

How to Use the Book

The book consists of four major sections: (i) the Directory of Community Institutions (including directories of the Secretariat of the European Parliament; the Council of Ministers Secretariat; the Commission of the European Communities; and Members of the European Parliament); (ii) the Directory of Government Departments; (iii) the Directory of Representative Organizations (including directories of representative organizations for: Industry; Services Industries; Wholesale and Retail Trade; Small and Medium-sized Enterprises; Professions; Trade Unions; Employers; and Consumers); and (iv) the Glossary.

The Directory of Government Departments is arranged in alphabetical order by department, with countries arranged in alphabetical order therein.

The Directory of Representative Organizations is based on the Standard Industrial Classification System (CSO), as revised in 1980. Within each major area (Industry, Trade etc) subject areas are presented in alphabetical order, with subdivisions within each section organized in alphabetical order. Within each subject area, entries are given in alphabetical order by country and therein alphabetically by the name of the organization.

Throughout the Directory Sections, entries comprise the name of the institution/organization/department, address, and telephone and telex number where known.

The descriptive material in the Glossary is designed for general guidance. Precise contact points as found in the Directory sections are given for complete, and as far as possible, up-to-date advice. The Glossary comprises entries arranged in alphabetical order, and figures and tables attached to individual entries. For briefing and contact points on European Community interest in a specific matter: (i) check for a relevant alphabetical entry; (ii) check the Index, which gives references to all the entries in which each subject is mentioned; (iii) check the various Directories for additional contact points relating to specific interests. For briefing on broad aspects of European Community constitution or policy: (i) refer to the figures, which give the framework of Community organization and interest for 17 broad areas, attached to relevant summary entries by selecting the appropriate figure from the List of Figures on p. ix; (ii) within each figure, subjects in **bold type** are cross-references to entries in the book giving more detail. Entries are arranged alphabetically, and give, as appropriate: (i) a brief description of the subject matter, supplements for certain summary entries with figures giving an overview; (ii) references to European Community publications, such as the Official Journal of the European Communities and the Bulletin of the European Communities; (iii) cross-references to other relevant entries and figures in the book (in **bold face**); (iv) contact points at national level in each of the governments of member states, contact points at national level for Community and national representative organizations, and contact points at Community level in the relevant institution (such as the European Commission or the Council of Ministers Secretariat), by cross-reference (in italics) to the Directories; (v) a list of any relevant Community-level consultative and management committees (for which references in European Community publications are found in the article on Committees); and (vi) further details as appropriate, mainly in the form of tables, or any other relevant contact points (with addresses given either directly in the entry, or, if the address relates to more than one entry, by cross-reference in italics to the Directories). Entries have been placed where the majority of users of the Glossary will expect to find them. In entry headings in the text, and in the Index, where more than one word forms part of the heading, the words are alphabetized as if continuous up to the first mark of punctuation, then again thereafter if that mark is a comma.

The Index presents all of the entries of the Glossary (given in **bold face**) as well as subjects that do not have an entry in the Glossary in their own right, but which are included in the body of book. Where page numbers are given in **bold face**, that number indicates the main source of information in the Glossary on that subject; where page numbers are given in *italics*, that number indicates that the subject is mentioned in one of the figures in the Glossary; where the same page number appears twice in succession in the index, those numbers indicate that the subject is mentioned in the text of the Glossary as well as in one of the figures.

The running heads throughout the book give, on the left-hand page, the first complete entry beginning in the first column, and on the right-hand page, the last entry beginning in the second column. Exceptionally, in the Glossary, if a running head is for a figure or a table that is alphabetically out of sequence, it is shown in square brackets.
