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Preface

Written in accordance with the latest Syllabus for Music (Forms 1-3) recommended by the Curriculum Development Council, the second edition of *The Rhythm of Music*, like the first edition, is a well-planned three-volume music textbook tailor-made for local junior secondary schools.

Built on the great success of the first edition, the second edition incorporates a large bulk of materials structured in a more logical and comprehensive way. The useful ingredients added in the book are as follows:

- 1. The musical concepts are further elaborated and explained in detail to facilitate students' apprehension of the fundamentals of music.
- 2. The songs are thoughtfully selected to complement the text. Many well-known songs with simplified rhythms and tunes from various parts of the world are added to replace some complicated classical songs in the old edition. The words of most songs are endued with enriched meaning and some of the English songs are translated into Chinese for better understanding.
- Listening sections including both listening appreciations and exercises are expanded and incorporated in each unit to enhance students' interest and appreciation of the subject.
- 4. Extensive and motivating exercises are included to reinforce students' grasp of the lessons.
- 5. A new section of singing practice is carefully designed for training students' voices and their sense of rhythm and pitch in relation to the subject taught.

The book is also well accompanied by the following teaching aids:

- 1. A set of CD with a collection of over one hundred well-known pieces of music is produced for the listening programmes.
- A comprehensive teacher's manual with supplementary materials and songs and model answers to the exercises is provided to facilitate teaching.

The whole book is lucidly presented using simple language, distinct layout and colourful and relevant illustrations. It is our aim that *The Rhythm of Music* can lead students into the wonderland of music.

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
- C & ¢ Time Signatures
- Slur & Tie

1.1 C & ¢ Time Signatures

The two time signatures, **C** and **C**, were originated in the Middle Ages. In those days, triple time was represented by 'O' (Complete) and duple or quadruple time by 'C' (Incomplete).

Nowadays, $\frac{4}{4}$ time is sometimes shown by the sign 'C', and $\frac{2}{2}$ time (often used in Church music) by the sign 'C'.

When crotchet beats () are too fast to beat comfortably, they may be replaced by minim beats () at half of the speed as shown in the diagram below.



The difference between $\frac{2}{2}$ time and $\frac{2}{4}$ time

Note: This song can be sung as a round or in two parts as follows.




Pay attention to the time signature of the song.

Unison - C Two-part - C



1.2 Slur & Tie

Slur(圓滑線)

- It is a curved line drawn above or below two or more notes to indicate that they should be sung or played smoothly.
- Refer to Michael, Row the Boat Ashore.

Tie (連結線)

- It is a curved line drawn above or below two notes of the same pitch to indicate that they should be sung or played as one.
- Refer to Shenandoah.



2.2 Music of the Romantic Period A.D.1800-1910 (浪漫派樂期)


Characteristics of the music in this period:

Major Composers of the Romantic Period





Schubert (舒伯特)

- Franz Peter Schubert (1797-1828) was a highly gifted Austrian composer of the Romantic period.
- He was born in a musical family in Vienna.
- His father was a schoolmaster who taught his son to play the violin and then handed him over to an elder brother for piano lessons.
- The amount of music he composed was remarkable (over 1,000 pieces) though he only lived for 31 years.
- He wrote more than 600 art songs, including three song cycles, and was known as the 'Father of Songs'.
- His important works include:

Songs - Hedge Rose, Ave Maria, The Lark, The Fair Maid of the Mill (song cycle).

Instrumental Music - The Unfinished Symphony, The Trout Quintet.



Listening Appreciation

Hedge Rose by Schubert. Linden Tree by Schubert.



Schubert wrote *Winter Journey* in 1827. It is a song cycle of 24 songs, and *Linden Tree* is the 5th song of it. It describes a lonely youth who has just started his journey and recalls the linden tree in his homeland. The melody is clear and pretty.
