Current Controversies in Urologic Management is a volume of essays by noted experts covering controversial areas in the field of urology. It is not intended to have the scope of a textbook. Rather, the editors conceived the book as a forum where authorities may differ with each other concerning the soundest approach to problems in urology that have not been solved by cumulative experience.

Each chapter begins with the Editors' Introduction, which delineates the specific area of controversy. Essays by proponents of two or more approaches follow. Each contributing author describes his plan of management and explains why he prefers it. He may also cover circumstances under which he alters his usual plan. In those chapters where it was thought helpful, editorial commentary attempts to clarify the issue.

The author of each essay was encouraged to be unrestrained in his comments, as the editors consider each to be of sufficient stature to state opinions not substantiated by references. Although an author may refer to the work of others, conclusions based on personal experience were sought.

It is the hope of the editors that this collection of distinguished essays focuses on those important problems of greatest interest to members of the urologic profession and to many non-urologists as well.
