THERE WERE ACCENTS IN THE CLASSIC MODE: A BUST ON A MAHOGANY TABLE, OLD PRINTS IN DARK FRAMES ON THE WALLS, AN ORIENTAL RUG, AND A CRACKLING FIRE IN THE FIREPLACE. BUT THE QUALITY THAT ENDEARED IT TO ME WAS NOT ITS BEAUTY SO MUCH AS ITS COZY AMBIENCE. THERE WAS NOTHING THAT SEEMED TO BE THERE JUST FOR SHOW. TWO SMALL CHILDREN PLAYED A BOARD GAME ON THE FLOOR; THE ROOM WAS DEFINITELY LIVED-IN. IT ALL LOOKED WELL USED AND LOVED, AND IT BORE THE STAMP OF ITS OWNERS.

IF FLORALS MAKE YOU FEEL CHEERFUL, USE THEM FOR RUGS, UPHOLSTERY, OR DRAPERY FABRIC. OR USE FLORAL ACCENTS FOR A SMALLER DOSE WITH A SIMILAR IMPACT. IF LEATHER FURNISHINGS AND WOOD PANELING SUIT YOU, CREATE THE MOOD WITH THE RIGHT FABRICS, COLORS, AND TEXTURES. NATURAL WOOD TRIM, OR DARK RATHER THAN WHITE PAINT, MIGHT BE ALL THAT IS NECESSARY. DEEP BROWN, TEXTURED UPHOLSTERY CAN TAKE THE PLACE OF LEATHER AT A FRACTION OF THE COST. YOU CAN GET THE LOOK AND FEEL YOU WANT WITHIN YOUR OWN CONSTRAINTS.

PERFECTION IS NOT THE GOAL. COMFORT, EASE, TRANQUILITY, COMPATIBILITY WITH THE INHABITANTS—THESE ARE THE QUALITIES THAT ENCOMPASS THE IDEA OF A HARMONIOUS INTERIOR. HARMONIOUS INTERIORS WILL GUIDE YOUR DECORATING CHOICES TO CREATE A RESTFUL AMBIENCE TO BALANCE YOUR HECTICALIFE AND BRING YOU A SENSE OF PEACE AND COMFORT AT HOME.

Understanding harmony is the first step to achieving it. According to the dictionary, harmony is congruity the combination of parts into an orderly, peaceful whole. We know it best in music where voices join together to turn a simple tune into a spine-tingling choral piece. Simply singing the right notes, however, does not make music. The subtler, intuitive components of loud and soft, sweet and harsh turn the notes into song.

So in our lives, components can coexist—career and home, work and play—but in order for life to be harmonious, there needs to be balance among them. In today's world this is becoming more and more challenging. As we scramble to meet increasing demands, it is ever more difficult to take time for ourselves to rejuvenate body and soul. The more successful we are, the more demands we create for our time and money. The scales begin to tip and life becomes less manageable.

This is where the harmonious home becomes indispensable. A home that welcomes and comforts is restorative. If one can open the front door at the end of the day and instantly feel a sense of calm, the rejuvenation begins even if there is still dinner to make, the dog to walk, laundry to fold, and homework to supervise.

Home does not need to be a showpiece to provide tranquility, but it does need to be composed thoughtfully. Like the melodic soprano voice in a choral piece, a beautiful sofa in a room with compatible fabrics, lighting, pattern, and other forms becomes more lovely as part of its setting. Some element must link furnishings and accessories for a room to be harmonious. The style, color, size, or shape of furnishings and accents should be in accord. This does not mean they should perfectly match, but there must be some thread that ties them together. Choose pieces with some association or connection to contribute to an orderly, tranquil setting. A club chair can work in a delicate, feminine décor if upholstered in a soft color or floral fabric. Or an ornately decorated mirror can work in a casual room if linked by size, color, or material.

Perhaps most important, the décor of a home should be in accord with its inhabitants. As you select furnishings and colors, feel their impact on you. Choose pieces that agree with your own tastes and lifestyle so your home will reflect yourself for a truly harmonious interior.
