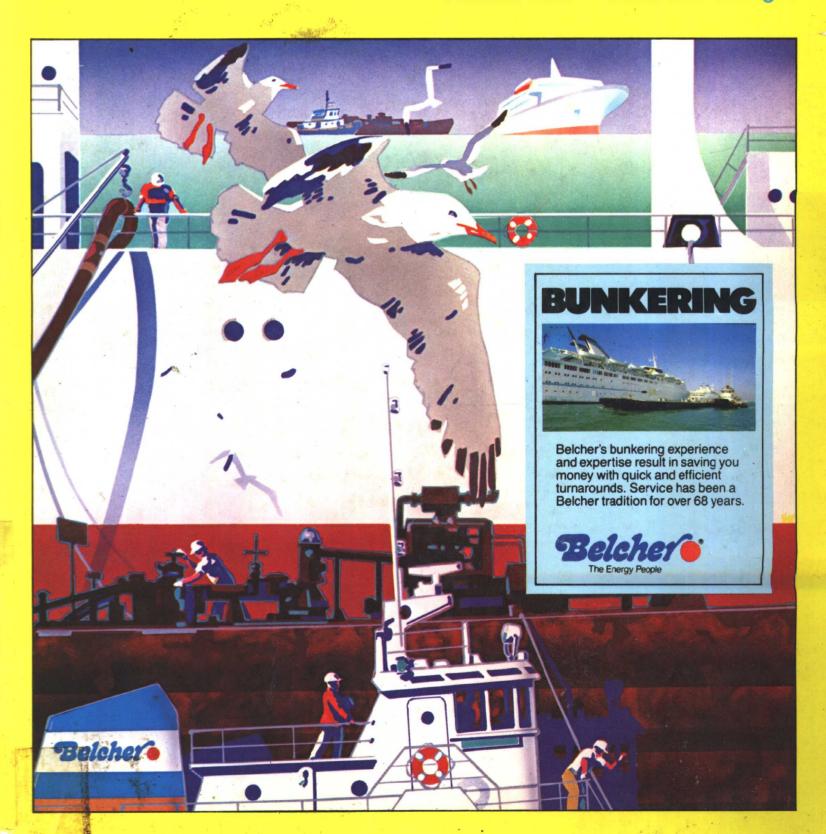

# **ALGERIA**

### Quay Dues per nrt

- 1. Ocean-going ships, D. A. 0.42 on entry and the same on departure.
- 2. Vessels engaged in international coasting (other than from Algeria), half the above rates.

### Notes:

These dues are not paid on entry by ships which have not unloaded goods or passengers.

They are not paid on departure by ships which do not load goods or passengers.

Ships making successive calls exclusively at Algerian ports are exempt.

Ships operating a regular passenger service may claim reductions to the above charges according to the number of sailings per month: 50 sailings per month, 50% reduction; 60 sailings 70% reduction; 90% reduction for 70 sailings.

Note:—2nd Class goods include anything not described as 1st Class. 1st Class goods are: Poles, logs, faggots, resinous wood uncut, pitprops, crude alunite, crude chalk, sand, gravel, broken stone, paving stones, unglazed bricks, building material, lime, cement, plaster, natural phosphates, ice, pyrites, mineral pitch, scrap iron, gas oil, and similar products.

### **Passenger Tax**

- Passengers embarking or disembarking, ocean-going ships: D.A.
   per cabin or stateroom passenger; D.A. 7 for 1st Class; D.A.
   for 2nd Class; D.A. 3 for 3rd and 4th Class.
- Passengers proceeding from or to ports within the limits of international coastal shipping: D.A. 5 cabin and stateroom; D.A. 3, 1st Class; D.A. 1, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Classes.

# **ANGOLA**

Light Dues. Esc. 0.70 per nrt

Customs Fees. Between Esc. 600 and Esc. 5,000 depending on time of arrival or sailing, cargo operations, and status of official.

Passengers and Baggage. Small charges are made for passengers embarking or disembarking and vary according to the class of passenger and nature of baggage handled.

# **ARGENTINA**

### **Port Operating Costs**

All tariffs are subject to frequent adjustments. It is not possible to give an accurate assessment.

# Agency Fees

For vessels which commence operations in Argentine ports as from March 1, 1983

### **General Conditions**

1. The scale of Agency fees for tramp vessels in Argentine ports is divided, by usage and custom in practice for many years, and covers the intervention of two or more shipagents. One of which acts a Custom-house Agent and the others as Confidential/Protecting Agents (for shipowners, time charterers etc.) and as Supervisory Agent, a category recently incorporated, following modern trends of international operations.

- 2. Custom-house Agents attend to the entrance, operations and clearance with all the intervening Argentine authorities, except in those cases which by their nature (smuggling, legal problems, collisions, accidents, etc.) it is more convenient for the matter to be attended to by the Confidential/Protecting Agents.
- 3. Confidential/Protecting Agents look after the ship's business relating to the crew, repairs, stores, certificates and watching over the interests entrusted to their care.
- 4. Supervisory Agents are those that intervene on behalf of a third party, and have nothing whatsoever to do with the work of the Custom-house Agents and/or Confidential/Protecting Agents.
- 5. In cases where an Agent must attend, or attends to the work of one of the others or of both of them (mentioned above), he is entitled to charge his Principals the fees applicable to each one, separately, plus the corresponding surcharges.
- In the case of ships loading and discharging separately or simultaneously, the Agent must charge separately for each operation.
- 7. Surcharges for delays and trips to the Roads fixed for Custom-house Agents, Confidential/Protecting Agents and Supervisory Agents will be collected separately, always provided the same Agent is not acting in a double or triple capacity, in which case the charge is to be applied only once.
- Additional services must in each case be charged to the ship when in overtime, in strict accordance with legal rules and regulations in force.
- Expenses incurred attending to the ship (for example, among others, transport fares, correspondence, communications, paper work, attentions, etc) will be charged in addition to the fees indicated in the present scale.
- Ports and/or anchorages, South of Bahia Blanca will have a surcharge of 30% on each item.
- 11. Any service not included in the present tariff is subject to special agreement between the parties.

### Important note

The provision of funds by the Principal to his Agent must be made in advance and be freely at his disposal, before the Agent begins his services. Local bank charges for remittances from or to abroad and to Agents in the interior, are for exclusive account of the Principal.

### **Custom House Agents**

- Dry bulk cargoes (coal, coke, bauxite, alumina, minerals and their by-products/derivatives, sugar, cereals and their by-products, including bagged cargo for safe stowage

- 7. For mixed shipments composed of cargoes at different rates, as above, the highest rate must be applied.
- 8. Lighterage and Transhipment Operations
  - (a) For lighterage or transhipment operations carried out at the first lighterage zone (Anchorage) with a maximum time of 4 days
  - (b) For lighterage or transhipment operations subsequently carried out at other lighterage zones (Anchorage) for each zone with a maximum time of 4 days

Additional charge for attendance in overtime hours, up to 2 hours \$745 per service.

Overtime hours are between 1600 and 0800. Monday to Friday and at any time on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays.

Use of tug's lines (at entire risk of vessel towed)-

Vessels under 12,000t—\$37 per service.

Vessels 12,000t & over-\$55 per service.

Wire tow ropes will not be used unless the risk of damage to the tug by so doing, is undertaken by the ship.

All work undertaken is subject to the United Kingdom Standard Conditions for Towage and Other Services (Revised 1974).

Towage rates are charged on the basis of the grt of a vessel as recorded in the current volume of Lloyds Register of Shipping.

In the case of a vessel having more than one registered gross tonnage, the towage rate applicable for the higher of the gross tonnage listed in Lloyds Register will be charged.

If the Port Authority for the purpose of levying tonnage rates and berthing charges, assess the gross tonnage to be the sum of the gross tonnage appearing in Lloyd's Register and any space not included in the gross tonnage, as so defined, which is occupied by goods, then the greater gross tonnage will be applicable when calculating the towage rate.

The Company reserves the right to make a charge when orders are changed or cancelled at any time.

All towage orders will be received and carried out to the best of the Company's ability.

The Company can accept no responsibility for delay to any vessel caused by detention of a tug by another vessel or from any other cause, or for failure of tug to attend at hour ordered on account of labour disputes of any kind whatsoever.

# Water

The charge for the supply of fresh water to vessels shall be-

(a) in ordinary hours \$1.50 per kilolitre.

(b) in overtime hours \$1.50 per kilolitre with operators time at cost.

# **Garbage Disposal Service**

Amendments to the Commonwealth Quarantine Regulation will require Masters of overseas vessels and prescribed Australian vessels to make all quarantinable refuse available for collection within 24hr of arrival and at regular intervals thereafter.

The waste disposal charges proposed would be calculated on the basis of number of persons on board at the time of arrival in port in accordance with the following scale.

(a) Not more than 20 persons—\$35 per day in port

(b) More than 20 persons less than 50—\$45 per day in port.
(c) More than 50 persons less than 150—\$50 per day in port.

(d) More than 150 persons—\$70 per day in port.

Charges apply irrespective of the quantity of refuse available for collection.

# **BRISBANE**

# PORT CHARGES

Most wharves in the Port of Brisbane are privately owned and each wharfinger sets his own rates. Only Pinkenba, Fisherman Islands and the Cairncross Dry Dock are operated by the Port of Brisbane Authority.

# Coastal Pilotage

The Queensland Coast & Torres Strait Pilot Service, licenced by the Marine Board of Queensland, will pilot vessels through the inner route which lies within the natural breakwater of the Great Barrier Reef

Because this is the shortest route from Eastern Australia to Indonesia and Asia, it ensures a considerable saving of time and fuel. Cost of the service varies according to distance and full particulars can be made available on request.

# Commonwealth Light Dues

49 cents per nrt, payable at first port of call and valid at all sub-sequent ports in Australia for a period of three months. Vessels calling for bunkers, provisions or refit only, as well as those in distances, are exempt from payment.

# State Light Dues (Conservancy Dues)

(a) Not more than 20 persons, \$35 per day in port.

An additional charge will be levied on the Pilot Launch of \$43.50 per service plus appropriate labour charge—this will also apply when a launch is used for running lines.

Tonnage Rates

1. Every vessel (not exempted by the Act) trading beyond the limits of a Port and which moors at or uses any wharf within a Port under the Board's jurisdiction, which has been constructed or maintained by the Board shall pay a rate of 30¢ per ton gross register for a period of three days or part thereof from the date of arrival in Port.

Provided that a charge of \$2400 shall be the max applicable to any vessel under this Section.

2. For any period exceeding such period of three days there shall

be payable the sum of 3.6¢ per ton gross register in respect of each 24 hrs or part thereof.

3. In the event of a vessel exceeding 4,000grt on any one visit to the Port, not discharging and/or loading cargo in excess of 200 tonnes, such vessel will only be liable for  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the above rates.

Service to Ships

- 1. The owner, master, or person in charge of every vessel (not exempt by the Act) shall pay to the Board the following set out charges each time it visits the Port of Devonport, calculated according to the gross registered tonnage of the vessel: 5¢ per ton with a max payment for any visit of \$230.
- 2. Notwithstanding the rate prescribed in Clause 1, vessels not more than 400grt trading Intra-state shall pay a "Service Charge" of \$20 per visit to the Port.
- 3. In consideration of payments prescribed in Clause 1, the Board shall provide the following facilities and services:

(a) Cleaning services for all wharves and sheds;

- (b) Facilities for water supplies and labour for necessary connection of supply (water supplies shall be a separate charge);
- (c) Facilities for provision of power, telephone services and labour for necessary connections (actual consumed service to be a separate charge);
- (d) Facilities for provision of lights to provide reasonable lighting of wharves and shed spaces;
- (e) Facilities for provision of ship to shore radio and labour involved in listening out;
- (f) Patrol Servicemen to watch wharf areas and cargo lying in sheds and wharf area;
- (g) Provision of facilities associated with security and fire protection and extinguishment in and around cargo assembly areas:
- (h) Provision of facilities associated with port amenities and first aid and the promotion of safety activities within the port area;
- (i) Provision of facilities associated with providing removal and disposal of any ship's refuse as requested by any vessel mooring in the port and paying this service charge.
- 4. (i) When the service for mooring and unmooring of vessels rendered by providing linesmen, a charge equal to the appropriate labour cost expended shall be rendered.
  - (ii) When the service for running of mooring lines by launch is required a charge shall be made as determined from time to time by the Board.
  - (iii) Cancellation or alteration to a vessel's ETA or ETD at weekends and outside ordinary working hours which involves penalty clauses in any Award or Agreement affecting the Board, an additional charge will be incurred amounting to the labour cost involved.

All charges are for fair weather, are applicable to one tug boat, and are for assistance to vessels having full use of main engines, afloat, and in no way disabled, and are exclusive of the use of hawsers which must be supplied by the ship being towed.

Wire tow-ropes will not be used unless the risk of life or lives or damage to the tug by so doing is undertaken by the ship.

The towage contract is not to prejudice any claims the tug owners may have to salvage remuneration for any extraordinary services that may be rendered to the ship or cargo, from or arising out of circumstances not existing contemplated at the time of making the contract.

The rates herein stated to not apply to salvage services, nor to claims for or in the nature of a salvage.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the Board may enter into any particular contract for towage upon such terms and conditions as it may see fit.

Conditions of Towage-All tugs from the Board for the towing of the vessels shall if no particular contract shall be entered into in respect to such hiring be deemed to be subject to the Standard Towage Conditions as recommended by the "Chamber of Shipping of the United Kingdom", which is available for perusal at the Board's Offices.

Special Pilotage Services

The charge for special services such as swinging or manoeuvring a ship for compass adjustment, conducting a ship on a trial run after engine or other repairs, or for any other service not elsewhere provided for, shall be at the rate of \$80 per hour, with a min charge of \$160 for a service within the Inner Harbour, or \$320 for a service within the Outer Harbour; provided in the latter case that, should the service involve removing the ship from the Inner Harbour and/or vice versa, the charges prescribed in Regulation 103 shall be payable in addition to the charge for the special service.

Detention of Pilots

Where a pilot attends a ship in accordance with an application as prescribed in Regulation 105 of these Regulations and, his services not then being required, is ordered for a later hour, a special charge of \$80 shall be payable for each attendance.

In the event of a pilot being detained at a ship until such ship is ready to leave the berth, a special charge of \$70 for each half hour or portion thereof after the first half hour, shall be payable.

Where a pilot attends a ship in accordance with an application to conduct the ship over the pilotage area between the sea pilot boarding ground and Gage Roads and such ship does not arrive at the boarding ground at the time given, and the pilot is required to await the arrival of the ship, detention of the pilot and the pilot launch shall be payable at the rate of \$220 per hour, or part thereof after the first hour for the period of such detention.

# **Tonnage Rates**

General Rates Payable

The tonnage rates payable shall be assessed at one and thirty one-hundredths of a cent (1.30 ¢) for each ton of the registered tonnage of a ship for each 6 hrs or part thereof during which a ship occupies a berth, and the min charge for each entry into the Port shall be as for 24 hrs.

Should a ship occupy more than one berth, the tonnage rates shall be based on the aggregate of the periods during which berths have been occupied, and where such aggregate is less than 24 hrs, a min charge as for 24 hrs shall be payable.

The tonnage rates payable for ships occupying a berth in the Outer Harbour only, other than a jetty, as prescribed in Regulation 126(c) of these regulations, shall be assessed at sixty-five one-hundredths of a cent (0.65 ¢) for each ton of the registered tonnage of the ship. Subject to the provisions of Regulations 124 and 129 of these regulations and notwithstanding any other provision in these regulations, the min charge for the entry of any vessel into the Port shall be the sum of \$65.

Rebates

Provision is made for rebates of tonnage rates under certain conditions. An outline of the principal rebates is as follows:

Ships berthed within the Inner Harbour in distress may be granted a rebate of 75% for a period not exceeding one week.

Ships berthed within the Inner Harbour for fitting or re-fitting, for repairs, or under duress may be granted a rebate of 50% for a period not exceeding one week.

Ships berthed within the Inner Harbour for orders or supplies, including bunkers for own use, may be granted a rebate of 50% for a period not exceeding 24 hrs.
