TWO-SEMESTER SEQUENCE SYLLABI

ONE-SEMESTER COURSE SYLLABUS

Intermediate Accounting: This syllabus is prepared on the assumption that only one semester is available to cover Intermediate Accounting. In devising such a course, it is necessary that a number of topics be omitted or only partially discussed. It has also been assumed that a conceptual orientation must be given in such a course and therefore the use of case material from the textbook is emphasized. This syllabus is designed for three one-hour sessions per week, and forty-two sessions in total. In addition, three examinations are scheduled. No appendices are covered. Four micro computer assignments using Lotus 1-2-3 are made. (FRP = Financial Reporting Problem; WA = Writing Assignment; GA = Group Assignment; EC = Ethics Case.)
