Foreword

UNITED STATES TREATIES is a comprehensive treatment of the state of U.S. treaties. It includes those treaties and international agreements entered into by the United States which on January 1, 1985 had not expired by their own terms, been denounced by the parties or replaced or superseded by other agreements, or otherwise definitely terminated.

Included are certain agreements, particularly those concerned with World War II and the immediate postwar period, which contain continuing provisions or which have not been clearly terminated in their entirety are included even though operations under the agreements may have ceased. The absence of a listing for a particular agreement should not be regarded as determination that it is not in force.

The term "treaties" in this volume is used in the generic sense as defined in the Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties, that is, an international agreement "governed by international law, which embodied in a single instrument or in two or more related instruments and whatever its particular designation." The term "treaty" in its restricted usage in the United States denotes international agreements made by the President with the advice and consent of the Senate in accordance with Article II, section 2 of the Constitution of the United States.

In addition to such "treaties," this publication covers international agreements in force for the United States which have ben concluded by the Executive (a) pursuant to or in accordance with existing legislation or a prior treaty, (b) subject to congressional approval or implementation, and/or (c) under and in accordance with the President's Constitutional powers.

The volume is intended as a multi-focused reference source and has been compiled entirely from official U.S. Government sources.

Arrangement

The book is divided in six parts.

Part 1 includes bilateral treaties and other international agreements listed by country or other international entity with subject headings under each entry. Arrangements with territorial possessions of a country appear at the end of the

entry for that country. In some cases, treaties and international agreements applicable to a territory prior to its independence are included in the entry for that country on the basis of its assumption of treaty obligations upon becoming independent, as noted at the beginning of the entry for that country.

Part 2 lists multilateral treaties and other international agreements to which the United States is a party, arranged by subject with a listing of the parties to that agreement. Information is based on the most recent data available from the government or organization that serves as the depository for that agreement. Where countries are listed on the basis of their assumption of obligations, a reference s included to the note at the beginning of the entry for that country in Part 1 of this publication.

Part 3 contains a consolidated tabulation of documents affecting international copyright relations of the United States. In addition to treaties and agreements listed in Parts 1 and 2 of this volume, this section includes proclamations by the United States with respect to copyright relations.

Part 4 contains a comprehensive listing of multilateral organizations to which the United States is a party. Each listing contains the name of the multilateral organization, the organization's purpose, the initial date of U.S. participation, and the current authority for U.S. participation.

Part 5 provides references to official sources of information on U.S. treaties and includes U.S. Congressional and Department of State citations.

Part 6 & 7 respectively provide bibliographic citations to periodicals and books which in the opinion of the editors are of particular interest and relevance.
