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PREFACE

With the eleventh one-volume edition of the *Nelson Textbook of Pediatrics*, Vaughan and McKay have been joined by Richard E. Behrman. These three have had the benefit of the continuing gifted leadership of Waldo E. Nelson; the work remains in essence his, and it is for his standard that the rest of us have strived. His commitment now spans 38 years and 8 editions. The first of 2 two-volume editions appeared 60 years ago, as "Griffith" (1919); it has been followed by "Mitchell and Griffith" (1927, 1933, 1937, 1941), "Mitchell-Nelson" (1945, 1950), and 6 editions of "Nelson."

In the preface to the Fourth Edition, Nelson expressed the hope that a single-volume work could be prepared which would meet the needs both of practitioners and of students. We have tried to be faithful to that goal, and to produce a concise volume helpful to all health workers and students who care for children or want to know about them or their problems. The Eleventh Edition is, nonetheless, larger than earlier ones, as new knowledge and concerns have expanded old sections and as essential new ones have been added. We are grateful to our contributors for their cooperation in the quest for completeness, relevance, and conciseness.

In the interim since the last edition we have lost four contributors through death. Ernest Carroll Faust, Robert H. High, Alex J. Steigman, and Warren E. Wheeler will be much missed.

We have for this addition had the invaluable assistance of the Staffs of the Departments of Pediatrics of Temple University, of the University of Vermont, and of Case Western Reserve University. We are particularly indebted to C. Robert E. Wells, M.D., to Sarah S. Long, M.D., and to Michiko Claflin of Temple University and St. Christopher's Hospital for Children; to Marion Canedy of the University of Vermont; to Connie McSweeney of Case Western Reserve University; and to Wynette Hoffman of W. B. Saunders Company. Victor H. Auerbach, Ph.D., and Richard Hamilton, M.D., have served as associate editors, for the Sections on Inborn Errors of Metabolism and on Gastroenterology, respectively, and Vincent A. Fulginiti, M.D. has been a valued consultant.

Besides these, the preparation of this volume has required the help, cooperation, and forbearance of a host of other persons. We have neither words adequate to convey our gratitude nor space enough for their names, but each of them will know that he or she has our heartfelt thanks.

Finally, the work would not have been possible without the understanding and active participation of Margery Nelson, Deborah Vaughan, Elizabeth McKay, and Ann Behrman. They have contributed in essential and countless ways to the undertaking.

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
