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Preface

This dictionary has been compiled for the use of students of business. It contains about 4,500 words and phrases which are commonly used in business, covering all aspects of business life from the office clerk to the trader on the stock exchange floor.

Each word and phrase is clearly defined in simple terms. Many further examples are given which show the words used in typical contexts. We also give short grammar notes to remind the user of irregular word-forms and special constructions.

Ib show how the words are used in real-life situations, we have included quotations from many newspapers and specialist magazines published in the U.S.A. and Canada.

♦ **abandonment** noun act of giving something up; **abandonment of a ship =** giving up a ship and cargo to the underwriters against payment for total loss

abatement noun act of reducing; tax
abatement = reduction of tax

abroad adverb to or in another country; the consignment of cars was shipped abroad last week; the chairman is abroad on business; half of our profit comes from sales abroad

absence noun not being at work or at a meeting; in the absence of = when someone is not there; in the absence of the chairman, his assistant took the chair; leave of absence = being allowed to be absent from work; he asked for a leave of absence to visit his mother in the hospital

♦ absent adjective not at work or not at a meeting; ten of the workers are absent with flu

♦ absentee noun person who is away from work, especially for a particular work day; the division had six absentees yesterday; absentee owner = a property owner who lives away from the property

♦ absenteeism noun staying away from work without authorization; absenteeism is high in the week before Christmas; the rate of absenteeism or the absenteeism rate always increases in good weather

accelerated adjective made faster; **accelerated depreciation** = system of depreciation which reduces the value of

assets at a more rapid rate in the early years to encourage companies, because of tax advantages, to invest in new equipment

♦ acceleration noun act or state of being speeded up; acceleration clause = statement in a contract providing for the immediate payment of the total balance in the event of a breach of the contract

accept verb (a) to take something which is being offered; to accept a bill = to sign a bill of exchange to indicate that you promise to pay it; to accept delivery of a shipment = to take goods into the warehouse officially when they are delivered (b) to say "yes" or to agree to something; she accepted the offer of a job in Australia; he accepted \$200 for the car

♦ acceptable adjective which can be accepted; the offer is not acceptable to both parties

♦ acceptance noun (a) signing a bill of exchange to show that you agree to pay it; to present a bill for acceptance = for payment by the person who has accepted it; acceptance house acceptance bank = bank or lending institution which assumes responsibility (b) acceptance of an offer = agreeing to an offer; to give an offer a conditional acceptance = to accept, provided that certain things happen or that certain terms apply; we have his letter of acceptance = we have received a letter accepting the him acceptance sampling = testing a small part of a batch to see if the whole batch is good enough

♦ accepting house noun firm which accepts bills of exchange (i.e. promises to pay them) and is paid a commission for this

♦ according to preposition as someone says or writes; the computer was installed according to the manufacturer's instructions

♦ accordingly adverb in agreement with what has been decided; we have received your letter and have altered the contract accordingly

accountant noun person who keeps a company's accounts or person who advises a company on its finances or person who examines accounts; the chief accountant of a manufacturing group; I send all my income tax queries to my accountant; certified public accountant = accountant who has earned a professional certificate showing he has met state requirements; accountant's opinion = report by a public accountant on the financial statement of a company, after he has carried out the audit; cost accountant = accountant who gives managers information about their business costs; management accountant = accountant who prepares financial information for managers so that they can make decisions

♦ accounting noun work of recording money paid, received, borrowed or owed; accounting machine; accounting methods or accounting procedures; accounting system; accounting period = period usually covered by a company's accounts; cost accounting = preparing special accounts of manufacturing and sales costs; current value accounting = method of accounting which notes the cost of replacing assets at current prices, rather than valuing assets at their original cost

accredited adjective (agent) who is authorized by a company to act on its behalf

accrual noun gradual increase by addition; **accrual of interest =** addition of interest to capital

acct = ACCOUNT

accumulate verb to grow larger by adding; to allow dividends to accumulate; accumulated profit =

profit which is not paid as dividend but is taken over into the accounts of the following year

accurate adjective correct; the sales department made an accurate forecast of sales; the designers produced an accurate copy of the plan \diamond accurately adverb correctly; the second quarter's drop in sales was

accurately forecast by the computer

accuse verb to say that someone has committed a crime; she was accused of stealing from the petty cash box; he was accused of industrial espionage NOTE: you accuse someone of a crime or of doing something

achieve verb to succeed in doing something or to do something successfully; the company has achieved great success in the Far East; we achieved all our objectives in 1990

acid test *noun* crucial final test that proves the value *or* quality of something

acknowledge verb to tell a sender that a letter or package or shipment has arrived; he still has not acknowledged my letter of the May 24; we acknowledge receipt of your June shipment

♦ acknowledgment, noun act of acknowledging; she sent an acknowledgment of receipt; they sent a letter of acknowledgment

acquire verb to buy; to acquire a company

♦ acquirer *noun* person *or* company which buys something

♦ acquisition noun thing bought; act of getting or buying something; the chocolate factory is his latest acquisition; data acquisition or data = obtaining and classifying data

acre noun measure of the area of land equal to 43,560 square feet

NOTE: the plural is used with figures, except before a noun: he has bought a farm of 250 acres or he has bought a 250-acre farm

acronym *noun* word formed from the first letters of a series of words (such as Amex)

across-the-board adjective applying to everything or everyone; an across-the-board price increase

act 1 noun (a) law passed by a legislative body; an Act of Congress; Equal Employment Opportunity Act = law that gives the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission power to take court action against discriminatory organizations; Fair Labor Standards Act = federal law requiring employers to pay a minimum hourly wage and overtime pay beyond 40 hours a week (b) act of God = something you do not expect to happen, and which cannot be avoided (such as storms or floods) 2 verb (a) to work; to act as an agent for a British company: to act for someone or to act on someone's behalf (b) to do something; the board will have to act quickly if the company's losses are going to be reduced: the lawvers are acting on our instructions: to act on a letter = to do what a letter asks to be

♦ acting adjective working in place of someone for a short time; acting manager; the Acting Chairman

♦ action noun (a) thing which has been done; to take action = to do something; you must take action if you want to prevent further shoplifting (b) case in a law court where a person or company sues another person or company; to take legal action = to sue someone: action for damages; action for libel; to bring an action for damages against **someone**; civil action = case brought by a person or company against someone who has done them civil wrong; criminal case brought by the state action = against someone who is charged with a

♦ active adjective busy; an active demand for oil shares; oil shares are very active; an active day on the Stock Exchange; business is active; active partner = partner who presently works in the company;

♦ actively adverb presently working on; the company is actively recruiting new personnel

♦ activity noun state of being active or busy; a low level of business activity; there was a lot of activity on the Stock Exchange; activity chart = plan showing work which has been done so that it can be compared to the plan of work to be done; monthly activity report = report by a department on

what has been done during the past month

actual 1 adjective accurate or correct; what is the actual cost of one unit? the actual figures for board members' expenses are not shown to the shareholders 2 plural noun (a) real figures; these figures are the actuals for 1989 (b) real commodities traded on a commodity exchange (as opposed to commodity futures)

♦ actuarial adjective relating to the mathematics and statistics of insurance; the premiums are worked out according to actuarial calculations; actuarial tables = lists showing how long people of certain ages are likely to live, used to calculate life insurance premiums

ad noun = ADVERTISEMENT

add verb (a) to put figures together to make a total; to add interest to the capital; interest is added monthly (b) to put things together to make a large group; we are adding to the sales force; they have added two new products to their line; this all adds to the company's costs = this makes the company's costs higher

♦ additional adjective extra or which is added; additional costs; additional charges; additional clauses to a

address 1 noun details of number, street and town where an office is or a person lives; address list; address book; my business address and phone number are printed on the card; cable address short address for sending cables; forwarding address = address to which a person's mail can be sent on; home address of a house or address = apartment where someone lives; please send the documents to my home address; mailing address = location where mail is sent to 2 verb (a) to write the details of an address on an envelope, etc.; to address a letter or a parcel; please address your enquiries to the manager; a letter addressed to the executive director; an incorrectly addressed package (b) to speak; to address a meeting (c) to deal with; to speak about; he addressed the issue of absenteeism

♦ addressee noun person to whom a letter or package is addressed

adequate adjective (a) sufficient or enough; to operate without adequate cover = to act without being completely protected by insurance (b) satisfactory or acceptable; her test results were adequate

adjourn verb to stop a meeting for a period; to adjourn a meeting; the chairman adjourned the meeting until three o'clock; the meeting adjourned at noon

♦ adjournment noun act of adjourning; he proposed the adjournment of the meeting

adjudicate verb to give a judgment between two parties in law; to decide a legal problem; to adjudicate a claim; to adjudicate in a dispute

♦ adjudication noun act of giving a judgment or of deciding a legal problem; adjudication of bankruptcy = decree or process of determining the status of the bankrupt ♦ adjudicator noun person who gives a decision on a problem; an adjudicator in an industrial dispute

adjust verb to change something to fit new conditions; to adjust prices to take account of inflation; prices are adjusted for inflation; (on federal income tax return) adjusted gross income, minus allowable expenses and deductions

♦ adjuster noun person who calculates losses for an insurance company; insurance adjuster = person who calculates how much insurance is to be paid

♦ ad noun informal = ADVERTISEMENT we put an ad in the paper; she answered an ad in the paper; he found his job through an ad in the paper; classified ads or want ads advertisements listed in a newspaper under special headings (like "property for sale", "help wanted"); look in the ads to see if anyone has a computer for sale; coupon ad = advertisement with a form attached, which is to be cut out and returned to the advertiser with your and address for further information: display advertisement which is designed to attract attention

♦ advertisement noun notice which shows that something is for sale or that a service is offered or that someone wants something or that a job is vacant, etc.; to put an advertisement in the paper; to answer an advertisement in the paper; classified advertisements advertisements listed in a newspaper special headings (such 'property for sale" or "jobs wanted"); display advertisement advertisement which is designed to attract attention

♦ advertiser noun person or company which advertises; the catalog gives a list of advertisers

♦ advertising noun business of announcing that something is for sale or of trying to persuade customers to buy product or service; she works in advertising; he has a job in advertising; advertising agent;

advertising budget; advertising campaign; advertising agency = office which plans, designs and manages for advertising other companies; advertising rates = amount of money charged for advertising space in a newspaper or advertising time on TV: advertising space = space in a newspaper set aside for advertisements: to buy advertising space in a paper = to put an advertisement in a newspaper

advice noun (a) advice note = written notice to a customer giving details of goods ordered and shipped but not yet delivered; as per advice = according to what is written on the advice note (b) opinion as to what action to take; to take legal advice = to ask a lawyer what should be done; the accountant's advice was to send the documents to the police; we sent the documents to the police on the advice of the accountant or we took accountant's advice and sent the documents to the police

advise verb (a) to tell someone what has happened; we are advised that the shipment will arrive next week (b) to suggest to someone what should be done; we are advised to take the shipping company to court; the accountant advised us to send the documents to the police

♦ advise against verb to suggest that something should not be done; the bank manager advised against closing the account; my broker has advised against buying these bonds

♦ adviser or advisor noun person who suggests what should be done; he is consulting the company's legal adviser; financial adviser = person or company which gives advice on financial problems for a fee

♦ advisory adjective as an adviser; he is acting in an advisory capacity; an advisory board = a group of advisers

aerogram or **aerogramme** noun sheet of thin blue paper which when folded can be sent by airmail without an envelope

affair noun business dealing; his business affairs were so difficult to understand that the lawyers had to ask accountants for advice

affect verb to change or to have an effect
on (something); the new government

regulations do not affect us; the company's sales in the Far East were seriously affected by the embargo

affiliate noun company that is owned or controlled by another company; Circus Toys is an affiliate of the MYA Corporation

♦ affiliated adjective connected with or owned by another company; one of our affiliated companies

affirmative adjective meaning "yes"; the answer was in the affirmative = the answer was yes; affirmative action program = program to remedy and to avoid discrimination in employment

affluent adjective wealthy; we live in an affluent society

afford verb to be able to pay or buy; we could not afford the cost of two telephones; the company cannot afford the time to train new staff

AFL-CIO = AMERICAN FEDERATION OF LABOR · CONGRESS OF INDUSTRIAL ORGANIZATIONS an organization linking US labor unions

after-hours adjective **after-hours buying** or **selling** or **dealing** = buying or selling or dealing in shares after the Stock Exchange has officially closed for the day

 \Diamond after-tax profit noun profit remaining after tax has been deducted

against preposition relating to or next to; to pay an advance against a security; can I have an advance against next month's salary? the bank advanced him \$10,000 against the security of his house

agency noun (a) office or job representing a company in some area; they signed an agency agreement or an agency contract; sole agency = situation where only one person or firm, etc., is empowered to act as an agent; he has the sole agency for Ford cars (b) office or business which arranges things for other companies; advertising agency = office which plans or designs and manages advertising for companies; employment agency = office which

finds jobs for individuals or finds qualified people to fill vacancies in various companies; real estate agency = office which deals in the sale of properties; news agency = office which distributes news to newspapers and television stations; travel agency = office which arranges travel for customers (c) agency shop = contract arrangement making it mandatory for workers who refuse to join a union to pay the union a fee

agenda noun list of things to be discussed at a meeting; the conference agenda or the agenda of the conference; after two hours we were still discussing the first item on the agenda; the secretary put finance at the top of the agenda; the chairman wants two items removed from the agenda

agree verb (a) to affirm or say yes or accept; it has been agreed that the lease will run for 25 years; after some discussion he agreed to our plan; the bank will never agree to lend the company \$250,000; we all agreed on the plan (NOTE: to agree to or on a plan) (b) to agree to do something = to say that you

will do something; she agreed to be chairman; will the finance director agree to resign? (c) to the same as; the two sets of calculations do not agree \diamondsuit agree with verb (a) to say that your opinions are the same as someone else's; I agree with the chairman that the figures are lower than normal (b) to be the same as; the auditors' figures do not agree with those of the accounts department

♦ agreement noun contract between two parties which explains how they will act; written agreement; unwritten or verbal agreement; to draw up or to draft an agreement; to break an agreement; to sign an agreement; to witness an agreement; an agreement has been reached or concluded or signed; to reach an agreement or to come to an agreement on prices or salaries; an international agreement on trade; an agency agreement; a marketing agreement; blanket agreement = agreement which covers different items; gentleman's agreement = verbal agreement between two parties who trust each other

ahead adverb in front of or better than; we are already ahead of our sales forecast; the company has a lot of work ahead of it if it wants to increase its share of the market

aim 1 noun something which you try to do; one of our aims is to increase the quality of our products; the company has achieved all its aims = the

company has done all the things it had hoped to do 2 verb to try to do something; we aim to be No. 1 in the market in two years' time; each salesman must aim to double his previous year's sales

air 1 noun method of traveling or sending goods using aircraft; to send a letter or a shipment by air; air carrier = company which sends cargo or passengers by air; air forwarding = arranging for goods to be shipped by air; air letter = airmail letter or special sheet of thin blue paper which when folded can be sent by airmail without an envelope 2 verb to air a grievance = to talk about or to discuss grievance; themanagement committee is useful because it allows the workers' representatives to air their grievances

 \diamondsuit air cargo noun goods or mail sent by air

♦ aircraft noun machine which flies in the air, carrying passengers or cargo; the airline has a fleet of ten commercial aircraft; the company is one of the most important American aircraft manufacturers; to charter an aircraft = to hire an aircraft for a special purpose NOTE: no plural: one aircraft, two aircraft

♦ airfreight 1 noun (a) method of shipping goods in an aircraft; to send a shipment by airfreight; airfreight charges or rates (b) charge to ship goods by air; the airfreight totaled \$800 2 verb to send goods by air; to airfreight a consignment to Mexico; we airfreighted the shipment because our agent ran out of stock

 \Diamond airline noun company which carries passengers or cargo by air

♦ airmail 1 noun way of sending letters or parcels by air; to send a package by airmail; airmail charges have risen by 15%; airmail envelope = very light envelope for sending airmail letters; airmail sticker = blue sticker with the words "by air mail" which can be stuck to an envelope or packet to show it is being sent by air 2 verb to send letters or parcels by air; to airmail a document to London

♦ airport noun place where planes land and take off; O'Hare Airport is the main airport for Chicago; airport bus = bus which takes passengers to and from an airport; airport tax = tax included in the price of the air ticket to cover the cost of running an airport; airport terminal = main building at an airport where passengers arrive and depart

♦ airtight adjective which does not allow air to get in; the goods are packed in airtight containers

a.k.a. = ALSO KNOWN AS John Charles Smith, a.k.a. J.C. Smith

all adjective & pronoun everything or everyone; all (of) the managers attended the meeting; a salesman should know the prices of all the products he is selling

allocate verb to divide (a sum of money) in various ways and share it out; we allocate 10% of revenue to publicity; \$2,500 was allocated to office furniture

♦ allocation noun dividing a sum of money in various ways; allocation of capital; allocation of funds to a project

allot *verb* to give *or* assign as a share; **to allot shares** = to give a certain number of shares to underwriters in a syndicate NOTE: **allotting** - **allotted**

♦ allotment noun (a) sharing out funds by giving money to various departments; allotment of funds to a project (b) giving shares in a new company to underwriters who have underwritten the issue; share allotment; payment in full on allotment

all-out adjective complete or full-scale; the union called for an all-out strike; the personnel manager has launched an all-out campaign to get the staff to work on Friday afternoons

allow verb (a) to say that someone can do something; junior members of the staff are not allowed to use the executive lunch room; the company allows all employees to take six days' vacation at Christmas (b) to give; to allow someone a discount; to allow 5% discount to members of staff; to allow 10% interest on large sums of money (c) to agree or to accept legally; to allow a claim or an appeal

♦ allow for verb to give a discount for or to add an extra sum to cover something; to allow for money paid in advance; to allow 10% for packing; allow 28 days for delivery = calculate that delivery will take at least 28 days ♦ allowable adjective legally accepted; allowable expenses = expenses which can be claimed against tax

♦ allowance noun (a) money which is given for a special reason; travel allowance or traveling allowance; foreign currency allowance; cost-ofliving allowance = addition to normal salary to cover increases in the cost of living; entertainment allowance money which a manager is allowed to spend each month on meals with clients or potential clients (b) part of an income which is not taxed; allowances against tax allowances; personal allowances (c) money removed in the form of a discount; allowance for depreciation; allowance for exchange loss

♦ allowed time noun paid time which the management agrees a worker can spend on rest or cleaning or meals, not working

altogether adverb putting everything together; the employees of the three companies in the group number 2,500 altogether; the company lost \$2m last year and \$4m this year, making \$6m altogether for the two years

a.m. adverb in the morning or before 12 noon; the flight leaves at 9:20 a.m.; telephone calls before 6 a.m. are charged at the discount rate

amend verb to change and make more correct or acceptable; please amend your copy of the contract accordingly \Diamond amendment noun change to a document; to propose an amendment to the constitution; to make amendments to a contract

Amex noun informal = AMERICAN STOCK EXCHANGE

amortize verb to pay off (a debt) by putting money aside regularly over a period of time; the capital cost is amortized over five years

♦ amortizable adjective which can be amortized; the capital cost is amortizable over a period of ten years ♦ amortization noun act of amortizing; amortization of a debt

amount 1 noun quantity of money; amount paid; amount deducted; amount owing; amount written off; what is the amount outstanding? a small amount invested in blue-chip stocks 2 verb to amount to = to make a total of; their debts amount to over \$1m

analog computer noun computer which works on the basis of electrical impulses representing numbers

analyze verb to examine in detail; to analyze a statement of account; to analyze the market potential

♦ analysis noun detailed examination and report; job analysis; market analysis; sales analysis; to carry out an analysis of the market potential; to write an analysis of the economic situation; cost analysis = examination in advance of the costs of a new product; systems analysis = using a computer to examine how a company can work more efficiently by analyzing the way it works currently

NOTE: plural is analyses

♦ analyst noun person who analyses; market analyst; systems analyst

announce verb to tell something to the public; to announce the sales for 1989; to announce a program of investment

♦ announcement noun telling something in public; announcement of a cutback in spending; announcement of the appointment of a new company president; the manager made an announcement to the staff

annual adjective for one year; annual statement of income; he has six weeks' annual leave; the annual accounts; annual growth of 5%; annual percentage rate (APR) = rate of interest (such as on a loan) shown on an annual compound basis; annual report = report of a company's financial situation at the end of a year, sent to all the shareholders; on an annual basis = each year; the figures are revised on an annual basis

♦ annual meeting noun yearly meeting of all the shareholders, when the company's financial situation is discussed

 \Diamond annually adverb each year; the figures are updated annually

QUOTE real wages have risen at an annual rate of only 1% in the last two years

♦ answering noun answering machine = machine which answers the telephone automatically when someone is not in the office; answering service = which answers the telephone and takes messages for someone or for a company

antedate verb to put an earlier date on a document; the invoice was antedated to January 1

anti- prefix against

♦ antidumping adjectivewhich protects a country against dumping; antidumping legislation

♦ anti-inflationary adjective which to restrict inflation; antiinflationary measures

♦ antitrust adjective which attacks monopolies and encourages competition: anti trust laws or legislation

apologize verb to say you are sorry; to apologize for the delay in answering; she apologized for being late

♦ apology noun saying you are sorry; to write a letter of apology; I enclose a check for \$10 with apologies for the delay in answering your letter

appeal 1 noun (a) being attractive; **customer appeal** = being attractive to customers; sales appeal = quality which makes customers want to buy (b) asking a court or a government department to change its decision; the appeal against the planning decision will be heard next month; he lost his appeal for damages against the company; she won her case on appeal = her case was lost in the first court, but the appeal court said that she was right NOTE: no plural for (a) 2 verb (a) to attract; this record appeals to the under-25 market; the idea of working in Hawaii for six months appealed to her (b) to ask a government department or a law court to alter its decision; the company appealed against the decision of the planning committee

♦ applicant noun person who applies for something; applicant for a job or job applicant; there were thousands of applicants for shares in the new company

 \Diamond application noun (a) asking for something, usually in writing: application for shares; shares payable on application; attach the check to the share application form; application job a or job application; application form = form to be filled out fill when applying; to out application (form) for a job or a job (form); application letter application = letter in which someone applies for a job (b) use to which a thing put; computer applications in business are endless

apportion verb to divide up; costs are apportioned according to projected revenue

♦ apportionment noun dividing something up

appraise verb to assess or to calculate the value of something; he asked the jeweler to appraise the diamond

♦ appraisal noun calculation of the value of someone or something; performance appraisals = reports on how well each employee is working

appreciate verb (a) to notice how good something is; the customer always appreciates efficient service; tourists do not appreciate long delays at banks (b) to increase in value; the dollar has appreciated in terms of the yen; these shares have appreciated by 5%

♦ appreciation noun (a) increase in value; these shares show an appreciation of 10%; the appreciation of the dollar against the peseta (b) valuing something highly; he was given a raise in appreciation of his excellent work

apprentice 1 *noun* young person who works under contract with a skilled workman to learn from him **2** *verb* **to be apprenticed to someone** = to work with a skilled workman to learn from him

♦ apprenticeship noun time spent learning a skilled trade; he served a sixyear apprenticeship in the steelworks

approach 1 noun getting in touch with someone with a proposal; the company made an approach to the supermarket chain; the board turned down all approaches on the subject of mergers; we have had an approach from a Japanese company to buy our car division 2 verb to get in touch with proposal; someone with a approached the bank with a request company loan: the approached by a Canadian publisher with the suggestion of a merger; we have been approached several times but have turned down all offers

appropriate 1 verb to put a sum of money aside for a special purpose; to appropriate a sum of money for a capital project 2 adjective fitting; an appropriate use of company funds

♦ appropriation noun act of putting money aside for a special purpose; appropriation of funds to the reserve; appropriation statement = part of a profit and loss statement which shows how the profit has been allocated (i.e., how much has been given to the shareholders as dividends, how much is being put into the reserves, etc.)

approve verb (a) to approve of = to think something is good; the president approves of the new company letterhead; the sales reps do not approve of interference from the accounts division (b) to agree to something officially; to approve the terms of a contract; the proposal was approved by the board

♦ approval noun (a) agreement; to submit a budget for approval; the new retirement policy met with her approval (b) on approval = sale where the buyer only pays for goods if they are satisfactory; to buy a photocopier on approval

approximate adjective not exact, but almost correct; the sales division has made an approximate forecast of expenditures

APR = ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE

arbitrage noun (a) selling on one market and buying on another at almost the same time to profit from different exchange rates (b) buying shares in companies which are likely to be taken over and so rise in price

♦ arbitrager or arbitrageur noun person whose business is arbitrage

arbitrate verb (of an outside party) to
be chosen by both sides to try to settle an
industrial dispute; to arbitrate in a
dispute

♦ arbitration noun settling of a dispute by an outside person, chosen by both sides; to submit a dispute to arbitration; to refer a question to arbitration; to take a dispute to arbitration; to go to arbitration; arbitration board = group which arbitrates; to accept the ruling of the arbitration board; arbitration clause = part of a contract that requires disputes about the contract to be settled by an outside person

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
