Founded on the Index to the first eighty volumes prepared by Peter Allsop in 1964 and updated by Nina Stimson in 1975, this new Cumulative Index covers the *Law Quarterly Review's* one hundred years of publication. It follows the scheme devised by Peter Allsop and I hope that it will prove as useful.

EXTRACT FROM THE PREFACE TO THE INDEX TO VOLUMES 1-72

THE method used in preparing the Index is now common to the encyclopaedic legal textbooks. A number of headings, familiar to all lawyers, have been chosen, and the subjects have been arranged in alphabetical order under these headings. The main headings will be found listed in the Table of Contents. A disadvantage of this method when applied to a work of the character of *The Law Quarterly Review* is that some of the more memorable headings (such as “The Dog and the Potman: or ‘Go it, Bob,’ ” and “Will you, won’t you, will you, won’t you, will you join the dance?”) perforce give place to more prosaic entries. I have endeavoured to include both entries. A distinction between articles on the one hand and notes and reviews on the other has been made by printing the page references to the latter in italic type. A number of cross-references have been included so that I hope no more than two casts should be necessary: but it is not possible to read the thoughts of all potential users of the Index.

No book for lawyers is complete with only an Index, and so this volume also includes a Table of Contributors, a Table of Cases, and a Table of Statutes, the last being an innovation for *The Law Quarterly Review*. In addition, a Table of Initials has been included. Despite a considerable amount of detective work (especially for the earlier years), it has not been possible to identify all the initials beyond a peradventure; but it is hoped that this new feature will make it possible to identify the great majority of authors who have signed their contributions only with their initials.
