
Thing would feed the colony for the winter! But Dot could not lift it, so she hurried home.

returned to the colony.




On the third day of the harvest, Heimlich arrived. He ADORED food. When Dot described the One Big Gooey Thing, he insisted that the 3 of them depart at once.

Dot almost gave up. But


Dim flexed his wings and
