#### UK MERGER CONTROL

This book is a fully up-to-date, comprehensive guide to the law, economics and practice of UK merger control law, including a review of the recently revised guidelines of the Office of Fair Trading and the Competition Commission. This guide presents an integrated legal and economic assessment of the substantive appraisal of mergers and examines in detail the following topics: the history of the Enterprise Act and its development from the Fair Trading Act; the various regulatory bodies that form the institutional structure of the UK merger control regime; enterprises subject to merger control regulation and the jurisdictional thresholds of the Enterprise Act; the relationship of the Enterprise Act with the European Merger Regulation; the procedural and substantive practice of the Office of Fair Trading; references to, and in-depth reviews by, the Competition Commission; appeals to the Competition Appeal Tribunal; public interest mergers and the role of the Secretary of State; and merger remedies. Uniquely, this book also provides insights into the substance and procedure of UK merger control from Simon Pritchard, formerly Senior Director of Mergers, OFT.

#### **AUTHORS' PREFACE**

A sufficient amount of time has now passed since the coming into force of the Enterprise Act for some reflection on the changes that it introduced and for a body of case-law to have built up that is capable of analysis. This timing has also coincided with a significant overhaul of the Authorities' guidelines as well as, more recently, consideration being given to how the UK merger control regime might be revised. Consequently, in 2008, we decided to write a practitioners' guide to UK merger control that attempted not only to be up-to-date and comprehensive in terms of the UK's peculiar jurisdictional mechanics and merger control processes, but also to write an integrated, legal and economic guide to the substantive assessment of mergers. This is the result of our endeavours.

Much has happened since the merger provisions of the Enterprise Act came into force in June 2003 and most particularly in the last few years. Following the 'original' sets of guidance, published in 2003 – the OFT's Substantive Assessment Guidance and Procedural Guidance, and the CC's Merger Reference Guidelines – the Authorities have published several important sets of guidelines, including the OFT's Jurisdictional and Procedural Guidance, the OFT's guidance in relation to exceptions to the duty to refer and undertakings in lieu, and the Authorities have jointly published guidelines in relation to the substantive assessment of mergers (the Merger Assessment Guidelines). Very recently, the Authorities have also separately published a commentary on retail mergers.

Whilst we provide some historical context for the Enterprise Act by setting out, in Chapter 1, the process that gave rise to the evolution of the Enterprise Act from the Fair Trade Act 1973, which we consider relevant for providing students and practitioners with background on how the Enterprise Act came to exist in its current form, little time is spent discussing the Fair Trading Act itself. Instead, as almost all UK merger control practitioners also provide advice in relation to mergers assessed under the EU Merger Regulation, considerably more focus is given to a comparison between the approach under the Enterprise Act and the approach taken under the Merger Regulation and, to a lesser extent, the guidelines in the United States. In terms of the UK's now extensive guidelines themselves, we favoured allowing the guidelines speak largely for themselves in lieu of reproducing large extracts in the text, but have provided additional insights wherever possible. We have, however, focused on areas that we think are of importance for practitioners, including the concept of enterprises ceasing to be distinct, the counterfactual, the *de minimis* exception, undertakings in lieu and second-phase remedies.

We are extremely grateful to Simon for all his contributions to the book and most particularly his work on Chapters 11 and 12. He provided us with unrivalled access to the OFT's internal thinking and decision-making at the highest levels between late 2003 and 2008, which, not coincidentally, was also a significant period of evolution in the

OFT's assessment of mergers. We would also like to thank to Robert O'Donoghue (Brick Court Chambers) for his considerable efforts in relation to the chapter on judicial review
