Time differences are a considerable problem in this analysis. The table below should help:

British Summer Time:	+1
Buenos Aires/Falklands:	-3
Washington DC	-4
Lima	-5

A further hour's time difference was added between Buenos Aires/Falklands and Greenwich during June because of summer time.

British forces were operating on Greenwich Mean Time throughout. There were time variations during the course of the conflict in the Rio Grande and Stanley areas but these do not affect the narrative.






The South Atlantic Region
