

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FOREWORD

Revised volumes 22 and 22A of Am Jur 2d bring litigation attorneys thoroughly updated materials on Damages, Wrongful Death (in the article Death), and Declaratory Judgments. The articles on **Damages** and **Death** each contain an entirely new review of dollar verdicts in selected cases decided since 1970, which may be used, not only to argue on appeal that a verdict was excessive or inadequate, but also when evaluating a case to decide whether it is worth accepting or settling. The **Damages** article also treats such emerging problems as accounting for inflation in awards for future losses, damages for breach of computer service contracts, damages for loss of feelings in noncommercial contract settings, and apportionment of damages among several defendants in comparative negligence jurisdictions.

Besides discussing wrongful death statutes and procedure in wrongful death cases, the article **Death** also deals with the determination of death under such statutes as the Uniform Determination of Death Act (which focuses on brain death), and with such "right to die" issues as the right to refuse lifesaving treatment and liability for withholding treatment from a minor.

The topic **Declaratory Judgments** incorporates recent cases construing the Federal Declaratory Judgment Act and the Uniform Declaratory Judgments Act.

Volume 22A also contains a revised article on **Dead Bodies**, with new coverage of the Uniform Anatomical Gifts Act.

Each article contains *Observations*, *Cautions*, *Recommendations*, *Practice guides*, and *Form drafting guides* providing detailed advice and procedures for evaluating and litigating a claim, as well as research references to such practice works as Am Jur Proof of Facts and Am Jur Trials. A **Table of Statutes and Rules Cited** and a **Table of Parallel References** are contained at the front of each volume, and an **Index** covering the topics in a volume is contained at the end of each volume.

Scope of topic: This article covers general principles of the law of damages. It includes a discussion of the various kinds of damages—compensatory damages, nominal damages, liquidated damages, and exemplary and punitive damages—as well as of such concepts as general and special damages, prospective damages, and mitigation of damages. The elements and measure of damages in breach of contract, personal injury, and property damage cases are also covered, as are the pleading, proof, and determination of the amount of damages to be awarded in a lawsuit.
