When you take the exam, you will have to answer correctly at least 38 questions out of a total of 56 in order to successfully complete the exam. The required number of correct questions can vary based on the difficulty of the questions administered in the particular exam you take. If you fail a test, you must wait at least 30 days before you retake that exam. You may attempt a particular test up to 3 times in a 12-month period.

### Recertification

Oracle announces the requirements for upgrading your certification based on the release of new products and upgrades. Oracle will give six months' notice announcing when an exam version is expiring.

### **Exam Format**

The computer-based exam is a multiple-choice test, consisting of 56 questions that must be completed in 90 to 120 minutes.

# Introduction

his book is a valuable resource for IT Management and Technical Staff; it gives them a good insight into the many enhancements in Oracle9*i* to address the challenges introduced by the Internet. The database has to service millions of users from around the world without compromising security even though many of the users are

anonymous, without degrading performance levels, and while letting each user have a personal experience in the time and language of their locale. You have to improve availability, because downtime can have significant economic and legal impacts. Since user loads are prone to increase (a good problem for a retailer) scalability is of paramount importance.
