Foreword

The 5th International Conference on Management will be held in Macao Special Administrative Region, China on May 3-5, 2004. This conference is cosponsored by the Department of Management Sciences of the National Natural Science Foundation of China, Macao Foundation, Macao University of Science and Technology and Nanjing University.

Management refers to the various activities and to the entire process through which managers try to utilize all kinds of resources, such as personnel, material, equipment and information, in order to achieve preset goals in light of the ever-changing environment. Management, accordingly, can be thought of as the “software” in productivity. Only through management can the three basic factors, namely labor, tools and work objectives, be organized efficiently and thus can the enhancement of productivity be promoted. It is also only through management that science and technology can be converted into real productivity and thus can the symbiosis between science/technology and the economy be realized. Management as a science aims to research and identify the objective principles in the domain of management. It plays a significant role in China’s transition from a traditional planned economy to a socialist market economy. It also performs an important function in building a well-off society in comprehensive ways. Many persons of insight have come to realize through their own practice that developing management sciences is crucial to the prosperity of China and the well-being of its people. Therefore, the main objectives of all the previous International Conferences on Management held by us since 1994 are to stimulate the prosperity of Chinese management sciences and related research, and to improve our management capability of building a modern socialist cause with Chinese characteristics.

As one of the great achievements in human civilization, management sciences have been keeping abreast of the major developments of the times, of effective organizational practice and important advances in the other sciences. The theme of this Conference is management sciences and global strategies in the 21st century. Over the past decades, human society has achieved a series of important breakthroughs and has made remarkable progress in various high-tech fields, such as electronics, biology, aerospace, marine science, new materials and new energy sources. At the same time, knowledge has been created, spread and applied with a speed unprecedented in human history. I also hope that our numerous managers in China can master management theories and apply them effectively to daily problem-solving and decision-making processes. I hope further that Chinese scholars and managerial executives can

work together closely, can derive guiding management principles from practical experience, and can then refine them into suitable theories, thus gradually forming a managerial school with Chinese characteristics.

That this Conference is held in Macao Special Administrative Region of China embodies a special significance. Macao is a beautiful island city with a population of only 460,000 people. After her return to the motherland at the end of 1999 and under the efficient administration of the Macao Special Administrative Region, Macao has achieved a rapid-growing economy, and a stable and prosperous society by establishing close cooperation with inland. In 2003, Macao achieved a remarkable growth rate in GDP of 14%, providing a striking example of the successful implementation of the “one Country, two Systems” concept.

On behalf of the Conference sponsors and as Chairman of the Conference, I would like to express my warmest welcome to all the guests, scholars and entrepreneurs attending the Conference. I would also like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to all the authors of papers submitted to the conference and sincere thanks to all the paper reviewers for carefully reviewing and the valuable comments. Moreover, I would like to acknowledge those who have helped prepare and organize this Conference.
