PREFACE

Research is a major force in the nursing profession that is used to change practice, education, and health policy. Our aim in developing the sixth edition of *The Practice of Nursing Research: Appraisal, Synthesis, and Generation of Evidence* is to increase excitement about research and to facilitate the development of evidence-based practice for nursing. It is critically important that all nurses, especially those in advanced-practice roles (nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, nurse anesthetists, and nurse midwives), have an understanding of research and its link to the development of evidence-based practice. Nurses will have a significant role in providing evidence-based care and promoting quality, cost-effective healthcare outcomes for patients and families. Doctoral students might use this text to facilitate their development of research evidence through their dissertations.

The depth and breadth of content presented in this edition reflect the increase in research activities and the growth in research knowledge since the previous edition. Nursing research is introduced at the baccalaureate level and becomes an integral part of graduate education (master's and doctoral) and clinical practice. We hope that this new edition might increase the number of nurses at all levels involved in research activities such as critically appraising studies; using evidence-based guidelines in practice; and conducting quantitative, qualitative, outcome, and intervention research.

NEW CONTENT

The sixth edition provides comprehensive coverage of nursing research and is focused on the learning needs and styles of today's nursing student and practicing nurse. Several exciting, new areas of content are included in the sixth edition:

- Chapter 1, *Discovering the World of Nursing Research*, includes major revisions, with a model of the elements of evidence-based practice (EBP). This EBP model is linked to the framework for the textbook and stresses the significance of research in developing EBP.
- Chapter 2, *The Evolution of Evidence-Based Practice in Nursing*, is retitled and focused on building an EBP for nursing. This chapter includes the historical development of EBP in health care

and methodologies for developing an EBP in nursing. In addition, the reader is introduced to the best research evidence for practice that is provided by systematic reviews, meta-analyses, integrative reviews, metasummaries, and metasyntheses. The chapter includes a table that presents the purposes of these syntheses, the types of research included in these syntheses (the "sampling frame"), and the analysis for achieving the different types of syntheses. A model of the continuum of the levels of research evidence, from strongest to weakest evidence, is now provided.

- Chapter 4, *Introduction to Qualitative Research*, includes an introduction to and the philosophical bases for the following types of qualitative research: (1) phenomenology, (2) grounded theory, (3) ethnography, (4) historical research, (5) philosophical inquiry, and (6) critical social theory research, including feminist research.
- Chapter 6, *Review of Relevant Literature*, includes an expanded discussion of the processes for searching the literature for relevant sources. Details are provided for using state-of-the-art resources for conducting systematic reviews, integrative reviews, meta-analyses, and metasyntheses to determine the best research evidence for practice.
- Chapter 9, *Ethics in Research*, features updated coverage of (1) the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), (2) U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) regulations for protection of human subjects in research, and (3) Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations for protection of human research subjects. The chapter also discusses how changes in the laws have affected nursing research, with an expanded focus on the ethics of conducting qualitative studies and the processes for protecting participants in these studies.
- Chapter 11, *Selecting a Quantitative Research Design*, includes many currently used designs that are not covered in other leading texts but that are important to understand.
- Chapter 12, *Outcomes Research*, a unique feature of our text, was significantly rewritten to promote understanding of the history, significance, and impact of outcomes research on nursing

and health care, for both students and nurses in clinical practice. New content is included on nursing-sensitive patient outcomes, advanced-practice nursing outcomes, and practice-based research networks. In addition, the methodologies for conducting outcomes research have been expanded.

- Chapter 13, *Intervention Research*, reflects the increasing number of intervention studies being done in nursing and is also a unique feature of our text.
- Chapter 14, *Sampling*, now includes extensive coverage of sampling methods and sample sizes for qualitative research. New content in this chapter includes the formulas for calculating the acceptance and refusal rates for potential subjects and the retention and attrition rates for subjects participating in a study. Additional content is included to assist researchers in recruiting and retaining subjects for their studies.
- Chapter 15, *Measurement Concepts*, features detailed coverage of measurement in conducting qualitative studies and measuring outcomes of healthcare. New content included in this chapter is the use of sensitivity, specificity, and likelihood ratios to determine the quality of diagnostic tests. Understanding these concepts is important in delivering EBP.
- Chapter 16, *Measurement Methods Used in Developing Evidence for Practice*, provides more detail on the use of physiological measurement methods in research. An increasing number of nursing studies are focused on the measurement of the outcomes from interventions using physiological measurement methods, and this chapter equips the reader to understand and take part in those studies.
- Chapter 17, *Collecting and Managing Data*, now covers the importance of intervention fidelity and quality measurement in conducting the high-quality quasi-experimental and experimental studies needed to generate research evidence about the effectiveness of nursing interventions for practice.
- Chapter 23, *Qualitative Research Methodology*, has been completely reorganized to facilitate understanding of the conduct of qualitative research. The chapter features a marked increase in the examples from current qualitative studies.
- Chapter 25, *Disseminating Research Findings*, features expanded and updated content on communicating study findings through presentation and publication.
- Chapter 26, *Critical Appraisal of Nursing Studies*, now includes the concept of critical appraisal instead of critique. The critical appraisal processes for quantitative and qualitative studies to build an EBP for nursing are detailed.
- Chapter 27, *Strategies for Promoting Evidence-Based Nursing Practice*, has undergone extensive revision to achieve a completely new focus on evidence-based practice. The chapter now includes a discussion of the strengths and concerns related to evidence-based practice, guidelines for critically appraising systematic reviews, guidelines for critically appraising and conducting meta-analyses, and guidelines for critically appraising and conducting integrative reviews. Stetler's Model of Research Utilization to Facilitate Evidence-Based Practice and the Iowa Model of Evidence-Based Practice to Promote Quality of Care are presented to direct nurses in making evidence-based changes in their practice. The Grove Model for implementing national standardized guidelines in practice is described with the JNC VII used as an example for treating hypertension. Internet sites that include best research evidence for practice are identified. Finally, Evidence-Based Practice Centers and their contributions to evidence-based practice are described.

The sixth edition is written and organized to facilitate ease in reading, understanding, and implementing the research process. The major strengths of this text include the following:

- State-of-the-art coverage of EBP—a topic of vital and growing importance in a health care arena focused on quality and cost-effectiveness of patient care.
- A clear, concise writing style that is consistent among the chapters to facilitate student learning.
- Comprehensive coverage of quantitative, qualitative, outcomes, and intervention research techniques.
- A balanced coverage of qualitative and quantitative research methodologies.
- Electronic references and websites that direct the student to an extensive array of information that is important for conducting studies and using research findings in practice.
- Rich and frequent illustration of major points and concepts from the most current nursing research literature from a variety of clinical practices areas.
- A strong conceptual framework that links nursing research with EBP, theory, knowledge, and philosophy.

Our text provides a comprehensive introduction to nursing research for graduate and practicing nurses. At the master's and doctoral level, the text provides not only substantive content related to research but also practical applications based on the authors' experiences in conducting various types of nursing research, familiarity with the research literature, and experience in teaching nursing research at various educational levels.

The sixth edition of this text is organized into 4 units and 29 chapters. Unit One introduces the reader to the world of nursing research. The content and presentation of this unit have been designed to introduce EBP and to assist the reader in overcoming the barriers frequently experienced in understanding the language used in nursing research.

Unit Two provides an in-depth presentation of the research process for both quantitative and qualitative research. As with previous editions, this text provides extensive coverage of the many types of quantitative and qualitative research.

Unit Three addresses the implications of research for the discipline and profession of nursing. Content is provided to direct the student in conducting critical appraisals of both quantitative and qualitative research. A detailed discussion of EBP is provided, with models to direct nurses in providing evidence-based health care. Nursing and medical practice guidelines are included and provide essential direction for implementing evidence-based advanced nursing practice roles, such as nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist, nurse anesthetist, and nurse midwife.

Unit Four addresses seeking support for research. Readers are given direction for developing quantitative and qualitative research proposals and seeking funding for their research.

The changes in the sixth edition of this text reflect the advances in nursing research and also incorporate comments from outside reviewers, colleagues, and students. Our desire to promote the continuing development of the profession of nursing was the incentive for investing the time and energy required to develop this new edition.
