Preface

The fifteenth edition of *Who's Who of American Women* marks the twenty-eighth anniversary of publication of this reference book. As women have entered a variety of professions in greater numbers since 1958, when the first edition was published, there has been an increasing interest in and need for their biographical data.

In the first volume of Who's Who of American Women, volunteer workers in civic, religious, and club activities constituted almost 16 percent of the biographees. While the proportion of women in these areas has declined, increasing prominence has been achieved in many other fields. This directory includes women who are moving up in professional areas to which they are relatively new, as well as those at high levels in fields traditionally accessible to women. For example, the volume contains considerable representation of women in all areas of government: federal officials, highlevel state positions, mayors, and judges. Outstanding women are found in many sectors of business, such as advertising, banking, insurance, and publishing. In addition, women entrepreneurs who head their own businesses constitute an important segment of the biographees. As always, women are prominent in the performing arts—dance, theater, opera with increasing representation in music as, for example, players in symphony orchestras.

In preparing the contents of this edition—more than 25,300 sketches—the Marquis researchers have drawn on a variety of contemporary sources: newspapers, periodicals, professional associations, and other information. The result has been coverage of personal and professional biographical information about women in virtually every important field of endeavor.

In the great majority of cases, biographees have furnished their own data, thus assuring a high degree of accuracy. In some cases where individuals of high reference interest failed to supply information, Marquis staff members compiled the data through careful, independent research. Sketches compiled in this manner are denoted by an asterisk. As in previous editions, biographees were given the opportunity to review prepublication proofs of their sketches to make sure they were correct.

A new feature, avocations, has been introduced in the fifteenth edition. Biographees appearing for the first time in *Who's Who of American Women* were requested to indicate their avocations, thereby providing additional insights into their personal lives and interests.

Selection of a name for inclusion in *Who's Who of American Women* is based on one fundamental principle: reference value. Some women are eligible for listing because of position, while others have distinguished themselves by noteworthy achievements in their fields. Many listees qualify by virtue of both position and accomplishment.

In the editorial evaluation that resulted in the ultimate selection of the names in this directory, an individual's desire to be listed was not sufficient reason for inclusion; rather it was the person's achievement that ruled. Similarly, wealth or social position was not a criterion; only occupational stature or achievement influenced selection.

In assembling this comprehensive reference source on outstanding American women, Marquis Who's Who editors and researchers have exercised diligent care in the preparation of each biographical sketch. Despite all precautions, however, errors do occur. Users of this directory are invited to draw the attention of the publisher to any errors found so that corrections can be made in a subsequent edition.

The fifteenth edition of *Who's Who of American Women* continues the tradition of excellence established in 1899 with the publication of the first edition of *Who's Who in America*. The essence of that tradition is the continuing effort at Marquis Who's Who to produce reference works that are responsive to the needs of their users.

The major criterion for determining who will be included in *Who's Who of American Women* is the extent of a woman's reference value. Such reference interest is judged on either of two factors: (1) the position of responsibility held, or (2) the level of achievement attained by the individual.

Admission based on the factor of position includes the following examples:

High-level federal officials

Specified elected and appointed state officials

Mayors of major cities

Principal officers of selected businesses

Outstanding educators from major universities and colleges

Principal figures of cultural and artistic institutions

Heads of major women's organizations

Recipients of major awards and honors

Members of selected honorary organizations

Other women chosen because of incumbency or membership

Admission for individual achievement is based on objective qualitative criteria. To be selected, a woman must have attained conspicuous achievement. The biographee may scarcely be known in the local community but may be recognized in some field of endeavor for noteworthy accomplishment.

Alphabetical Practices

Names are arranged alphabetically according to the surnames, and under identical surnames according to the first given name. If both surname and first given name are identical, names are arranged alphabetically according to the second given name. Where full names are identical, they are arranged in order of age—with the elder listed first.

Surnames beginning with De, Des, Du, however capitalized or spaced, are recorded with the prefix preceding the surname and arranged alphabetically, under the letter D.

Surnames beginning with Mac and Mc are arranged alphabetically under M.

Surnames beginning with Saint or St. appear after names that begin Sains, and are arranged according to the second part of the name, e.g. St. Clair before Saint Dennis.

Surnames beginning with Van, Von or von are arranged alphabetically under letter V.

Compound hyphenated surnames are arranged according to the first member of the compound. Compound unhyphenated surnames are treated as hyphenated names.

Parentheses used in connection with a name indicate which part of the full name is usually deleted in common usage. Hence Abbott, W(illiam) Lewis indicates that the usual form of the given name is W. Lewis. The name recorded as Abbott, (William) Lewis signifies that the entire name William is not commonly used. In both cases the parentheses are ignored in alphabetizing.
