PREFACE

"Ignorance ma'am! Sheer ignorance," Dr. Johnson is said to have replied to a lady enquiring why, in his Dictionary, he should have defined a pastern as the knee of a horse. To the numerous criticisms of this work which we must expect and which we will welcome, the explanation we have to offer will often be the same. For this is an exercise which we believe to be without precedent: the construction of a comprehensive dictionary of international law in English.

A word is perhaps necessary as to the origins of the enterprise. Law dictionaries are not new. International law dictionaries are extant in other languages. Some of these are substantial, perhaps too substantial, works. It occurred to the senior of the signatories of this Preface that a somewhat simplified version of Strupp's Wörterbuch and of the Dictionnaire Diplomatique would be useful, if put out in English, to both university students of international law and others needing some kind of ready reference work in relation to that discipline. Accordingly, with the encouragement of the publishers and some assistance from a former pupil, Dr. Peter Felter, he began some years ago to assemble the materials for the kind of publication he had in mind. Some little time after this beginning had been made the publishers received a letter from Mr. Grant, in his capacity as Convener of the Scottish Group of International Lawyers, proposing the preparation by that group of an international law dictionary, stricto sensu.

The word dictionary was known before there ever was a dictionary. Stricto sensu, it connotes a system of explanation of the meanings of words. It goes without saying that it is a tool of great value, but it clearly has its limitations for the conveying of general information, or, as the legendary figure who had never had a book before and who was first introduced to such a phenomenon in the shape of a dictionary is said to have put it: "The stories are very short". A dictionary, in other words, is not an encyclopaedia and it is rather an encyclopaedia one wants for substantive information about a subject. On the other hand, there is no particular utility in a compilation which is no more than a text book cut up into paragraphs rearranged alphabetically!

In retrospect it appears that Professor Parry's conception was of an encyclopaedia; that of Mr. Grant and his Group, a true dictionary. The final product is open to the criticism, perhaps, that it is neither the one thing nor the other. But, should it be found to serve a useful purpose, it may be found capable of refinement and elaboration.

As to content: as it stands this work is, as has been said, more than a dictionary; it is in part an encyclopaedia. Nevertheless, though it purports, unlike any discoverable Anglophone precedent, to cover the whole field of international law, it is manifestly by no means exhaustive.

To begin with, the work has been designed for the contemporary student. Its historical coverage, therefore, is no more than sketchy. In this regard it

could no doubt be improved and extended in any subsequent edition. Then it's main thrust is towards the Law of Peace; though the Law of Armed Conflict is by no means neglected or omitted, some further extension in the direction of the latter would not be necessarily out of place.

The second point to be made here is more important still. For though this work may be more than a dictionary, it is still confined primarily to international law. This involves that the treatment of international organization is little more than cursory. The principal organs of the United Nations, the Specialized Agencies, and the most prominent regional organizations alone being dealt with. The prime reason for this is that international organization has become a vast field in itself, calling for a degree of specialist study. But it is not excluded that the present work be expanded to comprehend this field. To a degree the same goes for air law.

Equally, in relation to both biography and bibliography, the compilers have thus far observed very strict limits. They have, that is to say, endeavoured in a very few lines to identify the principal judicial and literary figures of international law; to say, for instance, who most of the Judges of the World Court have been and who have been the principal teachers of international law and what their principal works are. But all this needs considerable elaboration and extension in any definitive encyclopaedia of international law.

Further, in relation to the case law of the subject, the compilers have exercised a very severe restraint. They have sought to give brief accounts of most World Court decisions, and of some of the principal or best-known arbitral awards. But they have reluctantly decided that in the first instance they must exclude all decisions of municipal courts. This of course leaves a great gap. A digest of the municipal decisions contained in the International Law Reports and in such series as American International Law Cases, British International Law Cases and Commonwealth International Law Cases would be of high value and is even overdue.

Equally, though efforts have been made to give references to, and often even some accounts of the contents of, treaties of first importance, this category of material could in an elaborate version be extended and improved.

Indeed, the possibilities for the extension of this work are almost infinite. It is but a first attempt. Should it be well received the compilers may be encouraged to try again. They would be most grateful, therefore, for suggestions and criticisms from interested persons and would end this Preface as they began, with a confession of their own ignorance, coupled now with a proclamation of their entire willingness to learn!

INTRODUCTION

During the preparation of this work, on 10 September 1982, Professor Clive Parry tragically died. At that time, most of the entries for this dictionary had been rendered into draft form and Professor Parry had composed the Preface which precedes this Introduction. It was decided that Professor Parry's son, Anthony, should assume such of his father's functions in the project as his professional commitments would allow. Subsequently, Arthur D. Watts, Deputy Legal Adviser, Foreign and Commonwealth Office, agreed to assume responsibility for the preparation of the outstanding case law entries.

Professor Parry's death, a cruel blow to all who knew him and his enormous contribution to teaching and research in international law, inevitably delayed the completion of this work. That it has now reached the stage of publication is a tribute to the encouragement and patience of the publishers, to whom the General Editors freely acknowledge their gratitude.

At an earlier stage, some members of the Scottish Group of International Lawyers lent assistance by drafting entries. The General Editors wish to thank Dr. Wahe Balekjian (Glasgow), Mrs. Lorene Bow (Glasgow), Dr. Tony Carty (Glasgow), David Goldberg (Glasgow), Miss Françoise Hampson, (Dundee, now Essex), Professor Frank Lyall (Aberdeen), Mrs. Alison Seager (Aberdeen), Professor Akos Toth (Strathclyde) and Dr. Rebecca Wallace (Strathclyde). The drafts prepared by those people have been amended — in some cases quite substantially — and accordingly the responsibility for errors and omissions must lie with the General Editors. Nonetheless, these noble individuals expended considerable time and effort in launching this project and enabling the work to be completed within a reasonable time-scale, and their contribution cannot be understated.

According to Professor Parry's typically great scheme of things, this work was to be the first volume in a multi-volume series, variously designated as *Principia Juris Gentium* or *Keys of International Law* or *Masterkeys of International Law*. Intended for individuals and institutions which had need for speedy yet inexpensive access to international law and international law materials, subsequent volumes were to include an atlas of international law, a compilation of major international treaties, a fairly comprehensive digest of international case law, including pertinent municipal decisions, and a digest of State practice. It would be a fitting tribute to Professor Parry if such a scheme could be carried through.

Within entries, **bold roman** denotes a substantive entry, **bold italics** denotes a judicial or arbitral decision which is the subject of a substantive entry, and *italics* denotes a judicial or arbitral decision (usually of a municipal court or tribunal) which is not the subject of a substantive entry.
