

FOREWORD

This volume contains a new article on the increasingly litigated area of **Wrongful Discharge**, recognizing the fact that the courts of many jurisdictions have drastically altered the long-standing policy of most American courts which traditionally permitted the discharge of "at-will" employees for any, or no reason. The article concentrates on the development within the past 20 years of theories under which a discharged employee—not protected by a union contract or civil service regulations—may bring an action against his or her former employer.

The theories under which discharged employees may be able to recover include the "public policy" exception which offers relief against retaliatory discharge of "whistleblowers," of employees who refuse to commit illegal or unethical acts, and of employees who exercise such legal rights as bringing workers' compensation actions. Another frequently invoked theory is based on the contention that employees have implied-in-fact contracts which may be founded on representations made in employee handbooks and manuals. Other actions for **Wrongful Discharge** have been based on covenants of good faith and fair dealing, and on various tort remedies, such as interference with contractual relations, infliction of emotional distress, invasion of privacy, and fraud. Also discussed in this article are defenses and remedies, including the awarding of punitive damages and injunctive relief.

The **Workers' Compensation** article in this volume takes into account the many statutory and other changes in the law of workers' compensation that have occurred in the period since the original Am Jur 2d **Workmen's Compensation** article appeared.

Discussion as to who is an "employee" for purposes of workers' compensation laws has been expanded, including a more detailed examination of the status of independent contractors and their employees, who are now often covered by workers' compensation statutes. There is also expanded coverage on the question as to who are "dependents" for purposes of workers' compensation death benefits, what constitutes an "accident" or "injury" subject to workers' compensation, and on the relation of the accident, injury, or disability required to entitle a claimant to compensation.

Changes in the law with regard to the application of conflicts of law rules to workers' compensation, and the right of a claimant to bring an action outside the normal workers' compensation remedy, against the employer or third persons, are among the matters discussed. The current rules as to the compensability of injuries of a mental or emotional nature, or injuries which are caused by stress or other emotional stimuli, and suicide, are also covered. Furthermore, discussion has been added highlighting changes in the law regarding the effect of a workers' compensation claimant's settlement on an employer's or compensation insurer's liability.

Each article has been enhanced by the inclusion of *Observations*, *Practice guides*, *Cautions*, and *Checklists* providing detailed advice and procedures, as well as *Research References* directing the reader to related discussions in ALR and ALR Federal annotations, to practical advice in Am Jur Proof of Facts and Am

Jur Trials, and to pertinent forms in Am Jur Pleading and Practice Forms (Rev) and Am Jur Legal Forms 2d.

A **Table of Parallel References** to help the reader translate references from the original Am Jur 2d **Workmen's Compensation** article into appropriate references in the new **Workers' Compensation** article in this volume will be found immediately following this Foreword. (There is no Table of Parallel References for the **Wrongful Discharge** article since no similar article appeared in the original Am Jur 2d volume.) **The Table of Statutes and Rules Cited** follows the Parallel Reference Table.

An **Index** for each article will be found at the back of this volume.

Scope of topic: This article discusses workers' compensation under state legislation, including the validity, construction, operation, and effect of such legislation, the employers and employments covered, the persons entitled to benefits, compensable injuries, the computation of benefits, and the means and methods of securing them. It also examines persons liable for payment of compensation, compensation insurance, and other incidental rights and duties under state workers' compensation legislation.

Federal aspects: The treatment of workers' compensation awards in bankruptcy proceedings is discussed in 9 Am Jur 2d, Bankruptcy §§ 1193 and 2379. Federal workers' compensation acts, including the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Compensation Act, the Federal Employees' Compensation Act, and the Defense Base Act, are treated in 32 Am Jur 2d, Federal Employers' Liability and Compensation Acts §§ 87 et seq. The Jones Act is discussed in 32 Am Jur 2d, Federal Employers' Liability and Compensation Acts §§ 41 et seq. and the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act is discussed in 38 Am Jur 2d, Gas and Oil §§ 259 et seq. The exemption of workers' compensation from federal tax levy is discussed in 35 Am Jur 2d, Federal Tax Enforcement § 28. (See "Federal Legislation," *infra*, for USCS citations).
