PREFACE AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The West Nutshell Series is to serve as "a succinct exposition of the law to which a student or lawyer can turn for reliable guidance," and this fourth edition of *Pretrial Litigation in a Nutshell* is written with this purpose in mind.

As with the earlier editions of this book, the text discusses both the law governing the civil pretrial process and the skills that counsel must employ during pretrial proceedings. The law discussed is that applicable to federal civil proceedings, primarily the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. Major amendments to the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure became effective on December 1, 2006, while the Civil Rules Style Project resulted in extensive amendments to the language and style of the Rules that became effective on December 1, 2007. State counterparts to the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure have been adopted in a majority of jurisdictions, and the pretrial skills considered in the text are essential to lawyers in both state and federal practice.

This text can be used as an assigned text in a law school or continuing legal education course in pretrial litigation. The text also should prove a useful supplement in civil procedure courses or clinical courses involving civil pretrial practice. In addition, attorneys embarking on a litigation practice or who

do not regularly handle civil lawsuits may find the text useful with respect to pretrial practice.
