PREFACE

Controversies in Urology is a collection of essays by well-known experts in urology covering some of the common urologic problems that have more than one possible form of management. The book is intended to be used not as a text, but rather as a medium that affords authorities an opportunity to discuss what they consider to be the soundest approach to urologic management problems when there is not one approach that is deemed best by cumulative experience.

Each section contains an editor's introduction, which outlines briefly the particular area of controversy. Following this are essays by two or more contributing authors, each describing his method of management and why he feels it is best. He may also describe cases in which he feels it wise to deviate from the plan he usually follows. At the end of each section, editorial comments attempt to clarify and summarize what the authors have said.

All authors were asked to be completely

free and direct in their comments, as the editors feel each has stature to state opinions without necessarily using other references. References have been used, but basically we asked for conclusions based on each expert's personal experience.

The editors hope that this volume of distinguished essays will focus on problems of great interest and usefulness to those reading them.
