





Consider the case of Chelmonde and Gilmour v. Bellring. Bellring brought a suit against the defendant, a resident of New Jersey, for the recovery of a sum of \$3,000.00 which he had loaned to the defendant.

LEGISLATION HIGHLIGHTER

Section 88 of the Coroners and Justice Act 2009

A criminal court may make a witness anonymous under section 88 of the Coroners and Justice Act 2009 if three conditions are met. One condition is that the witness must either be necessary to give evidence or to prevent serious harm to another person or to prevent serious damage to public health. The other two conditions relate to the identity of an undercover officer or agent. The measure was introduced to protect undercover officers and agents from being identified by the media.

KEY CASE

CARMICHAEL V NATIONAL POWER
Mrs Carmichael worked as a guard at a power station on a "global" basis, showing group around. She worked some hours more than her contracted hours, wore a company uniform, was required to drive a vehicle, and enjoyed many of the benefits of the job. The question for the court to determine was whether she was an employee or a self-employed worker, which she worked and the employer paid her for.

Held: (HL) During the course of her duties, she was an employee of the employer.





Figure 1 Court and Tribunal System
