Preface to Fourth Edition

It has now been thirty-four years since the first edition of this treatise was published. Originally two volumes, it has grown to seven volumes to accommodate the explosion of case law precedent, statutory amendments and technological changes. While I continually strive to keep the coverage terse and concise, trademark law has grown continually more complex.

The explosive growth of trademark law in the last thirty years has been nothing short of astonishing. When I first wrote the book, trademark law was largely the preserve of "patent lawyers," with only a handful of trademark-only specialists in New York and Washington, D.C. Today, thousands of practitioners across the nation practice trademark law.

Trademark law is now front-page news because trademarks are now, more than ever, an exceedingly valuable form of intellectual property. Part of this is, I think, due to an increasingly competitive global business environment, where there is a critical need for every seller to carve out a distinctive identity in a world market crowded with competitors.

I originally wrote the treatise to provide judges, attorneys, and students with a comprehensible and authoritative source in which to find and understand trademark and unfair competition law. Therefore, I am immensely pleased that this treatise has been frequently cited by the courts and the USPTO as authority. Over 3000 judicial decisions have cited and relied upon this treatise. This includes citation by the U.S. Supreme Court in nine cases and by every federal court of appeals.
