INTRODUCTION

The Sixth Edition of the World Directory of Medical Schools lists institutions of undergraduate medical education in 127 countries or areas and gives a few pertinent facts about each. It also provides information on the conditions for obtaining the licence to practise medicine in 32 countries or areas that do not have medical schools. The information presented reflects the situation during the academic year 1983-1984, unless otherwise stated, and is based primarily on answers to questionnaires designed by the World Health Organization.

The individual entries were sent to the relevant governments for verification and approval before publication. At the time of going to press, some governments had not responded. It is, therefore, not possible to guarantee in all cases the complete accuracy of the information presented. The Division of Health Manpower Development, World Health Organization, 1211 Geneva 27, Switzerland, would appreciate notification of any errors or omissions.

For the first time, a systematic attempt was made to obtain information for inclusion in the *Directory* on the national regulations governing the licence to practise medicine and on the existence of bilateral or multilateral agreements relating to the mutual recognition of physicians' qualifications or experience. The information given on *Agreements with other countries* represents each national authority's understanding of the current situation vis-à-vis agreements with the other countries or areas it cites. Compatible information was not always provided by the authorities of the countries cited. Any additional information or corrections will be welcomed.

As the information included in the *Directory* must of necessity be restricted in scope, the name and address of the national licensing body or authority from whom further information can be obtained has been given for each country or area, when it is available.

Special attention is paid to whether the curriculum at each institution is relevant to the functions the newly graduated physician will be expected to carry out, in terms of the needs of the community and the emphasis placed on primary health care and training in the management of health services (see *Explanatory Notes* for column 4 below).

Explanatory Notes

The population figures were taken from the World Health Statistics Annual, 1985 and the number of physicians from the World Health Statistics Annual, 1983, unless information was supplied by the government itself.

The medical schools in each country are listed alphabetically (1) by city (except in the case of Brazil, Canada, China, India, Mexico, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and the United States of America, where they are listed first under the state, province, or republic, and then under the city; and the United Kingdom, which is subdivided into England and Wales, Northern Ireland, and Scotland); and (2) by institution.

The data pertaining to graduates refer to 1983 and those pertaining to teaching staff enrolment, and admissions, refer to the academic year 1983-1984, unless otherwise

indicated. These data were either submitted by the governments or obtained direct from the institutions themselves. Two dots (..) indicate that no information was available at the time of going to press and a dash (-) indicates "none". N/A stands for "not applicable" and appears against question (f) of Column 3 when the answer to question (d) is "no".

The following explanation, which deals with each column in the tables in turn, gives an indication of the symbols used and the system adopted in compiling the information provided:

Column 1 - Name and address

The names and addresses of the institutions are in the language of the country concerned, unless that language does not use the Roman alphabet. In that case an English or French version is given, depending on which of the two languages was used to answer the WHO questionnaires. Exceptions are the institutions in Japan and the USSR, whose names and addresses were transliterated, in the case of the latter in accordance with the system recommended by the International Organization for Standardization.

Column 2 - Year instruction started

The year in which medical education began at the institution; it does not necessarily correspond to the date of the founding of the institution.

Column 3 — Conditions of admission

Whether:

- (a) a degree or school certificate (e.g., B.A. or baccalauréat) is required;
- (b) the applicant is required to pass an entrance examination;
- (c) the applicant is required to pass a medical or physical examination;
- (d) foreign students are eligible for admission;
- (e) tuition is free of charge for national students;
- (f) tuition is free of charge for foreign students.

Column 4 — Curriculum

Whether:

- (a) the role and tasks of the physician in the community are defined, and used as a basis for curriculum planning;
- (b) the student has the opportunity to study the community health services (at a health centre or community clinic, or through home visits):
- (c) training includes community, social, and preventive medicine;
- (d) training includes the management of health services:
- (e) the primary health care approach is emphasized and/or the date it was introduced;
- (f) the student receives practical training in how to work as a team with members of other health professions.

Column 5-No. of hospital beds

The number of hospital beds available locally for teaching/learning purposes.

Column 6-No. of first-year admissions

The number of first-year students enrolled in the medical course for the academic year 1983-1984. Separate figures are given for national (N) male (m) and female (f) students and where appropriate for foreign (F) male and female students.

Column 7 -- Total enrolment

The total number of students enrolled at the medical school in all classes for the academic year 1983-1984, with the same subdivisions as in column 6.

Column 8-No. of graduates

The number of students awarded a medical degree or diploma in 1983, with the same subdivisions as in column 6.

Column 9-No. of teaching staff

The number of persons officially connected with the institution as teachers, regardless of faculty rank. An attempt is made to classify the teachers according to whether they work full time (ft) or part time (pt) at the institution.
