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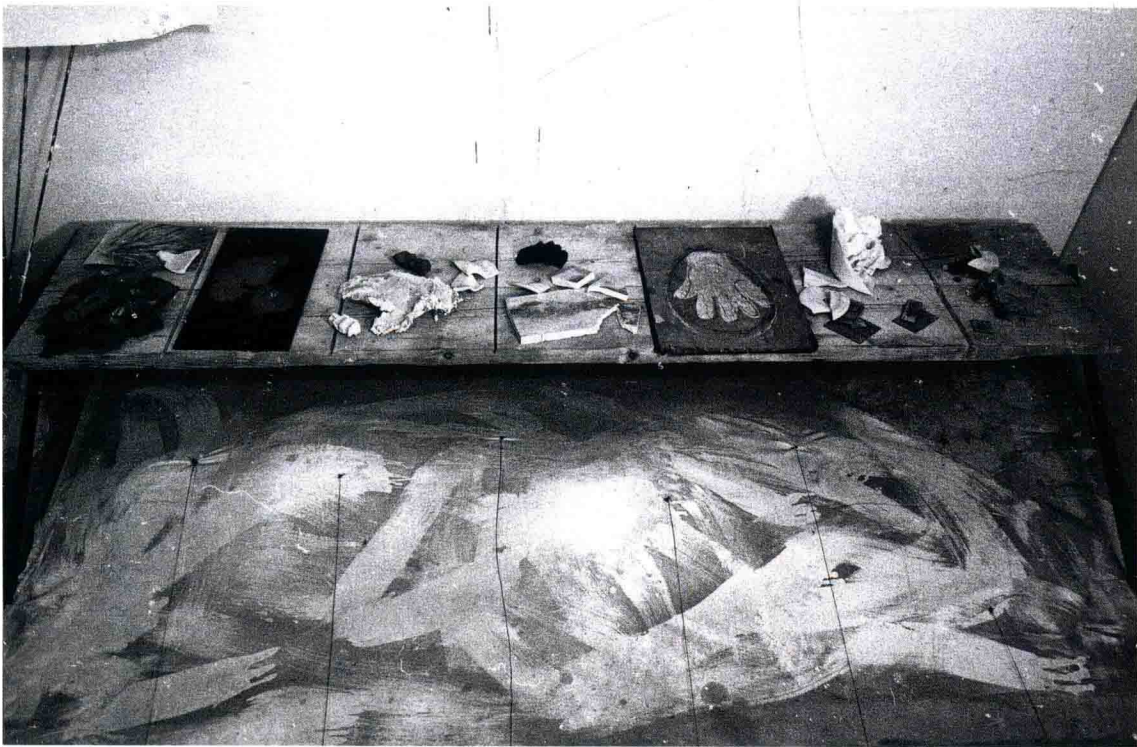

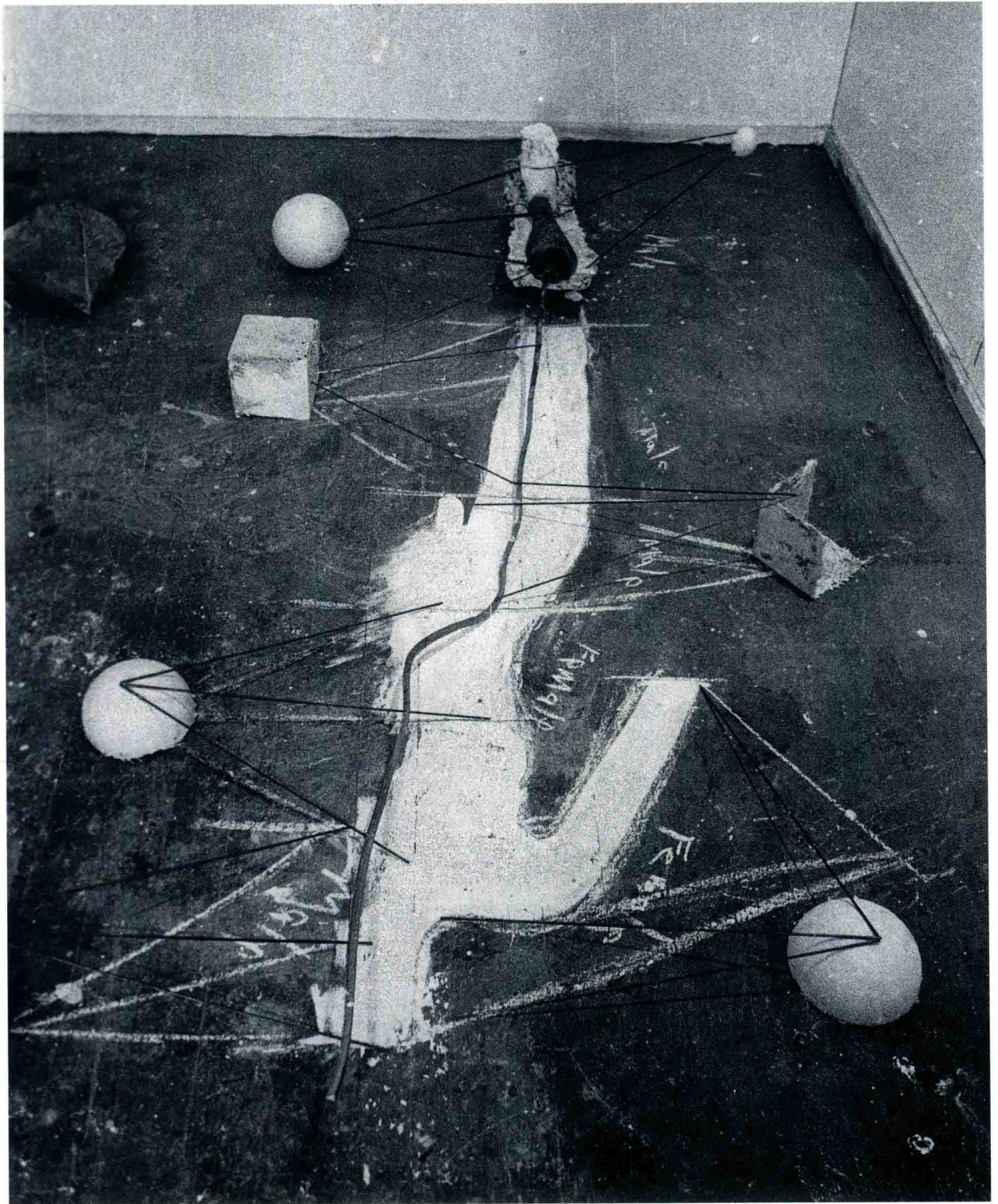
UNTITLED, 1976, metal, wood and paper, 46 × 61 × 61 cm



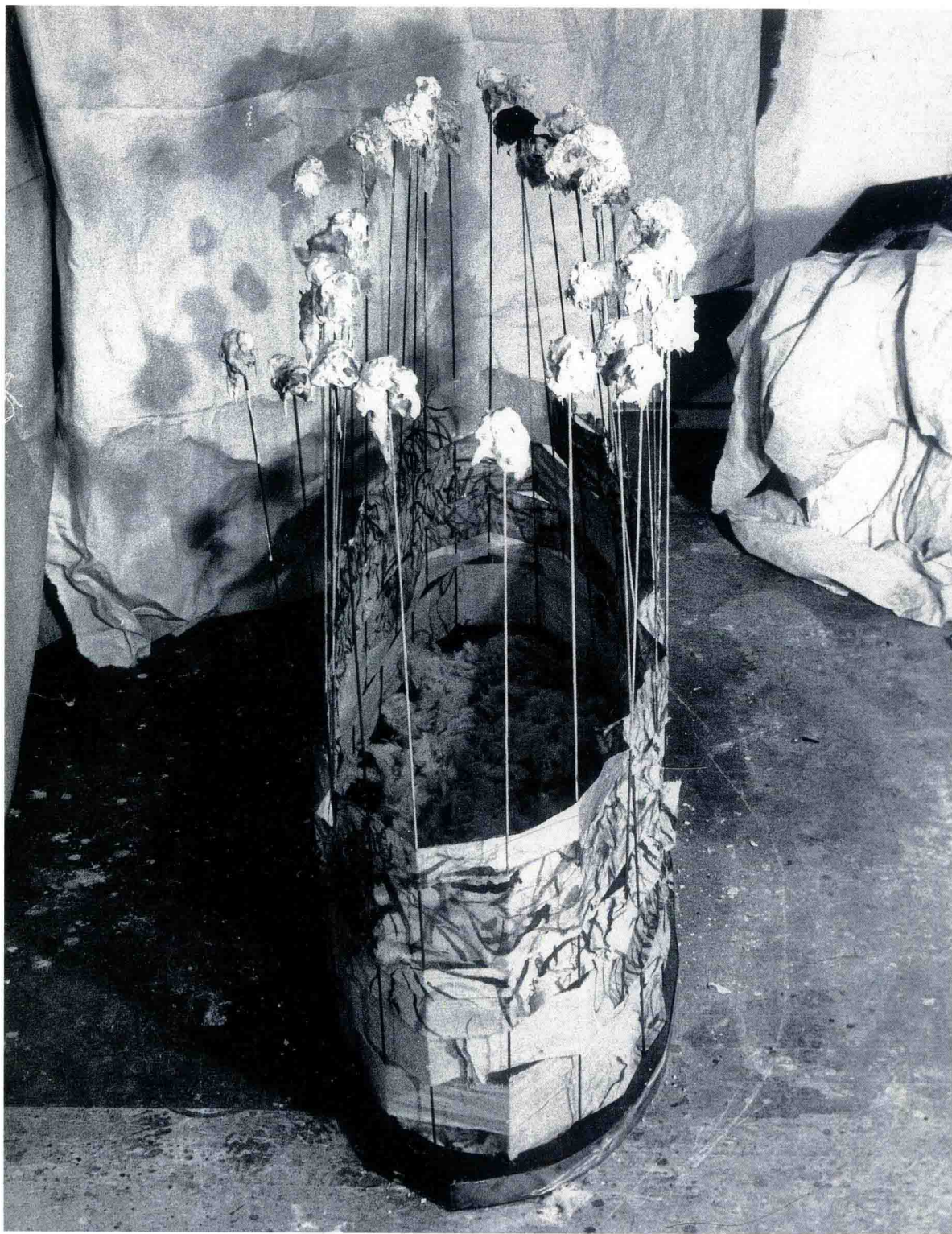

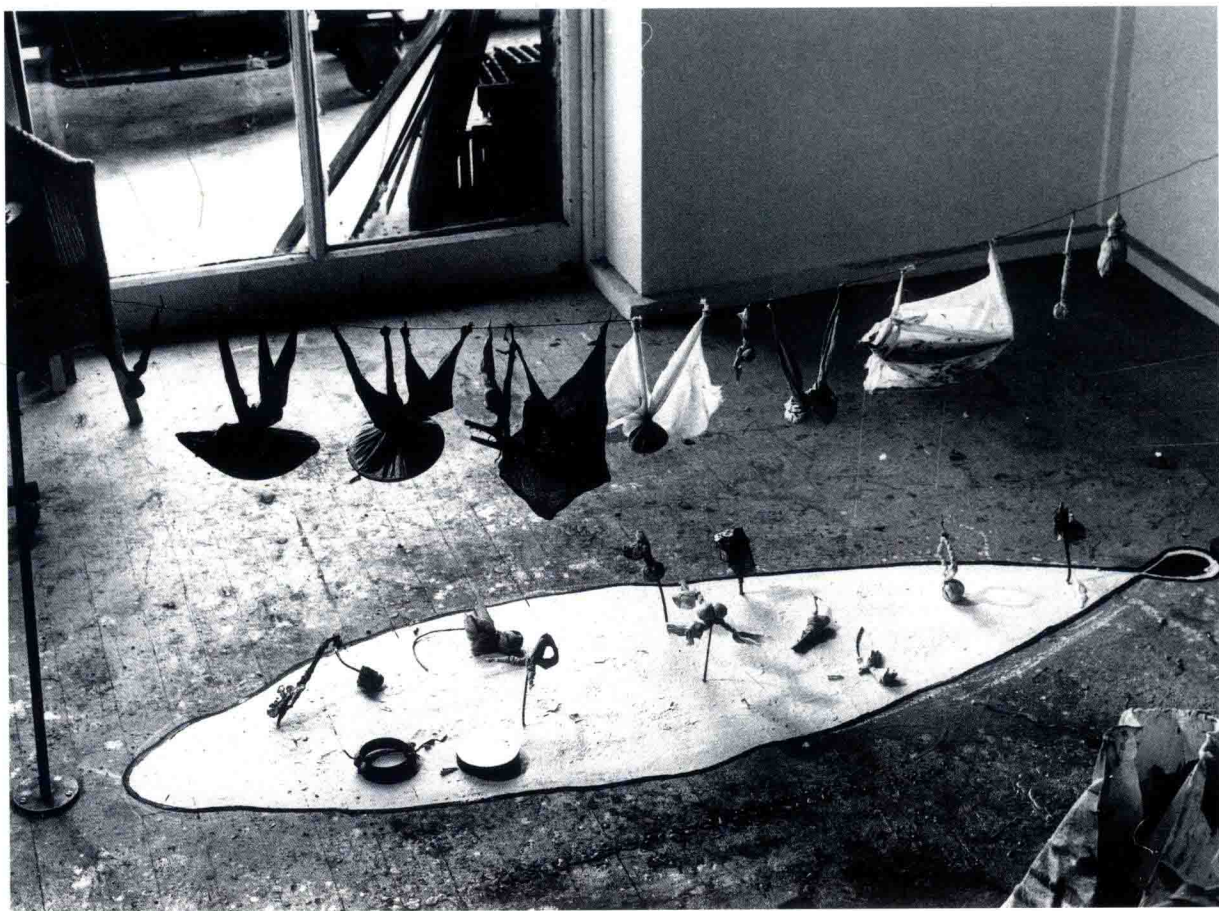
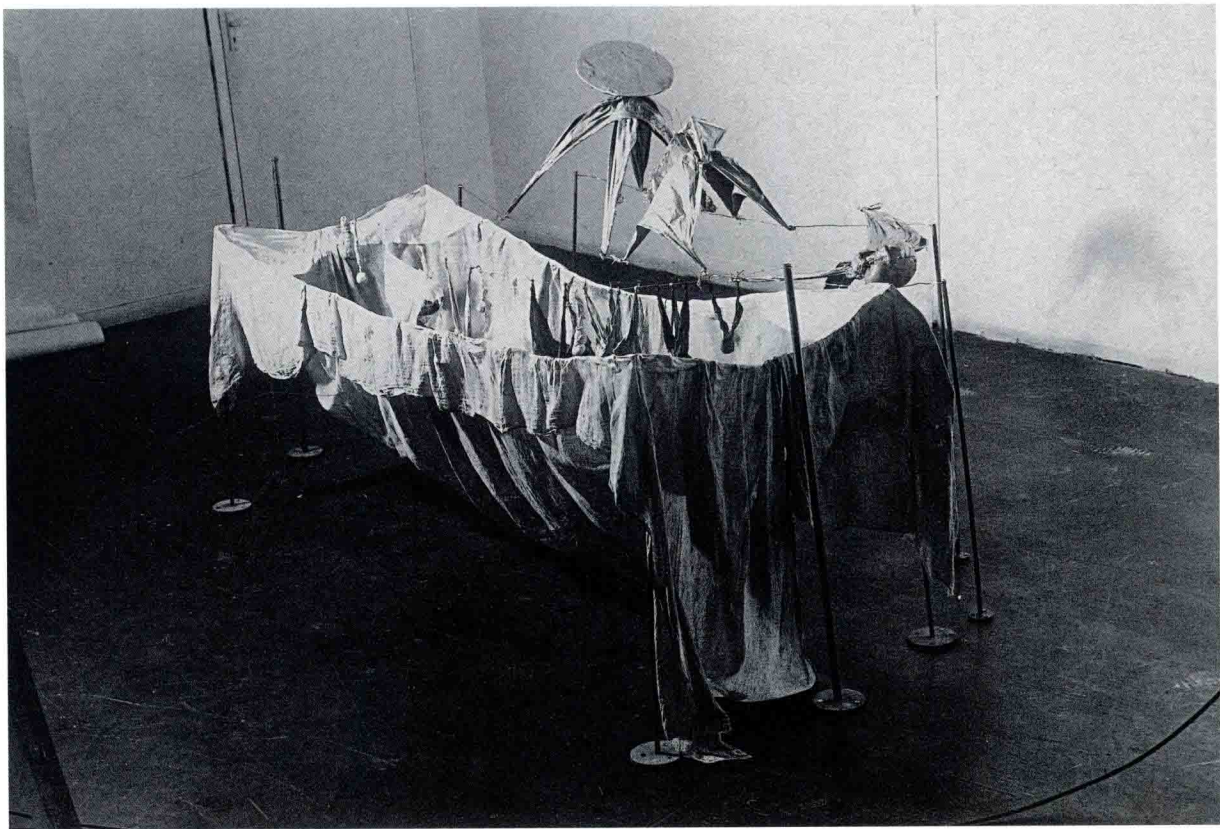
