Such was our case as graduate students. Our little world was confined to a small research space in the basement of the prestigious Chemistry Department of the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.

Our world was comprised of a Palestinian from Jerusalem, a genuine Jew from Israel, a Japanese from Japan, myself from Cameroon-Africa, and our research supervisor who was a Norwegian American.

We discussed all topics during our "break" periods out of which I was able to learn a lot of things about other people that I did not know before. I learned that the stereotypes usually associated with some people by an impatient and generally judgmental press were nothing but specially and sometimes intentionally tailored information geared at creating hatred for one group while rallying support for another.

Judging by the experience from our group discussions, it is possible that people can live together even if they do not like one another, just as long as they coexist in peace.

One (including myself) could hardly call our small world a microcosm of the world at large. Such a conclusion would be naive just as it is naive to think that South Africa will continue to be under white rule for too long or that the problems of the Middle East could be solved based on a single school of thought. But our world provided a unique atmosphere in which a Jew, a Palestinian, a Black, a Japanese, and a White could discuss freely without fear of death threat, or outside influence.

I am certainly glad that I was part of this group and I wish that other people, especially hawkish unilateral-thinking politicians and those who think they belong to the "blessed" countries, could have the same opportunity.

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INTRODUCTION

<u>Generalities</u>

The present world climate which will inevitably crystallize into global conflict is becoming more with SO increasing literacy in those regions that world's most of the have natural The superpowers resources. are becoming scared of the possibility of losing their stronghold on these regions. This has resulted in heavy-handed and unreasonable policies in most of those areas, notably, South Africa and Middle East.

The South African military was forged out of fear and greed and the Israeli military is the foundation of Israel's survival, but as history has shown, military might is a necessary but not a sufficient parameter for peaceful coexistence or even for settling disputes.

The tunnel vision of the world by Africans has kept them weak and oppressed The proximity of Latin until now. America and Persian countries to the socalled superpowers has generated fear, intimidation and resultant underdevelopment. The ultra wealthy oil wells of the Middle East have taken incentive away from the Arabs. world literacy change all these factors? What price is worth paying for reunification, freedom, and a homeland? Is it worth one million lives and near total destruction as in Vietnam; twenty million lives and human suffering as in the Soviet Union under Hitler; continuous struggle as in the Middle East and South Africa. Or is unity and freedom worthless as in Korea, East Germany and Latin America?

Africa

Africans have been and are still suffering from the fly-behind-glass-window syndrome. This fly has only two ways to get out into the freedom and pleasure it can see clearly:

- (1) it can wait for the master to open the window so that it can fly out, or
- (2) it can break the glass on its own and fly out to freedom.

With wealth-thirsty old men for Heads of State, and illiterate, sometimes poorly disciplined non-patriotic and stoogy military, the fate of Africa seems to be in line with the first option. As a result, Africans have only sniffed the freedom they direly need. However, the possibility that they can one day break the glass window and hence become free accrues with the exponential rise of literacy on the continent.

The thought of loosing control of the resources of Africa becomes a very touchy one to the White man and South Africa has become a litmus test of how Africans will finally get control of what is theirs. America and most of the West have often rationalized their activities on the continent on the basis of the presence of Cuban troops and Soviet influence and, still worse, on the premise that Africans are incapable of handling democracy as if Africans have to adhere to specially set down rules by the White man to gain their freedom. Let us imagine that the East suddenly becomes capitalist or democratized, will Africa be free to control its own resources and be at peace? Of course not, because the desire of the White man, either coming from the East or West, is to get almost free of charge the resources he needs so badly for his own survival. A notorious Soviet leader once said, "Our aim is to gain control of the rich mineral depots of West Africa." He died before he could have his dreams fulfilled, but he indoctrinated his successors to carry on his dream.

Through the puppet Heads of State the White man has succeeded tremendously. Africans have continued to battle and kill one another at the command of the White man, even miserably at the command of the fascist White man in South Africa.
