### Vignelli Associates Office, New York, 1985

In 1985 we moved to a new space, on the top floor of a building on 10th Avenue, with the most spectacular view of the Manhattan skyline and the Hudson River. Our office is indeed the best expression of us, as we stand at this point in our lives, and it is definitely the most serene space for us to work in.

This renovation project was a testing ground for new ideas in order to experience their tangible and intangible qualities in time.

Much of the exploration concerned ordinary materials that were applied in extraordinary ways. The furniture is made of crude steel sheets and tubes as they came from the foundry. Walls and doors are covered with square sheets of hand-waxed lead. Gold leaf is applied to industrial steel tubing and used as a base for a steel-topped table. Aluminum grids are finished with a random brushed pattern, contrasted with sandblasted squares of glass. Particle board, stained white and lacquered, is used like fine wood to panel office walls, to encase the library in shelving, and to construct work stations in the studio. Corrugated galvanized steel forms a wall dividing the design studio from the service areas. All furniture and materials were developed especially for this project.

Vignelli Associates' basic design belief is that "design is one." We believe in discipline as the pursuit of structural integrity, appropriateness as the search for the specific, and ambiguity as a plurality of meanings. We believe that a designer should be able to design anything, "from the spoon to the city" because the basic discipline of design is one, the only things that change are the specifics. We believe that the interaction between different experiences enriches the mind and that specialization creates entropy. We strongly believe in the social responsibility of the designer and that design is an integral part of the production process, not an embellishment.

We also believe that in design where there are dogmas, there is no more design.
