PREFACE

This book sets out to provide a useful directory to writers, reviewers, and citizens interested in the environmental impact statement (EIS) process in the United States. Although several "environmental" directories address a narrow portion of EIS subject matter, there is no single directory that covers the wide range of agencies and organizations involved in the EIS process. Therefore, the purpose of this directory is to bring EIS-related agencies and organizations into one comprehensive reference book.

EIS writing and reviewing can be improved by providing practioners with a directory that puts them quickly in touch with the national EIS network. At the present time, practioners must rely on their personal, and sometimes, limited network of agencies and organizations for the exchange of information. The EIS Directory quickly connects EIS-related agencies and organizations throughout the United States at the national, regional, state, and local levels.

The EIS Directory is a compilation of directories provided by members of the EIS community. A written survey of over five hundred agencies and organizations was made in 1980. The response to the survey provided a wide range of in-house directories. This book contains approximately 4,000 entries developed from over 300 documents.

This book was written in the hope that it will help people communicate more easily--ultimately improving the quality of EIS decision making. I realize the limitations of this initial edition and accept the challenge of providing a more effective reference tool in future editions.

Many people have contributed their time and energy to this project. My thanks go to Rick Thacker and Oscar Graham for reviewing portions of the manuscript. EXPLANATORY NOTES

DIRECTORY ORGANIZATION

This directory was designed to provide the user with two methods of locating entries: thematically and alphabetically. The thematic arrangement is divided into three broad classes: (A) General; (B) Physical; and (C) Cultural. These classes are further divided into fourteen EIS themes as follows:

- A. General
 - 1. General
 - 2. Legal

B. Physical

- 3. Air
- 4. Earth
- 5. Noise
- 6. Plant/Animal
- 7. Water

C. Cultural

- 8. Archaeology/History
- 9. Energy/Utilities
- 10. Health
- 11. Housing
- 12. Population
- 13. Recreation
- 14. Transportation

The thematic arrangement has been chosen because it provides the user with: (1) an opportunity to search for agencies and organizations with specific EIS themes; (2) an additional opportunity to search using an alphabetical index; and (3) a more accurate presentation of the theme-by-theme approach used in EIS analysis and review.

The second method of locating entries is alphabetical which lists all entries found in the thematic arrangement. Alphabetization throughout this

book is letter-by-letter. For example, Department of Commerce is followed by Department of the Army.

Key to Entry Organization

(1) Agency/Organization Name. In order to distinguish between governmental agencies and non-governmental organizations, the following rule has been followed: governmental agencies present only the first word of its name on the top line of the entry, while non-governmental organizations list the entire name on the top line of the entry. For example:

- (2) <u>Street Number/P.O. Box</u>. This includes all data identifying the location of the entry including building names and in-house addressing codes.
- (3) <u>City, State/Zip Code</u>. States follow the U.S. Postal two-letter state and territory abbreviations.
- (4) (Area Code) Telephone Number. In some cases, where the information is unavailable the general telephone number is listed rather than the specific telephone number of the EIS contact.
- (5) <u>EIS Contact</u>. This directory lists one contact person per entry. Attempts have been made to list the most appropriate person.
