

Preface

Courses on the legal and regulatory environment of business provide important background for students preparing for a variety of careers. One faces legal, social, political, and ethical issues in any profession. Most are simple situations, which can be handled with common sense, but in many situations ignorance of the principles of business and law can result in problems.

This textbook presents the legal environment from the perspective of the professional non-lawyer. Few students who take this course will become lawyers, and most will not take additional courses in law. This course offers the opportunity to learn key points of the law from the standpoint of a working professional.

We have received excellent feedback from professors and students who have used the seven previous editions of this book and have pointed out both its shortcomings and its strong points. We have taken these comments into account in preparing this edition to make the book even more helpful and practical as we study the complex legal environment that businesses face in an increasingly international setting.

♦ Basic Organization

A one-semester course in the legal environment of business faces the problem of determining what to cover in such a short time. It is like a physician giving a one-semester course to teach students what they need to know about medicine—so many topics, so little time. There is agreement that the key elements of the legal system must be covered. This is done in Part One of the book, Elements of Law and the Judicial Process. Part Two, Elements of Traditional Business Law, reviews the major areas of the common law (broadly defined) that apply to business. Part Three, The Regulatory Environment of Business, covers the major regulatory laws that managers are likely to face and reviews major points of international business law.

Key Features

EDITED CASES

A primary way to learn law is to read real cases that the courts had to resolve. Each major case presented here, whether a "classic" case or a recent one, has the background facts and legal proceedings, up to the time of the case reported here,

summarized by the authors under the label **Case Background**. Then the court's holding, legal reasoning, and explanation of the law as it applies to the facts at hand are presented in the words of the court in the **Case Decision**. Since most decisions are quite long, we present only the key portions of the holding. Material that has been deleted is indicated by asterisks (* * *) for lengthy pieces of text and periods (. . .) for shorter amounts. Finally, some **Questions for Analysis** are offered for the reader to consider or for class discussion (answers are provided in the *Instructor's Resource Guide*).

INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVES

This feature discusses how similar aspects of the law covered at certain points in the chapter are handled in other countries. As globalization reaches more businesses, managers must know how to deal with different legal systems and cultures. This feature makes clear that the rules of the game are different in other nations and that managers must be prepared to operate and resolve problems in a complex legal environment.

CYBERLAW

This feature presents short discussions of application of the law to the many developments arising from computers and new forms of telecommunication. E-commerce and e-mail mean new legal issues for the courts to resolve as they apply traditional legal principles to never-before-heard-of ways of doing business, transmitting information, and communicating with friends and strangers.

JURIS PRUDENCE?

These short features add a light touch to the topic at hand by discussing an actual case or legal situation that is unusual. While law and business are serious, odd things happen in our lives and in the legal environment that remind us that trouble can come from very unexpected places, that the results of the legal process can be surprising, that scoundrels are among us, and that truth can be stranger than fiction.

ISSUE ARTICLES

An article, usually from a major business publication such as The Wall Street Journal, that discusses a political, regulatory, or ethical issue related to the legal subject matter of the chapter appears at the end of each chapter. The article illustrates how the law directly impacts business operations and provides a good vehicle for class discussion of issues important in today's legal environment of business. Each article ends with Issue Questions that can be the basis of class discussion (the Instructor's Resource Guide presents answers to the questions).

SUMMARY

The text of each chapter is summarized in bullet format that provides a quick review of the major points of law and the major rules covered and serves as a self-test of points that will be covered in examinations.

REVIEW AND DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The student is first asked to review major terms used in each chapter. (Term meanings are provided in the *Glossary*.) A couple general questions are asked about major subjects covered in the chapter, followed by *Case Questions*. Several questions in each chapter are answered at http://meiners.westbuslaw.com. We have attempted to keep them short to encourage their use for class discussion or for use as a study tool. A few *Policy Questions* to spur discussion of controversial political or social issues affecting the legal environment and some *Ethics Questions* that pose problems that managers could face are then asked. Most chapters have *Internet Assignments* that pose legal environment questions that can be answered by searching materials available on the Internet. These assignments are all new for this edition and were prepared by Andy Dorchak, law librarian at Case Western Reserve University. All questions are answered in the *Instructor's Resource Guide*.

PULLING IT TOGETHER

New to this edition are case questions that appear at the end of most of the chapters, which bring together at least one legal issue covered in the chapter and at least one legal issue covered in a previous chapter. Many cases involve multiple issues, so we want to keep in mind that when legal matters arise, they often concern more than one area of law. Case questions also serve as a refresher to make sure that legal concepts covered in previous chapters have not been forgotten.

♦ New to This Edition

Because users of previous editions of this book report that the general structure is fine, we did not want to make radical revisions to the structure. However, over time there are changes in the law and relative importance of areas of the law that give reasons to change elements of presentation.

The tendency in textbooks is to keep packing in more material—adding new information as changes occur. Over the years, this can make a book too thick and unmanageable, so we reduced the coverage of material that students can do without, recognizing that only so many pages and topics can be covered in one class. In paring down the material, we hope to enhance the learning of key concepts.

One area that received more substantive revision was that of agency and employment law. Previously, there was a chapter devoted to agency. Some of that material was eliminated, but the key portions were retained and added to a new chapter, *Employment Relationships*, which presents the wide variety of employment arrangements that are used—including agencies, independent contractors, and employment at will. Coverage of these topics provides a natural lead into the following two chapters that cover employment law, labor law, and employment discrimination. Chapter 15, *Employment Law*, has been modernized to recognize that employment law issues are more predominate than those in traditional labor law, so they are given more prominence and explanation.

Chapter 4, *Resolving Disputes*, is intended to make the chapter that focuses on arbitration blend in better with the preceding chapters on litigation. As alternate dispute resolution is an ever larger part of the legal process, we wanted to make it clear that private dispute resolution is not an entirely discrete subject. There are

also, of course, changes in major cases presented, updates of material in all areas, and a new case question feature called *Pulling It Together* that was noted earlier.

Ancillaries

- The *Study Guide* has been completely revised by text author Roger Meiners. To aid the student in his or her study of the legal envionment of business, it includes a chapter summary and outline, multiple-choice and true-false questions, and a test on the key terms included in the chapter. Answers to the questions are included in an appendix at the end of the study guide.
- The *Instructor's Resource Guide* is revised and expanded. As before, it answers all questions in the book. It also provides a detailed outline of each chapter, summarizing the content of the text, including all cases. The instructor can refer quickly to this guide to remember the points the students have covered in the text. The guide also provides numerous additional summarized cases that the instructor can use to illustrate key points of law. Additional material, such as more discussion of certain points and examples of the law in practice, is provided as lecture and discussion enhancements.
- The *Test Bank* has about 3,000 questions and is available in computerized form for users of IBM PCs and compatibles in Thomson World Class Learning Testing Tools software. Every test question, whether a direct question of information or an application question, is referenced to the main text page. More questions based on fact have been added to test critical thinking ability.
