#### Bibliographical note

This project took several years from an initial idea to its completion in the book form. Parts of this book were presented as work-in-progress during several conferences, the first of them being the Third Feminist Conference in Poznań, Poland, which took place between 26-28.04.2002. The presentation was entitled "In Search of the Third Space: the Figure of a Little Girl in the Contemporary Indian Women Prose." A revised version of the paper was subsequently published in Polish in Er(r)go VIII, 2004 (Katowice: Wydawnictwo Uniwersyteckie "Ślask"), under the title "In Search of a Voice: the Figure of a Little Girl in Chosen Texts by Writers of Indian Origin." At the Conference of the Polish Association for American Studies, which took place in Wrocław, 10-13.11.2002, I presented a paper "American Journeys, Hybrid Subjects: Writers of Indian Origin Map North America", later published in a volume Traveling Subjects: American Journeys in Space and Time (Kraków: Rabid, 2004). During the Second Annual Spring Symposium at Cornell University, Ithaca, NY, "There's no place like home: Writing home," 14-15.02.2003 I presented an essay "'Home isn't a place, it's a feeling': Post-Colonial Narratives by Women Writers of Indian Descent." An expanded version of the paper was later presented during the Fourth Biannual Conference of the International Society for Travel Writing, in Milwaukee, USA, on 21-24.10.2004 under the title "Hybrid Journeys: Postcolonial Narratives by Writers of Indian Descent: Ginu Kamani, Tahira Naqvi and Tesha Sengupta." At the Ninth Conference of the Nordic Association for the English Studies in Aarhus, Denmark, 27-29.05.2004 I spoke on: "The Mistress of Spices: A Journey Towards An Illusion". The essay was then published under the same title on a CD-ROM with conference proceedings. In Ustroń, Poland, during a conference entitled "Mapping Space(s): Memory, Place, Locality," which took place on 14-17.09.2005 I presented a paper "In the Name of the Father: Identity, Disruption, Difference." A part of the following work was published in an early version in: Anglica Wratislaviensia XLIII (Wrocław 2005) entitled "History vs. histories: Arundhati Roy's The God of Small Things and Kavery Nambisan's The Scent of Pepper."
