

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# Preface

In this sixth edition of *Anthology of American Literature*, Volume II, we have followed the same principles of selection successfully used for all previous editions:

- To select works primarily for their literary significance
- · To represent authors by extensive samplings of their works
- To include, where possible, long works in their entirety
- To provide concise, informative introductions and headnotes suited to the student reader
- To explain unfamiliar terms and allusions through liberal use of footnotes
- To present author bibliographies that are selective and current

For this new edition, a variety of changes have been made. The most obvious is the inclusion of the complete Emily Dickinson selection and the complete Walt Whitman selection in both Volume I and Volume II of the anthology. Because of that repetition of complete selections, instructors may begin a course or end a course with Dickinson or Whitman or both or neither.

Other important changes in Volume II are the addition of shorter works: "How to Tell a Story," by Mark Twain, poems by Rita Dove, short stories by Sandra Cisneros, by Louise Erdrich, and by Toni Morrison, and the addition of longer works: *The Hairy Ape*, by Eugene O'Neill and *Death of a Salesman*, by Arthur Miller. The latter two add to the list of long works presented in their entirety in Volume II: Whitman's *Song of Myself*, Twain's *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, James's *Daisy Miller* and *The Turn of the Screw*, Chopin's *The Awakening*, Crane's *The Red Badge of Courage*, Chandler's *Red Wind*, Williams's *The Glass Menagerie*, Hansberry's *A Raisin in the Sun*, Albee's *The Zoo Story*, and Bellow's *Seize the Day*.

Authors and works in the *Anthology* follow a generally chronological order. In deciding on a standard text from among the various editions available for many of the selections, we have chosen, whenever possible, that edition most respected by modern scholars. The text reprinted is identified at the end of the headnote for each author. Spelling and punctuation are, in some instances, regularized and modernized to correct obvious errors and to suit the

reader's convenience. An editorial excision of less than one paragraph is indicated by an ellipsis thus: . . . ; excisions of a paragraph or more are indicated by a centered ellipsis thus:

For each author and for each of the five literary periods, brief introductory notes summarize historical and critical information. The date on the left immediately following each selection indicates the date of composition when known; dates on the right indicate the date or dates of publication.
