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Massimo Vignelli

Massimo Vignelli was born in Milan in 1931 and studied at the Brera Academy of Art, Milan, and the School of Architecture, University of Venice.

He has been a member of the Italian Association for Industrial Design (ADI) since its founding in 1956, and served on the Board of Directors from 1960 to 1964.

He is a member of the American Institute of Graphic Arts.
In 1967 he was elected a member of the Alliance Graphique
Internationale.

From 1961 to 1965 he was a member of the Study Group of the International Council of Societies of Industrial Design (ICSID), and in 1976-77 served as President of the American Institute of Graphic Arts. Currently he is Vice-President of the Architectural League of New York (since 1973) and a Trustee of the Institute for Architecture and Urban Studies.

Mr. Vignelli has taught at the Institute of Design, Illinois Institute of Technology, Chicago (1958-59); the Design Schools of Milan (1960-64) and Venice (1962-64); the School of Architecture, Columbia University, New York (1967-68); the Philadelphia College of Art (1969); and the Parsons School of Design, New York (1980-81). In 1977 he was Andrew Mellon Visiting Professor at The Cooper Union in New York. Mr. Vignelli has lectured on design in the major cities and universities in the United States as well as in Peking and Shanghai in China.

His awards include the Towle Silversmiths Fellowship in 1957 for product design, and the Compasso d'Oro and the Grand Prix Triennale di Milano for Graphic Design in 1964.

Examples of his graphic and product design are in the permanent collection of the Museum of Modern Art, New York, and a traveling exhibition of his work was organized by the Museum.

In 1960, with his wife Lella, he established the Lella and Massimo Vignelli Office of Design and Architecture in Milan, working in graphics, products, furniture, and interiors for major European companies and institutions.

In 1965 Mr. Vignelli co-founded Unimark International, Corporation for Design and Marketing, of which he was Director and Senior Vice-President for Design.

In 1971 the Vignellis established Vignelli Associates, with an office in New York and liaison offices in Paris and Milan. Mr. Vignelli is President of Vignelli Associates.

In 1978 the Vignellis formed Vignelli Designs, a branch of their organization involved in industrial design.

Their work is represented in many significant design magazines and books in the United States and abroad, and examples of their work have been exhibited in numerous museums, among them: the Museum of Modern Art in New York, the Forth Worth Art Museum, the Corning Glass Museum, the Israel Museum in Jerusalem, the Cooper-Hewitt Museum in New York, and the Renwick Gallery in Washington. Comprehensive shows of their work have been held in Boston, at the Institute for Architecture and Urban Studies in New York, the Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles, the Kansas City Art Institute, the Parsons School of Design in New York, and the Padiglione d'Arte Contemporanea in Milan, Italy.

Lella and Massimo Vignelli were awarded the 1973 Industrial Arts Medal by the American Institute of Architects.
