




Dots are one of the most useful tools available to today's more sophisticated designers, providing background for any number of motifs, or standing alone in a pointed fashion statement. Dots' contribution to fashion history is no itsy bitsy, teeny weenie tale, and this book attempts to chronicle the diverse applications of the form over the course of half a century. In all, 540 fabric swatches from couture fabric design houses in the United States, France, and Italy have been photographed and displayed here, to educate and inspire aspiring artists and designers. 






































