



European Commission Decisions on Competition provides a comprehensive economic classification and analysis of all European Commission decisions adopted pursuant to Articles 101, 102, and 106 of the FEU Treaty from 1962 to 2009. It also includes a sample of landmark European merger cases. The decisions are organized according to the principal economic theory applied in the case. For each economic category, the seminal Commission decision that became a reference point for that type of anticompetitive behavior is described. For this, a fixed template format is used throughout the book. All subsequent decisions in which the same economic principle was applied are listed chronologically. This book complements the most widely used textbooks in industrial organization, competition economics, and competition law to which detailed references are offered. It contains source material for teachers, students, and scholars of competition law and economics, as well as practising competition lawyers and officials.

FRANCESCO RUSSO works as a competition lawyer at Bonelli Erede Pappalardo and is a member of the Italian Bar. He is a visiting researcher at the Amsterdam Center for Law and Economics (ACLE).

FEU Treaty provisions on competition

Article 101

- 1. The following shall be prohibited as incompatible with the common market: all agreements between undertakings, decisions by associations of undertakings and concerted practices which may affect trade between Member States and which have as their object or effect the prevention, restriction or distortion of competition within the common market, and in particular those which:
 - (a) directly or indirectly fix purchase or selling prices or any other trading conditions:
 - (b) limit or control production, markets, technical development, or investment;
 - (c) share markets or sources of supply;
 - (d) apply dissimilar conditions to equivalent transactions with other trading parties, thereby placing them at a competitive disadvantage;
 - (e) make the conclusion of contracts subject to acceptance by the other parties of supplementary obligations which, by their nature or according to commercial usage, have no connection with the subject of such contracts.
- 2. Any agreements or decisions prohibited pursuant to this article shall be automatically void.
- 3. The provisions of paragraph 1 may, however, be declared inapplicable in the case of:
 - any agreement or category of agreements between undertakings,
 - any decision or category of decisions by associations of undertakings,
 - any concerted practice or category of concerted practices,

which contributes to improving the production or distribution of goods or to promoting technical or economic progress, while allowing consumers a fair share of the resulting benefit, and which does not:

- (a) impose on the undertakings concerned restrictions which are not indispensable to the attainment of these objectives;
- (b) afford such undertakings the possibility of eliminating competition in respect of a substantial part of the products in question.

Article 102

Any abuse by one or more undertakings of a dominant position within the common market or in a substantial part of it shall be prohibited as incompatible with the common market in so far as it may affect trade between Member States.

Such abuse may, in particular, consist in:

- (a) directly or indirectly imposing unfair purchase or selling prices or other unfair trading conditions;
- (b) limiting production, markets or technical development to the prejudice of consumers;
- (c) applying dissimilar conditions to equivalent transactions with other trading parties, thereby placing them at a competitive disadvantage;

(d) making the conclusion of contracts subject to acceptance by the other parties of supplementary obligations which, by their nature or according to commercial usage, have no connection with the subject of such contracts.

Article 106

- In the case of public undertakings and undertakings to which Member States grant special or exclusive rights, Member States shall neither enact nor maintain in force any measure contrary to the rules contained in this Treaty, in particular to those rules provided for in Article 18 and Articles 101 to 109.
- 2. Undertakings entrusted with the operation of services of general economic interest or having the character of a revenue-producing monopoly shall be subject to the rules contained in this Treaty, in particular to the rules on competition, in so far as the application of such rules does not obstruct the performance, in law or in fact, of the particular tasks assigned to them. The development of trade must not be affected to such an extent as would be contrary to the interests of the Community.
- 3. The Commission shall ensure the application of the provisions of this Article and shall, where necessary, address appropriate directives or decisions to Member States.

Table of equivalences

The article numbering of the Treaty (now Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, FEU Treaty) has recently been subject to a comprehensive renumeration by the Treaty of Lisbon, entered into force on 1 December 2009. It had previously been already renumbered by the Treaty of Amsterdam, entered into force on 1 May 1999. Therefore, over time, the Commission has been using different numbering. It is important to have that in mind when reading the decisions as well as the other documents referring to the articles of the Treaty in order to not be confused.

In the book the old numbering is maintained only within the quoting of a Commission decision. Otherwise, even if describing older cases the new numbering is used.

Acknowledgments

This book is the fruit of a long process, with inputs by many. The idea to disclose the content of the rich publications by the European Commission on its competition decisions in the *Official Journal of the European Union* (OJ) for use in teaching was originally Stephen Martin's. In the period he taught at the University of Amsterdam (January 2000 to June 2002) he initiated the collecting of OJ publications on Commission decisions that made interesting case material in an applied industrial organization (IO) course. The project was structurally sponsored for several years by the Economics Network for Competition and Regulation (ENCORE), then directed by Jeroen Hinloopen and Jules Theeuwes.

At the end of 2005, the project was redirected and combined with the ongoing joint research that three of us, Maarten Pieter, Martin, and Andrea, had started earlier, in 2001, at Maastricht University. In that project, sponsored by METEOR, the research school of the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration of Maastricht University, all Commission decisions since 1957 on antitrust were consistently cataloged in a large data set to be disclosed for quantitative analysis. This allowed for a consistent identification of "landmark cases from an economic point of view."

Further support from ENCORE from 2006 onwards helped finance Francesco's full-time engagement in the project. His involvement in the editing of the second edition of Floris Vogelaar's *The European Commission Rules: Landmark Cases of the European Courts and the Commission* created fruitful synergies. Meanwhile, Jeroen Hinloopen and Jules Theeuwes endorsed the project with further advisory input on economics. Floris Vogelaar advised on aspects of European competition law.

The extensive data set on EU competition decisions – which also served as a basis for the survey statistics presented in the introductory chapter of the book – was continuously cleaned up and perfected in order to be complete and correct on all selected cases. We developed a template format according to which we describe all the cases that were identified as "landmark" in the sense of establishing the application of a specific economic theory for the first time in an EU decision. Completion required another two years of continuous work and further financial support from the Amsterdam Center for Law and Economics (ACLE).

The book classifies all the formal antitrust decisions of the European Commission. It is a short history of half a century of European competition law enforcement. The collection of formal decisions is complete up to and including December 2009. The book is intended for intensive use by the competition policy community: teachers in competition law and industrial organization, as well as scholars, practitioners in the competition authorities, companies and their advisors, economic consultants, and legal counsel.

Apart from the people already mentioned above, we are indebted to Jakob Rüggeberg and Marie Goppelsröder for painstakingly editing early versions of the manuscript. Joris Bijvoet and Norman Bremer worked on the case data file, in particular on appeals revisions. Yevgeniy Stotyka, Ivana Sucur, and Charlotte Heilmann assisted in the collection of materials and description of
