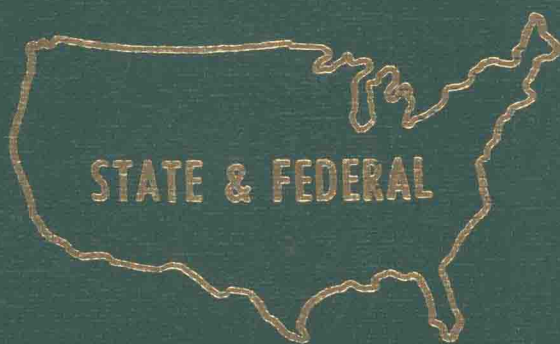

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COSTS

Scope of Topic: This article discusses the general principles governing the allowance of costs in judicial proceedings. It also discusses the principles governing certain allowances not strictly within the term "costs," as where an allowance of expenses, including attorneys' fees, is made out of a fund created or preserved for the benefit of others, or where an attorney's fee in the nature of a penalty is imposed under statutory provisions reflecting public policy.

Treated elsewhere are attorneys' fees as an element of damages (see DAMAGES), the principles governing the allowance of costs on or after appeal (see 4, 5 Am Jur 2d, APPEAL AND ERROR), and matters relating to the allowance of costs in particular actions or proceedings (see, for example, 5 Am Jur 2d, ARBITRATION AND AWARD §§ 139, 166; 6 Am Jur 2d, ATTACHMENT AND GARNISHMENT; DIVORCE AND SEPARATION; EMINENT DOMAIN; FORCIBLE ENTRY AND DETAINER; HOMESTEAD; INJUNCTIONS; MANDAMUS; MECHANICS' LIENS; MORTGAGES; PARTITION; PROHIBITION; QUIETING TITLE AND DETERMINATION OF ADVERSE CLAIMS; QUO WARRANTO; WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION). Amounts paid to various public officers as fees are also treated in other articles (see 15 Am Jur 2d, CLERKS OF COURT §§ 11-20; PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES; SHERIFFS, POLICE, AND CONSTABLES).

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
