INTRODUCTORY DISCUSSION

The *Index of Economic Articles* has been continued after a lapse of some years with Volumes XI–XV, 1969–72, which are all scheduled to appear in 1976. It is linked to the earlier volumes, I–X, in scope and content. The actual classification system, however, differs and is coordinated with the system developed by the American Economic Association Classification Committee in 1967 and used in the sections in the *Journal of Economic Literature* relating to articles and books and in the field of specialization classifications in the *American Economic Association Directory*.

Scope

This volume of the *Index* lists, both by subject category and by author, articles in major economic journals and in collective volumes published during the year 1969. It also includes articles or testimony from selected congressional committee hearings or prints published in 1969. The articles listed include all articles published in English or with English summaries in the journals and books listed below (p. xi).

Relationship to JEL

This *Index* is prepared largely as an adjunct to the bibliographic activities of the *Journal of Economic Literature* (*JEL*). Economies of joint production are pursued throughout the production process. Journals included are those indexed in the *JEL* quarterly; collective volumes are selected from the annotated 1969 books; the classification system is a more detailed version of the *JEL* system.

The joint production process involved computerization of the article citations, for use both in *JEL* and in the *Index*. The data-base article citations are then run through various programs. The resultant gains from a reduction in production costs involve some small losses in flexibility in arrangement and data inclusion as well as some relatively small losses with regard to proofreading and classification.

Articles without individual author(s) are omitted, except in the documents part. Relevant testimony or reports to congressional committees written by an organization are presented under that name.

Journals Included

The 182 journals listed are drawn from 220 journals representing, in general, those journals that we believe will be most helpful to research workers and teachers of economics. These journals are listed below on p. xi. The coverage is more extensive than previous volumes of the *Index of Economic Articles*, although some foreign journals included therein have been omitted.

Generally, articles, notes, communications, comments, replies, rejoinders, as well as papers and formal discussions in proceedings and review articles in the included journals have been indexed. There are some exceptions; only articles in English or with English summaries are included—this practice results in a slightly reduced coverage compared with the *JEL* quarterly. For example, articles in foreign languages are indexed in the quarterly from any journal where we regularly print English abstracts; also in some years, available foreign language skills permitted classification of such articles. Articles lacking author identification are omitted, as are articles without economic content. Identical articles appearing in two different journals in 1969 are listed from both sources.

The journal issues included are those for 1969, usually falling within a single volume. When a volume of a journal overlaps two calendar years, for example, Fall 1968 to Summer 1969, we include the issues from the two volumes relating to 1969 as best we can determine. As will be noted in the journal listings, there are a few instances where issues of journals are not included because they had not been received at the *JEL* office despite repeated requests.

Collective Volumes

The collective volumes consist of the following:

1. *Festschriften*
2. Conference publications with individual papers
3. Collected essays, original, by one or more authors
4. Collected essays, reprinted, by one or more authors
5. Proceedings volumes with individual papers not included among the journal listings
6. Books of readings

All original articles in English are indexed with the exception of unsigned articles or articles without economic content. Reprinted articles are included if they have not been indexed in the volumes of the *Index of Economic Journals* or the *Index of Economic Articles* covering the period from 1950 on, that is in Volumes IV to X.

The rule of thumb followed for the inclusion of excerpts from printed articles or books is that the excerpt should represent a substantial portion of the article or of a chapter of a book. The same article or excerpt appearing for the first time in different collective volumes in the same year is cited from both publications.

In the article citation, reference to the book in which the article appeared is by author or editor of the volume. If the same person or persons wrote or edited more than one book included in the 1969 *Index*, it is indicated by a I or II appearing immediately after the name in both the source given in the article citation and the bibliographic reference in the book listing. If the same person wrote one book and edited another in 1969, the inclusion of editor in the reference indicates which book is being cited.

The collective volumes are listed alphabetically by author or editor on pp. xvi with a full bibliographic reference. If there is more than one edition, the publisher cited is the one on the copy the *JEL* received, usually from the American publisher.

Material with economic content, including studies, submissions, and testimony before congressional committees and committee prints, were indexed. In general these were statements and submissions by economists. In some cases, they represent statements by an organization or a government department or organization. In a departure from our procedure with articles in books and journals, these statements, even when lacking identification of individual author(s), are also included.

The following abbreviations were used in the indexed materials to indicate the document:

Government documents are listed on pp. xxiv. They are arranged by Committee, Hearings and Prints, and then alphabetically by title.

Arrangement

The Index consists of two parts:

1. A Subject Index in which the articles are arranged by subject according to the detailed classification system developed by the *JEL* staff from the American Economic Association Classification Committee systems.
2. An Author Index.

Subject Index

All articles are listed alphabetically under each 4-digit category. The entries are arranged alphabetically, first by author and then under particular authors by title. Since the sort is by computer and the number of programs was constrained by cost compared to frequency of usage, Part II of a two-part article may appear before Part I, or a reply to a comment before the article in question. If an article is written by more than one author, up to three authors are listed; beyond that, only the first author and the term, *et al.*

There is one exception to the alphabetical author arrangement. In the 0322 category, a subdivision of **History of Thought** entitled **Individuals**, the arrangement is first alphabetical by the individual discussed in the article and then alphabetically by the article's author.

Articles with empirical content or discussing a particular geographic area carry a geographic descriptor (see discussion below). Articles listed under subject category 1230, **Comparative Economics Studies** . . . , involve several countries. Since the number of geographic descriptors in the program is limited to five, the subject category often serves as a substitute for selecting individual countries, and these articles may carry no geographic descriptors. All articles under this category involve some empirical content.

Author Index

The Author Index is arranged alphabetically. Wherever possible the full first names and middle initial or middle name(s) are used. Wherever it could be definitely ascertained, articles by the same person were grouped together with only one listing of the name and/or initial. Authors' first names and initials are listed differently in various journals and books; for example, an individual may be identified as John L. Smith, J. L. Smith, or John Smith. Thus, despite our best efforts, we were left in doubt in several instances. Joint authors are listed up to three; beyond that, only the first author is listed, followed by *et al.* Articles by joint authors appear more than once, listed under the name of each of its authors, unless it is an *et al.* grouping. Under each author, articles are listed alphabetically.

cally. Prefix names are alphabetized according to the first *capitalized* letter. Thus, van Arkadie appears under A and D'Alabro under D.

Geographic Descriptors

Geographic descriptors appear in brackets at the end of any article entry where the article cites data from a particular country or area or refers to a specific geographic area. Research workers interested in these countries thus are made aware of the empirical content in the article. The descriptors used are countries or broader areas, such as southeast Asia (S.E. Asia); articles referring to cities or regions within a country are classified under the country. In general, the country name is written out in full with some adaptations and abbreviations, *e.g.*, U.S. is used for United States, U.K. for United Kingdom, and U.S.S.R. for Union of Soviet Socialist Republics. Abbreviations include: W. for West, E. for East, S. for South, N. for North. A shortened name such as W. Germany is used rather than the correct, but longer, Federal Republic of Germany. When broader regions are used as descriptors, the article may or may not refer to the full unit. For example, O.E.C.D. has been used at times when most, but not all, of the O.E.C.D. member countries are referred to. E.E.C. has been used at times to refer to the six and at times to the nine constituent countries.

The fact that an article carries a geographic descriptor does not necessarily preclude its being primarily theoretical in nature. Any theoretical article drawing on empirical data to demonstrate its findings will carry a geographic descriptor.

Classification System

The classification system is an expansion of the 3-digit classification system with approximately 100 subcategories used in the *Journal of Economic Literature* to a 4-digit system with approximately 300 subcategories. The classification system, itself, is shown on p. xxviii. In most cases the classification heading is self-explanatory; however, in some cases notes have been added to explain where related topics are classified. The basic approach in classification is from the point of view of the researcher rather than from the teacher. Course content does not necessarily coincide with subfields of our classification system. In all cases where there are two or more 4-digit classifications under a 3-digit category, there is a zero classification; in most instances this is labeled "General." The zero or general category has been used both as an inclusive and a residual category; thus, when the subject matter of an article covers all or most of the subcategories, that article appears in the zero or general category. For example, an article discussing *all* aspects of international trade theory appears in the general category. There are also some articles that do not fall in any of the individual subcategories, and these, too, are classified in the general or zero category.

The criterion used in the classifying process is whether a person interested in this topic would wish to have the article drawn to their attention. Slightly over half of the articles are classified in more than one subcategory.

Topical Guide to the Classification System

At the back of this book there is an alphabetical listing of standard economic terms and concepts. References are to the appropriate 4-digit classification numbers, not to page numbers.
