INTRODUCTION

This legal Almanac explores the area of law which governs consumer rights. A consumer is generally defined as an individual who purchases goods and services for his or her personal use. Until the consumer rights movement gained momentum in the mid-1960s, most consumers stood on unequal ground in negotiating transactions with sellers of goods and services. This Almanac gives an overview of the history of the consumer rights movement as it gained momentum over the past several decades.

This Almanac also discusses legislation subsequently passed in an attempt to provide equality in the marketplace and afford the consumer a variety of remedies. Although protective legislation is in effect to benefit the consumer, it is complex. Most consumers are not aware of their rights under the law, and even if they are aware, it takes a certain degree of sophistication to understand exactly what the law provides.

This Almanac provides the consumer with an overview of the law applicable to consumer transactions. The protection and remedies a consumer is entitled to when involved in certain common transactions are explored, as well as advice in handling such transactions. This Almanac further provides the consumer with information concerning the major federal agencies entrusted with overseeing important consumer-related concerns such as product safety. The topics of banking, managing credit, privacy issues and identity protection are explored. The consumer's rights as a patient and a tenant are also examined in this Almanac.

It is important that the individual consumer is made aware of his or her rights, so he or she can recognize a violation when it occurs, and pursue appropriate remedies against the offending party. An informed consumer benefits not only the individual, but the society of consumers as they work to gain equality in the marketplace.

The Appendix provides directories of agencies concerned with consumer rights, including the major federal agencies entrusted with overseeing important consumer-related concerns such as product safety and environmental and occupational safety. The Appendix also sets forth the text of applicable statutes, and other pertinent information and data. The Glossary contains definitions of many of the terms used throughout the Almanac.
