





HORSE RACING

Jockey Dies for Second Time

Staff and Wire Report

- Hall of Fame Jockey Ralph Neves, who died Friday in San Marcos (San Diego County) at the age of 78, was involved in one of the most bizarre incidents in racing history back in 1936.
- Neves was knocked unconscious in a fall and taken by ambulance to Peninsula Hospital. The emergency room doctor took one look at Neves and pronounced him dead. He instructed the ambulance driver to take the body to the mortuary.
- 3. Earlier that day, Neves had made arrangements to meet a doctor friend after the races for dinner. The doctor arrived late to the races and was told that Neves had been taken to the hospital. The doctor rushed off to the hospital and from there to the mortuary.
- 4. When the doctor arrived at the mortuary, he saw Neves's "body" lying there. One of his boots had been taken off and a tag was attached to his toe.

- The doctor, however, thought he saw some signs of life. Since he had his bag with him, he took out some adrenaline and gave Neves a shot.
- 5. The jockey suddenly sprang to life. He ran out of the mortuary with just one boot on, pursued by the doctor and the mortuary staff. He ran to the train station, hailed a cab and asked the cabdriver to take him back to the racetrack. When he arrived at the racetrack, he jumped out of the cab, ran around the jockey's room a couple of times, and then proceeded to run down the racetrack towards the place where he had fallen off the horse. Then he collapsed.
- When Neves came to, he remembered nothing of his adventure. However, he went on to complete a 30-year career, during which he rode 3,772 winners.

Co-workers discover that they're sisters

2 women worked together for 3 years before finding out

DAVENPORT, Iowa—Co-workers for three years, Joie Giese and Merrilee Woeber discovered that they share much more than a workplace—they are sisters separated by adoption 50 years ago.

"We're still shocked, we're still totally numb from it," Giese said Monday.

The two made the connection in May when a group of people at their workplace were discussing their origins. Someone suggested that Giese was Italian because of her olive skin.

"Not me. I was a Dunn," Giese replied. "I must be Irish."

Woeber, 50, responded that she was a Dunn as well and joked, "Maybe we're cousins." They laughed until Giese, who had been adopted, told Woeber that her birth mother's name was Lenore Dunn, the same name as Woeber's mother.

Their mother died in 1962, and Woeber's father died in 1974. Giese's father is listed as unknown on her adoption papers.

Records show that Woeber's father, Chester Anderson, was away in the military when Giese was born. Woeber was born 15 months later in 1947, the year Anderson and Lenore Dunn were married.

Giese learned her birth mother's name when she was given her adoption papers by her mother.

"She gave it to me when I was 18 in case I was ever interested in looking her up, but I never was."







