## **PREFACE**

It was apparent several years ago that the widespread use of abbreviations in medical literature had reached a point where a handy source of reference had become a necessity. The original edition of this dictionary, the first of its kind in the field of medicine and the related sciences, was published in the United States in 1960 in the hope that it would fulfil that need and, at the same time, help to introduce a measure of standardization into an otherwise chaotic field. The success of that edition, and of its successor, has now led to the need for a third edition.

The scope of the dictionary has again been widened, and many more definitions have been added. My aim, as before, has been to include abbreviations that have come into common use in the medical sciences during the intervening years.

Full stops separating the letters have been omitted from entries in line with the current trend of writing abbreviations without stops, and to avoid duplication (and pontification) where both styles are employed. Abbreviations are given throughout the book in capitals except where common usage dictates the use of small letters. Where there is more than one way of abbreviating a term, no attempt has been made to state which is correct, but simply to list all forms likely to be encountered. Needless to say, wherever there is any possibility of confusion in the context, words should be spelled out in full. The use of italic has been reserved for translations of Latin terms defined in the dictionary.

I should like to thank those who have aided in the revision by calling attention to errors and suggesting new abbreviations to be listed; especially appreciated were the suggestions of Adam G. N. Moore of Aberdeen, Scotland. I am grateful also to the Upjohn Company, the Bronson Methodist Hospital, the Borgess Hospital and Western Michigan University, all of Kalamazoo, Michigan, and to the editorial staff of the F. A. Davis Company and my British publishers for their contributions and helpful suggestions.
